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<u>ANNUAL REPORT</u> <u>2018 - 2019</u>

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Introduction

We, at Victoria Institution (College) believe in holistic education and all-round development of our students. In order to realise this, we encourage students to go beyond their text books and score sheets and out of the box learning in their everyday life at the college campus. We not only aim at supplementing class room teaching by inviting eminent academics and experts to deliver extension lectures, we also conduct seminars and talks where students participate as speakers and deliberate on the topic. Several departments also conduct study tours and field trips with the objective of providing a hands-on learning experience to the students. Students are also encouraged to engage themselves in various cultural activities, as well. Our students regularly volunteer in NCC and NSS activities which imparts in them a spirit of patriotism and social welfare.

PART A: CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

1. Excursion to Silk Route Organised by Department of Botany

On 24th of September 2018, we started our journey with the students of part II Botany Hons. Students (16 students) for the phytogeographical studies and plant collection according to the 1+1+1 system syllabus of Botany hons. CU. Students were accompanied by Dr Aparna Pal, Smt. Sharmistha Basu and laboratory assistant Shri Hrishikesh Choudhury. The trip started from Lava - Loleygaon and finally we moved towards west Sikkim (Silk route). Throughout the excursion students learnt about the vegetation, phytogeographical distribution of flora and collected various plant specimens for herbarium preparation.

2. Study tour organised by Department of Philosophy

Department of Philosophy took their students on a study trip on 4th September 2018 to Swami Vivekananda's ancestral home which has been turned into a cultural centre by the Ramakrishna Mission. The objective was to impart the Philosophy honours students with some first-hand experience offacts over and above bookish knowledge. Through the trip students went through the spiritual journey undertaken by Swamiji at a young age. The audio-visual show and the book-store helped them to learn more about Swamiji.



3. Field trip conducted by Department of Botany

Department of Botany took their students to a field visit from 24th September 2018 to 1st October 2018 to the locales which fall under the fabled Silk Route of Sikkim. The trip was aimed at studying the community structure, local flora and phytogeographical character of the region.





4. Survey Trip organised by Department of Geography

A physic cultural survey was conducted by the department of Geography whereby they took their honours students in a trip to Rincenpong (West Sikkim) and its surroundings. The trip was conducted from 2^{nd} to 10^{th} October 2018.





5. Study Tour at Variable Energy Cyclotron Centre on 07/01/2019

A day long educational tour to the Variable Energy Cyclotron Centre (VECC) was arranged for the Hons students of 1st Semester and 2ndyear on 7th January 2019. After an introductory lecture, the students were divided into two groups and were taken to different laboratories of the institution in turns. The scientific staff of VECC conducted the tour and explained the working principles of the Room temperature Cyclotron, various particle accelerators like the Superconducting Cyclotron, Radioactive Ion beam facilities along with the Linear accelerator. Students also visited the laboratory where indigenous fabricating of detectors are done as a part of the international collaboration LHC (Large Hadron Collider) . They had an interactive session with Dr. Premamoy Ghosh, senior scientist of VECC. This activity of the Department was conducted to give our students a glimpse into some of the research work being done in Physics. Twenty-five students participated in this educational tour and were accompanied by the teachers of the department, Dr. Gayatri Pal, Dr. Subhendu Chandra and Dr. Shinjinee Das Gupta.



6. Local excursion conducted by Department of Botany

On 11/1/2019, students of 2nd year (Honours and General) and 2nd semester (Honours) went to local excursion with Dr. Aparna Pal, Dr. Sudip Kumar Sinha, Smt. Sharmistha Basu, Smt. Aditi Dey, Smt. Payel Chatterjee and laboratory assistant Shri Hrishikesh Choudhury at Sonarpur for vegetational studies and plant collection. Total 47 students joined the field excursion.

7. <u>Field Visit to a place of wildlife interest (Gorumara and Jaldapara</u> <u>National Park)</u>

A group of 18 second year Zoology Hons students visited Gorumara and Jaldapara National Parks, at North Bengal for studying animal diversity and their habit and habitat at these places of wild life interest under the supervision of two departmental teachers Dr. Sucharita Saha and Sumalkya Karmakar. They also visited some local panchayat offices to collect deta about the economic condition of local people, man- animal conflict cases, rate of literacy and employment, source of income etc. They also visited to a Crocodile Zoo at Phuentsholing, Bhutan and gathered some knowledge about Crocodile breeding programs.



8. Excursion to Chandraketugarh

Department of History organized an educational tour to Chandraketugarh archaeological site, museum and Berachapa zamindar house. The tour was organized on 1st February 2019. Students of 3rd semester were accompanied by three faculty members namely Suchandra Guha, Jiaul Anam Molla, Krishna Sarkar and Nandini Ghosh. Forty-four (44) Students were taken to the Chandraketugarh museum first by a Volvo bus organized by the department. From there, 2300-year-old archaeological site was visited. Last stop was the zamindar house of Berachapa. Chandraketugarh was once an important coastal hub in international trade, now a barren mound.









