

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#### Part A: Curricular Activities

#### Long excursion to Kalpa, Kinnaur, H.P. - Dept. of Botany-(10/11/2016 to 20/11/2016)

On 10/11/2016, Teachers of Botany department ,Dr Aparna pal, Smt Sharmistha Basu and laboratory assistant Shri Hrishikesh Choudhury along with 21 students of B.Sc. Botany Hons. Went to Kalpa Kinnaur, H.P. The excursion ended on 20/11/2016. During this long educational trip the department visited many places like Kalpa, Kinnaur, sangla valley, Sarahan etc. the excursion was a great success. Students studied the phytogeographical distribution flora, collected plant specimens, observed and documented the epiphytes, exotics and indigenous flora of each spot, did quadrat study and recorded the whole.

# One -day field excursion to Duttapukur – Department of Botany (8/2/2017)





#### **Experience acknowledged by student participants**

We, the B.Sc. 1<sup>st</sup> yr students of Zoology Honours of Victoria Institution (College) got the golden opportunity of attending the seminar under guidance of our honourable Professor Dr. Patralekha Mukhopadhyay.

In the first lecture we came to know that vector borne diseases are more complicated in the sense that there are 3 live players which are dependent on several and multiple living, non-living intellectual factors for successful interactions to lead to disease outbreaks.

In the 2nd lecture we came to know that as the pygmy hog is one of the most sensitive indicators of the tall and wet alluvial grasslands of Assam, restoration and improved management of habitat for their reintroduction is proving beneficial to the overall biodiversity of these threatened grasslands. This interesting animal is securing the habitat for other endangered species also.
