




Awareness Programme about Plastic Bag Free Environment on 11th July, 2023

Following Dr. Kanungo's presentation, the floor was opened for discussion. Several questions on causes possible / probable behind outbreak of any such disease, measures that could be taken to prevent one and remedial measures were asked by the volunteers. Dr. Kanungo answered all the queries patiently and explained multiple aspects related to the issue without using too many technical jargons. NSS volunteers were benefited by the discussion and they expressed their desire to attend similar webinars.

<u>Project on making 3 layered cotton masks during the period of lockdown</u> for distribution among the needy in their vicinity by NSS Unit, VIC

During the month of September 2020, nearly 15 NSS volunteers were engaged in 3 ply cotton masks making from their homes, following you tube tutorial videos. These masks were thereupon distributed by the volunteers in their immediate neighbourhood among those who were not able to afford face masks for their safety against the deadly virus. The programme of Distribution of home-made three-ply cotton face masks among the needy in one'snneighbourhood during Lockdown due to Covid 19 Pandemic not only intended to lend a helping hand to the impoverished but also evoke

a sense of social responsibility and sensitivity among students. In a deeply fractured society like ours, it was but natural that a sizeable section was unable to follow the minimum covid protocol of wearing a face mask thereby increasing the risk of contamination with each passing moment. Students were trained using YouTube videos in the craft of three-ply cotton mask making and were asked to make some. Further, they were asked to identify such people in their immediate neighbourhood who did not possess the capacity of affording a face mask during the trying times of a world-wide pandemic.

Success of this event could be gauged from the satisfaction which the students (NSS volunteers) expressed upon completion of the work. Not only did they experience satisfaction by standing beside the needy but they also educated themselves with the intangible quality of humanism. This event being conceptualised and executed during unprecedented times of nation-wide lockdown, it became impossible to conduct it in a structured and formal manner. Resources which were put to use were the sheer enthusiasm of students and other materials like cloth, needle and thread, available in nearly all households which are a part of our society.




Revisiting the teachings of Swami Vivekananda through poster making by NCC Cadets

"DISTRIBUIR ---- PASE ACHI" on 17th Aug, 2019

INDIA is one of the Developing Countries of the world. Although we have achieved independence through much blood, even 73 years after independence, a large number of people in the country are still deprived of the primary, most indispensable elements of subsistence. One of the most difficult problems of Indian Economy is **POVERTY.** Every day, we encounter people around us who hardly get sufficient food on a regular basis. The Sealdah Station is home to countless destitute children whose lives hardly pass the platform confines. Their stomach's calls are served only at the whims of a collective generosity. But human beings are powerless before hunger.

Some students of dept of physics along with some other friends from the girls hostel decided to distribute certain food items to the distressed children who live on the platforms of SEALDAH STATION. They named their small team as "DISTRIBUIR — PASE ACHI". In Spanish, "DISTRIBUIR" means "to distribute". The team "DISTRIBUIR — PASE ACHI" is directed entirely by female students, only for the purpose of Social work. On August 17, 2019 they reached their destination Sealdah station to distribute food items to children among the distressed children who live at Sealdah station.

As transient as their efforts may be, they, the members of "DISTRIBUIR — PASE ACHI" team, are deeply satisfied to have had an opportunity to bring these children some glee and smiles on the faces these innocent children.





Collaborative Project Between Small Scale Entrepreneurs (Florists) in the Neighbourhood and NSS

NSS volunteers participated in decorating the front wall of the Principal's office by potting indoor plants in the inbuilt wall-stepway on December 23rd, 2019. This project was unique. The objectives of the first phase of the mission also included eradication of manual scavenging, generating awareness and bringing about a behaviour change regarding sanitation practices, and augmentation of capacity at the local level. The NCC Unit of VIC worked on the behavioural change generating initiative of this project through their actions and campaign.


Poster Making on the Topic: Transforming Education by NCC Unit, Vic

On April 4th 2019, NSS volunteers participated in a campus and neighbourhood sanitation drive by not only cleaning it but also putting-up posters discouraging the habit of littering in the neighbourhood. The volunteers also sprayed certain areas of the campus and the immediate neighbourhood with bleaching powder to stop the spread of diseases which is caused because of water stagnation in places of daily thoroughfare.
