36. Alumni Contribution:

The Victoria Institution College Alumni Association began it's journey in 2023 - 24 sessionwith a formal introductorymeeting on 22.7.23 between the Executive Committee members and the newly appointed Principal of the college, Dr Maitreyi Ray Kanjilal. Subsequently, Dr Kanjilal was nominated as the President of the Alumni Association. Smt. Snighdha Sen and Dr Sukriti Lahori became the signatories of the bank account of the Association.

A most significant event organised by the Alumni Association in this session was the screening of the documentary 'ChirantaniPraktani' at Suniti Sabhaghar on 4.08.2023. About half of the stall holders in the Mela were the Alumni of the college. The Sarad Mela was a huge success and it also encouraged women in their independent business endeavors.

The AnnualGeneralMeeting of the Victoria Institution College Alumni Association was held on 17th March, 2024 at the Suniti Sabhaghar of the college. Due to the ill-health of Smt. Bulu Khatua, she expressed her inability to continue as the Secretary of Alumni Association. So, the name of Smt. Snighdha Sen was proposed as the new Secretary by Smt. Aparupa Chatterjee and seconded by Dr. Sukriti Lahori Sinha.
