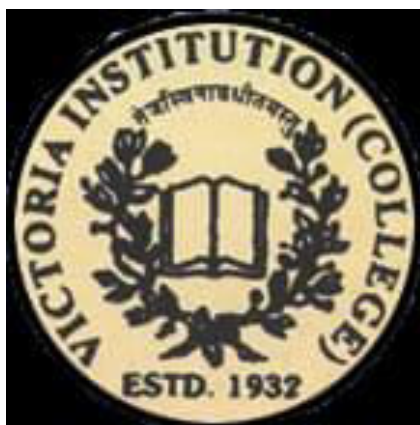

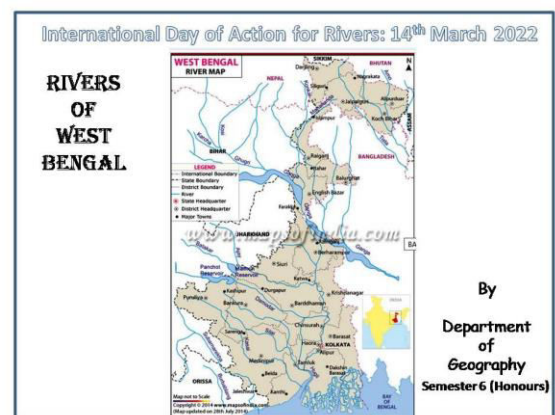
## **2) Project by Semester 6 Honours Students of Geography Department, 14.03.2022**

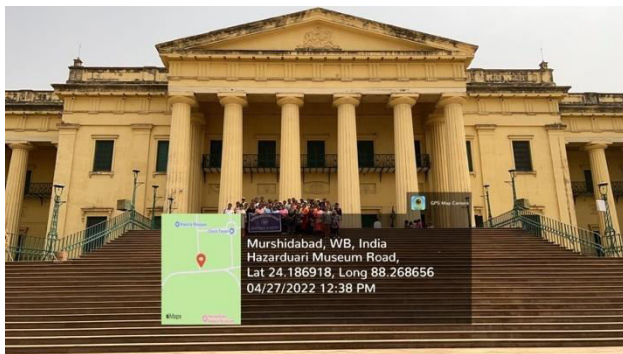


### **7) Murshidabad Field Trip Report conducted by Dept. of History on 26.04.2022-27.04.2022**

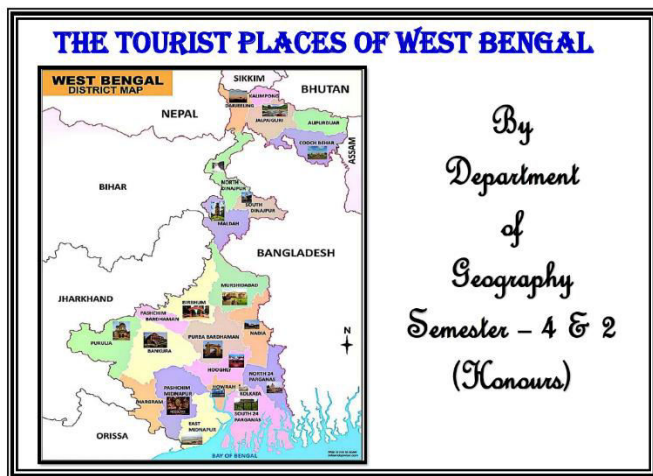


**9) Project by Semester 4 & 2 Honours Students of Geography Department on 17.05.2022**

The trip was very exciting and students gathered great knowledge from the field activities.