9. <u>Educational Excursion to the Asutosh Museum of Indian Art,</u> <u>Department of Sanskrit</u>

Educational Excursion to the Asutosh Museum of Indian Art, University of Calcutta has been conducted by the Department of Sanskrit on February 1st, 2019. Around 25 students and six teachers of the department has visited the Museum. Semester I, 2nd year and 3rd year students started their journey from the college premises and after a daylong visit to the museum, they gathered some valuable knowledge and experience about Indian art and sculpture including the Indian antiquity and archaeology. Students were overwhelmed by watching the artifacts comprising terracotta figurines, folk art objects, textiles and many more. It has left all of them with a memorable experience.



10.<u>Educational Trip to Acharya Jagadish Chandra Bose Botanic</u> <u>Garden</u>

Visit to Acharya Jagadish Chandra Bose Indian Botanic Garden on 20/2/2019 with students of semester II Botany honours, Botany honours Part III and semester II Botany General students. Total number of students were 45. Students gained knowledge regarding various plants, observed their habitat, documented the names of the plants, ferns, and other medicinally important plants. We also visited the CNH where a demonstration regarding the preparation and preservation of herbarium was given by an expert researcher.

13. Report of Field trip organised by the Department of Botany

Long excursion to Lamahatta, North Bengal on 3/4/2019 to 6/4/2019 with the students of semester II Botany Honours for study of Pteridophytes and Gymnosperms in their natural habitat. They were escorted by Dr. Sudip Kumar Sinha and Smt. Aditi Dey and laboratory assistant Shri Hrishikesh Choudhury. Total 22 students participated in this long excursion and gained knowledge about the habit, habitat, and distribution of Archegoniates in their natural habitats.







14.<u>Report on Two-Day Workshop Organized by the Department of</u> <u>Economics on 13th and 14th May 2019</u>

The Department of Economics, Victoria Institution (College) organized a twoday workshop on 'Topics from Semester III ECOA under CBCS, University of Calcutta'. Two distinguished Professors from the Economics Department, Calcutta University, Prof. Kaushik Gupta and Prof. Panchanan Das discussed some topics to be taught in Semester III from the newly introduced CBCS Curriculum. The workshop was inaugurated by Prof. Sudakshina Gupta, the Chairman of UGBOS Economics and the then Dean of Arts, Calcutta University. Seventy teachers from different colleges under Calcutta University, teaching undergraduate Economics, participated in the two-day workshop. The participants opined that the workshop would be immensely helpful for them teaching Semester III students in the forthcoming academic session. Certificates were distributed to the participants at the end of the two-day workshop.



PART B: CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES 1.Extension Lecture Organised by Department of Sanskrit

An Extension Lecture on "Vedic Literature" has been organised on 8th September, 2018 by the Department of Sanskrit. 25 students of Semester I along with 2nd year and 3rd year honours students of the department have participated in the lecture. The lecture has been delivered by Professor Mou Dasgupta, faculty from the department of Sanskrit, University of Calcutta. Six teachers of the department have also participated in the programme. The resource person delivered her lecture in a very lucid manner so that students can understand the concept and chronology of Vedic Literature. After the lecture, a question-answer session helped the students to clarify all the doubts. Students participated in the event with great enthusiasm.



2. Extension Lecture Organised by Department of Sanskrit

An Extension Lecture on "General Introduction to Vyākaraņa & Sāhitya Śāstra" has been organised by the Department of Sanskrit on September 20, 2018. The lecture was delivered by eminent scholar Dr. Parbati Chakraborty, Professor, Department of Sanskrit, Rabindra Bharati University.

The topic of the Extension Lecture was very interesting to the students and very much relevant to the current syllabus of CBCS system. The speaker presented a brief outline of the history and content of Sanskrit Vyākaraņa (Grammar) and Sanskrit Sāhitya Śāstra (Poetics) in quite a lucid manner. At the end of her illuminating lecture, few minutes were also spent for the question-answer session, in which the speaker fully satisfied the curiosity of both the students and the teachers.



3. Extension Lecture Organised by Department of Economics



Koyali Burman, a field researcher based in Canada to deliver a lecture on *Dialogue Circle: A Model for Community Integration and Development* on October 10th 2018. Smt. Barman talked about developing a non-judgemental platform where participants would be able to share their thoughts and experiences freely. Students as well as the teachers of the department participated in this lecture with great enthusiasm and decided on implementing this model of communication by establishing an interface between various batches of students graduating in Economics from Victoria Institution (College).



4. <u>Science Awareness Programme for Students organised by Department of</u> <u>Physics</u>

Department of Physics, Victoria Institution (College) organized a day long on 11/10/2018. Scientists Science Awareness Programme from the ANURANAN-Science Awareness, a non-profit Society delivered lectures. Theme of the pre-lunch session was 'Universe and its mysteries,' which included three presentations (, 'Measuring Cosmos', 'Evolution of Universe with time' and 'Energy options and materials science research') followed by a lecture on 'Science into our experience'. Resource persons who graced the event were Dr. Siddhartha De Choudhury, Scientific Officer, Variable Energy Cyclotron Center (VECC), Dr. Dirtha Sanyal, Scientific Officer (VECC), Dr. Debashis Bhowmick, Scientific Officer (VECC), Dr. Amit Kumar Jana. Nearly 40 students participated in the event and enjoyed thoroughly.





