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Part A: Curricular Activities

1) Educational visit to Zoological Survey of India, Kolkata on 26th October, 2017

Participants - 18 Students of 2ndyr Zoology (Honours)

Conducted by-Dr. Patralekha Mukhopadhyay & Sri. Sumallya Karmakar.

Due to the continuous development and enrichment of our knowledge of biodiversity, means of analysis, and concepts taxonomic experience is now-a-days an urgent tool in the field of Zoology. Keeping this view in mind Department of Zoology, Calcutta University has decided to make partnership with Zoological Survey of India in the field of research and already introduced the visit to this pioneer organization as an option in the B.Sc. curriculum of B.Sc. Zoology Honours.

Our students got the opportunity to have a keen observation of huge number of animal specimens particularly insects, mollusks, birds and mammals kept in well maintained condition at this prime Taxonomical Institute of India. They observed a good number of very rare specimens which are not possible to be found usually in nature at present. They came to know the modern techniques of dry and wet preservation of animals demonstrated by experts of different sections. Preparation of databases for the recorded huge specimens of the country has been taken as a challenging task by the present authority and the work is undergoing very efficiently by the technicians. Our students have been enriched with the knowledge on this latest technology. Students experienced with the basic idea of insect sampling methods and different techniques of collection of mollusks. Wildlife sampling methods were also demonstrated very well. A very large number of Birds and mammals are preserved and kept in good condition here since many years back. Our students got an idea how these animals are stuffed and preserved. The extinct bird Pink-headed duck is kept here with great care.





2) Long excursion to Shillong & Kaziranga conducted by Dept. of Botany during 27.10.2017 to 2.11.2017


On 27.10.2017, we started our journey for Shillong and Kaziranga national park for the partial fulfillment of the requirement for the degree of Bachelor of science (Botany) CU. Total 14 students, two teachers and one laboratory assistant joined the group. The journey started on 27.10.2017 and ended on 2.11.2017. The main places we visited were Shillong and Kaziranga National park. The main aim of the excursion was to study the phytogeography of the local flora and plant collection.






4) Filed survey conducted by the Dept. of Botany on 15.12.2017

On 15th December 2017, Dr. Aparna Pal along with laboratory assistant Sri Hrishikesh Choudhury guided 14 students of B.Sc. Botany Hons. Class to Salt lake, Kolkata for the Quadrat study. Students performed the study and survey of flora in that particular locality and calculated the species density, abundance and frequency of plant species under the guidance of the concerted teacher.





5) Report : College excursion to Pandua, Tribeni and Chandernagar,

on 23rd Dec, 2017

Conducted by Dept. of History

Department of History arranged a day trip to Pandua, Tribeni and Chandernagore on 23rd December, 2017. Fifty (50) students along with three teachers (Dr. Parnasabari Bhattacharyya, Dr. Suchandra Guha and Sri. Aditya Sarkar) took part in this educational trip. On 23rd December the journey began from college at 7.30 in the morning. A luxury coach was arranged from NBTT travel agency. We reached Chandernagore around 9.30 in the morning. KMDA park was the venue for our refreshment. From there we went to Pandua ,where we visited the Pandua Minar and the ruins of an old mosque. From there we came to Bansberia Hangseswari temple. The architecture and sculpture of the temple was unique. Then we came to Chandernagore. That was our last spot. We came back around 7.30 in the evening.







6) Report : College excursion to Kaziranga National Park

Conducted by Dept. of Zoology during 3rd - 7th Jan, 2018

Department of Zoology arranged a visit to Kaziranga National Park during 3rd - 7th Jan, 2018 for the study on Forest Ecosystem & its Bio-Diversity Assessment. 20 students along with two teachers (Dr. Patralekha Mukhopadhyay, Smt. Suchona Chakraborty) took part in this educational trip.





During this trip they have visited Hoollongapar Gibbon Sanctuary, Assam on 06.01.2018. On the last day of their trip students were enriched by visiting the Durrell wildlife (Pygmy Hog) Conservation Trust, Forest Department, Government of Assam on 7th Jan, 2018, which is located at Indiranagar Basistha, Guwahati. Tour to this place was conducted by Dr. Goutam Narayan and and Dr. Parag Jyoti Deka.





7) Local excursion to Amtala conducted by the Dept. of Botany on 17.1.2018

A group of 32 students along with Dr Aparna Pal, Smt.Sharmistha Basu, Smt Aditi Dey, Smt Payel Chatterjee and laboratory assistant Shri Hrishikesh Choudhury visited Amtala for plant collection and vegetation studies of the local flora. We started at 7:30 am in the morning and the trip ended at around 5:30 pm. Dr Aparna pal and Smt Sharmistha Basu guided the students of Botany hons. and Smt Aditi Dey and Smt Payel Chatterjee guided the Botany General students. The trip was very fruitful and the students learnt many things that day.



8) Study tour at Gopiballavpur conducted by the Dept. of Geography on 27.02.2018

On 27th February 2018 Geography departmental study tour was held at Shanti Niketan for part 2 general students in the guidance of Smt. Aloka Mukhopadhyay, Dr. Kaveri Brahma and Smt. Smriti Shil. 

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2) Report on Parent-Teacher Meetings of the Department of Bengali (2017-2018)

3) Report on the Extension Lecture

6) Report on Lecture And Demonstration of some Innovative Experiments conducted by UGC- DAE Consortium, Kolkata Centre in the Physics Dept. on 20th Sept 2017

UGC-DAE Consortium for Scientific Research, is an Inter University Centre, under the UGC, which provides the interface for the utilization of the DAE facilities, such as the VECC (Accelerator) at Kolkata. It also aims to make state of the art research facilities available to the research scholars from various institutes of higher learning. The Nuclear Physics & Electronics Group at the Kolkata Centre of the Consortium have developed some innovative, low cost experiments in Physics based on the available resources for demonstration to undergraduate students of different Colleges and Universities.

These experiments are illustrative in nature and contribute to the understanding of basics concepts in Physics. The group is headed by Dr S.S. Ghugre, who is a Nuclear Physicist. Shri Mukesh Kumar, Dr P.V. Rajesh and Shri Kaushik Basu are in charge of fabrication of experimental setup and technical support .

The Physics Department arranged for a Lecture cum Demonstration of some these innovative experiments on 20th Sept 2017 for our B.Sc (Physics Hons) students. The lecture was delivered by Dr Sandip Ghugre and this was followed by demonstration of experiments by Dr P V Rajesh and Shri Mukesh Kumar. Our students took keen interest in this programme and interacted actively with the Resource persons. They also participated in some of the experiments. No of student participants was twenty.







7) A Faculty Knowledge Sharing Programme organised by IQAC, Victoria Institution (College) in collaboration with ICFAI Business School, Kolkata on 20th September 2017

The Seminar was focused on Learner Centric Andragogy and the Honourable speaker was Prof. Kumar Satyaki Ray, Associate Dean, IBS, Kolkata. The winner and runner up groups of the competition got prizes for their success and all the participants got tokens of appreciation.




15) Parent-Teacher Meeting conducted by Dept. of Chemistry on 28.11.2017

So, self-motivation helps in comparing ourselves with our previous performance and improve steadily.