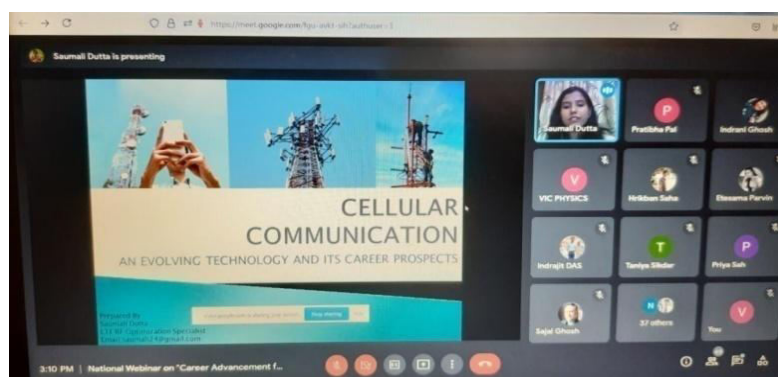
## **Part B : Co- Curricular Activities**

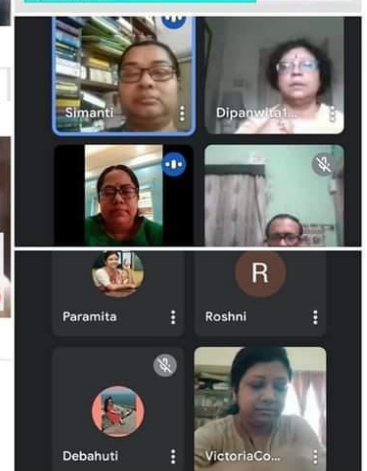
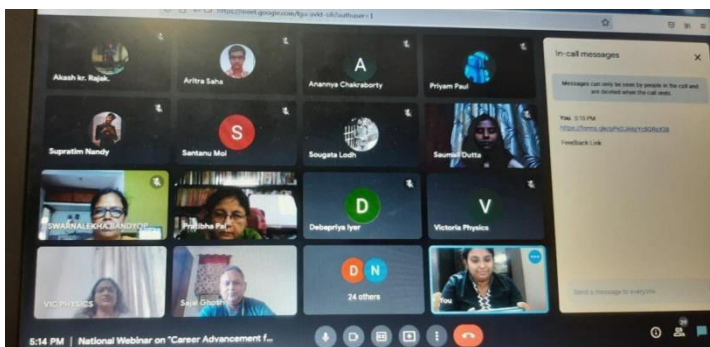
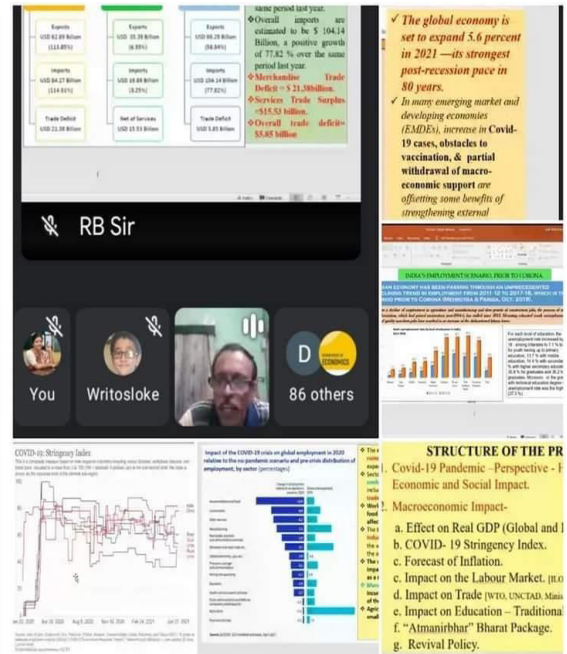
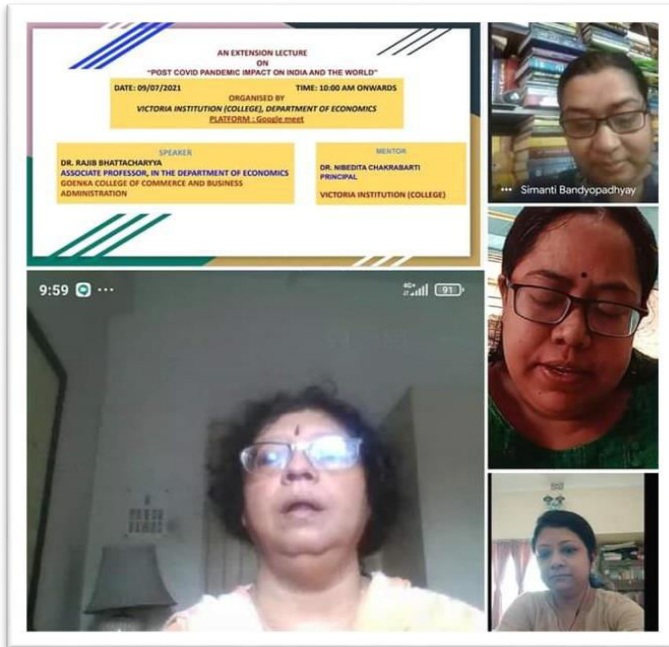
The Webinar was well attended by approximately 50 participants who are UG students from different Colleges, Universities and Institutions throughout India.