5. Participation in an Experiment held at Variable Energy Cyclotron Centre as a part of INGA Campaign Phases - II

Dr. Shinjinee Das Gupta, Assistant Professor of Physics, VIC had performed an experiment on Spectroscopic Studies of 197Hg as Principal Investigator at Variable Energy Cyclotron Centre during 30/11/2018 to 06/12/2018. This experiment was carried out as a part of the of INGA Campaign Phase -II. She had collaboration with the INGA group of VECC, UGC-DAE-CSR, KC and others.

Two of our final year (3rd year) Hons. students Sangeeta Majumdar and Rupsa Banik got the opportunity to participate in the above-mentioned experiment. In this process they were introduced to the research activities going on in the Gamma Spectroscopy field (a branch of Experimental Nuclear Physics). Results of the above experiment was reported in the DAE Symposium on Nuclear Physics, 2019. Relevant portion of the above-mentioned conference proceeding is attached herewith.

Spectroscopic study of ¹⁹⁷Hg

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Introduction

Mass 190 region is a rich testing ground for the detail study of nuclear collective motion and its coupling with single particle. In order to study the shape driving effects caused by the intruder orbitals (mainly $\pi h_{11/2}$ and $v i_{13/2}$) knowledge of definite spin parity of the levels are very definite spin parity of the levels are very important. Some of the common features of odd mass Hg isotopes are: $a_{(V_{i}, i_{i}, i_{i})}$ decoupled positive parity band built on an isomeric $13/2^+$ level [1,2]. Another negative parity semi decoupled band of $\Delta I=2$ sequence is also observed starting from 21/2 state [3]. The levels of 13/2⁺ band of old mass Hg isotopes around 190 mass region have similar feature with the


Experiment

The levels of ¹⁹⁷Hg were populated via the fusion evaporation reaction where a 7mg/cm² thick self supported enriched¹⁹⁸Pt foil was used as the target and alpha beam @ 52 MeV from the K-130 Cyclotron of VECC was the projectile. This experiment was a part of the VECC-INGA phase II campaign where 8 Compton suppressed II campaign where 8 Compton suppressed Clover detectors and 2 LEPS detectors were used to detect the gamma rays. The set up is shown in Fig 1. 5 Clovers were set at 90° , two at 125° and the other at 40° . And the two LEPS were set at 40° and 90° respectively. Time stamped list mode data both in singles and coincidence mode were taken using the digital data acquisition

In continuation with the previous years, the department of Political Science organised the 4th Series of Extension Lecture from December 2018 to March 2019, with financial assistance from the Indian Council of Social Science Research, Eastern Regional Centre, Kolkata. Lectures in the said series were delivered by eminent resource persons, like Professor Sobhanlal Dattagupta (Former Surendranath Banerjee Chair of the Department of Political Science, University of Calcutta), Professor Tapan Kumar Chattyopadhyay (Former Professor, Department of Political Science, University of Calcutta), Department of International Relations, Jadavpur University, Professor Dipankar Sinha (Faculty, Department of Political Science, University of Calcutta), Professor Manabi Majumdar (Faculty, CSSS Kolkata), Professor Pradip Basu (Faculty, Department of Political Science, Presidency University). Around 65 students participated in all the lectures.

Dr. Chitrita Bhowmick, an Assistant Professor of the Department explained the evolution of co-operatives in India, its meaning, and functions very lucidly for the students. Her lecture was followed by the screening of *'Manthan'-* a film on the evolution of co-operative milk production and marketing in India- directed by Shyam Benegal. Thirty students and the teachers took part in the programme. The students asked questions to the speaker and enjoyed the film show.

10. Film Screening: Department of Political Science

12. Extension Lecture: Department of Philosophy

On 27th of March, 2019, Wednesday, Professor Subir Ranjan Bhattacharyya, former Professor and Head, Department of Philosophy, University of Calcutta, visited our department as a resource person to speak on Immanuel Kant, the eminent German Philosopher, for the benefit of the students. Professor Bhattacharyya is a notable person in the field of Philosophy.



He, however concentrated on The Critique of Pure Reason- the book of repute by Kant. In thisbook Kant aims to show the limits of what can be known by theoretical reason, and his strategy depends on a distinction between 'phenomena,' objects as we experience them, and 'noumena', i.e., objects as they exist in themselves. He confined his conclusions to the world of experience; Kant can meet the threat of skepticism and put natural science on a firm foundation. The lecture was followed by a question answer session. Around fifty-five students attended the programme.

13. Extension Lecture organised by the Department of Mathematics

Department of **Mathematics** arranged an Extension Lecture by Prof. (Dr.) Avishek Adhikary, an eminent Mathematician, Presidency University on **30.03.2019** at Suniti Sabhaghar. PART D: COMMEMORATIVE DAYS


1. Teachers' Day Celebration: Department of English

Students of Economics honours expressed their gratitude towards their teachers by celebrating Teachers' Day with a medley of cultural performances on September 5th 2018.




7. Teachers' Day Celebration, Department of Sanskrit