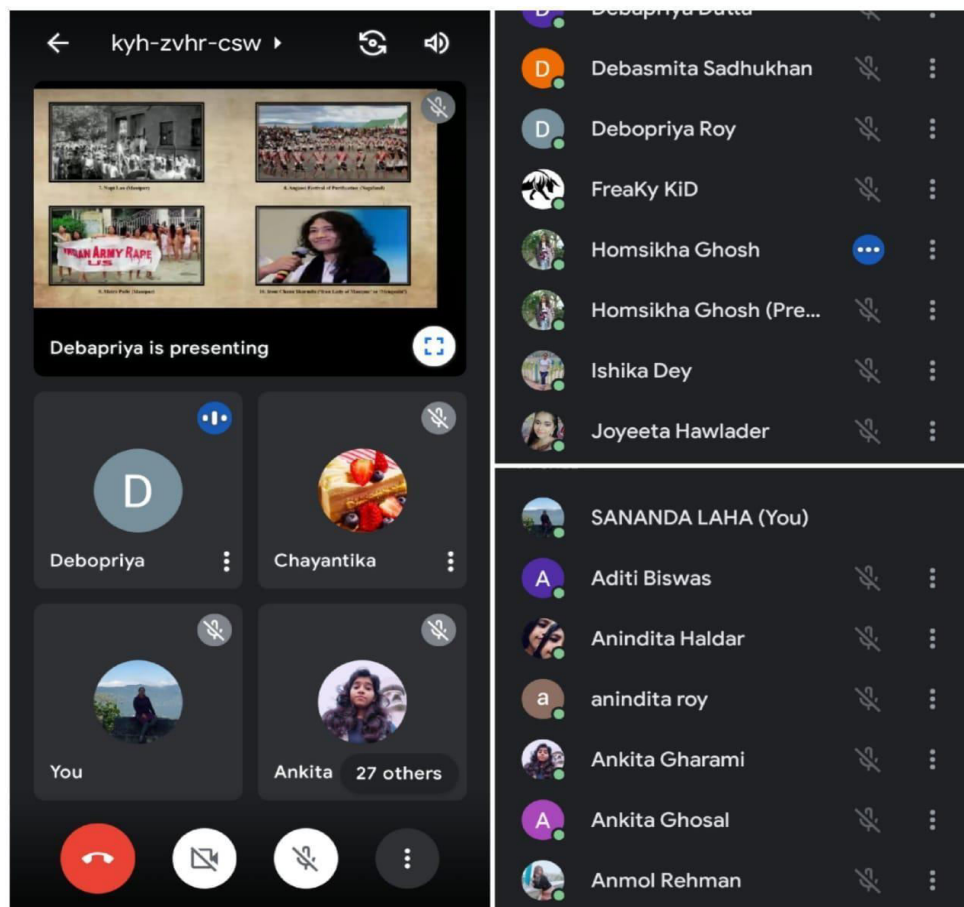




### 5) Dept. of English on 25.10.2021 (Online)

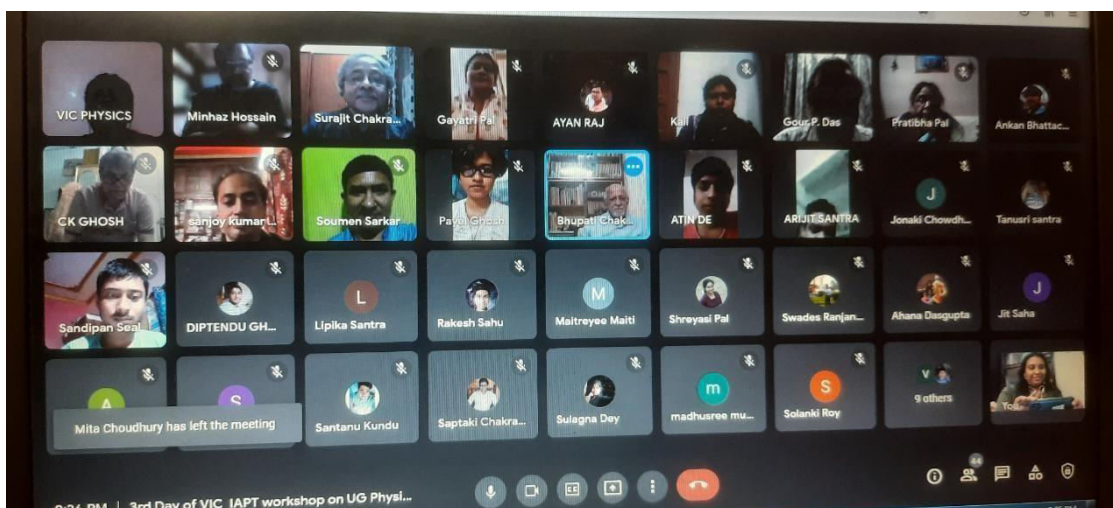


**6) A Report on the Online Workshop on Undergraduate Physics Experiments**  
**organized by the Department of Physics in Collaboration with IAPT, RC 15**  
**27.11.2021, 28.11.2021 and 02.12.2021**

Educational system has suffered enormously during the pandemic. Practical based subjects have suffered the most as experiments can hardly be done in online mode. In order to partly compensate this loss, a three-day Online Workshop On Undergraduate Physics Experiments was organized by the Department of Physics, Victoria Institution (College), in Collaboration with the Indian Association of Physics Teachers, Regional Council 15 (IAPT, RC 15). The workshop was held on 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup> Nov & 2<sup>nd</sup> Dec, 2021. Resource persons delivered online talks on several experiments at the undergraduate 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> year levels with demonstrations and videos. ### **Department of Psychology, 03.01.2022 - 07.01.2022 (Online)**

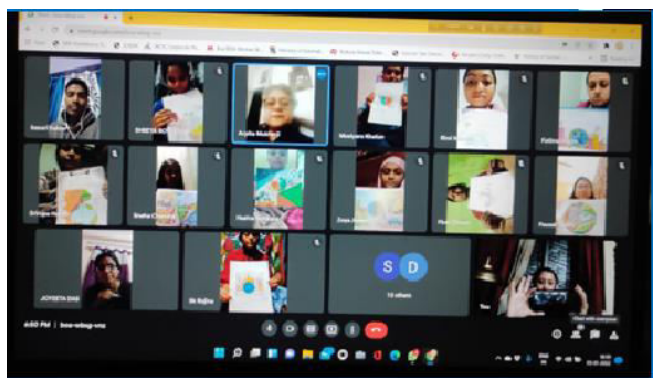

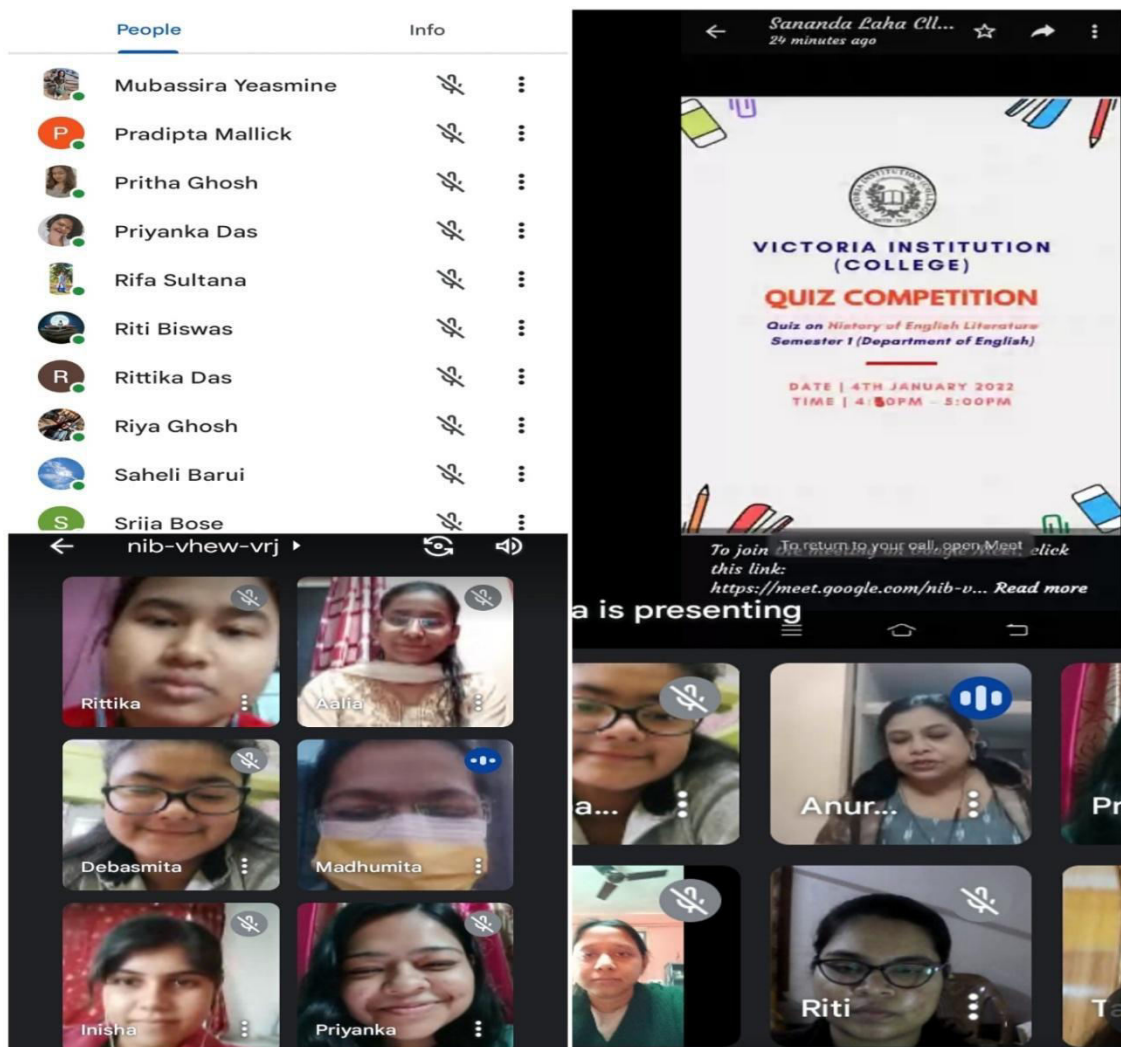




## 14) Quiz Competition, dated 04.01.2022

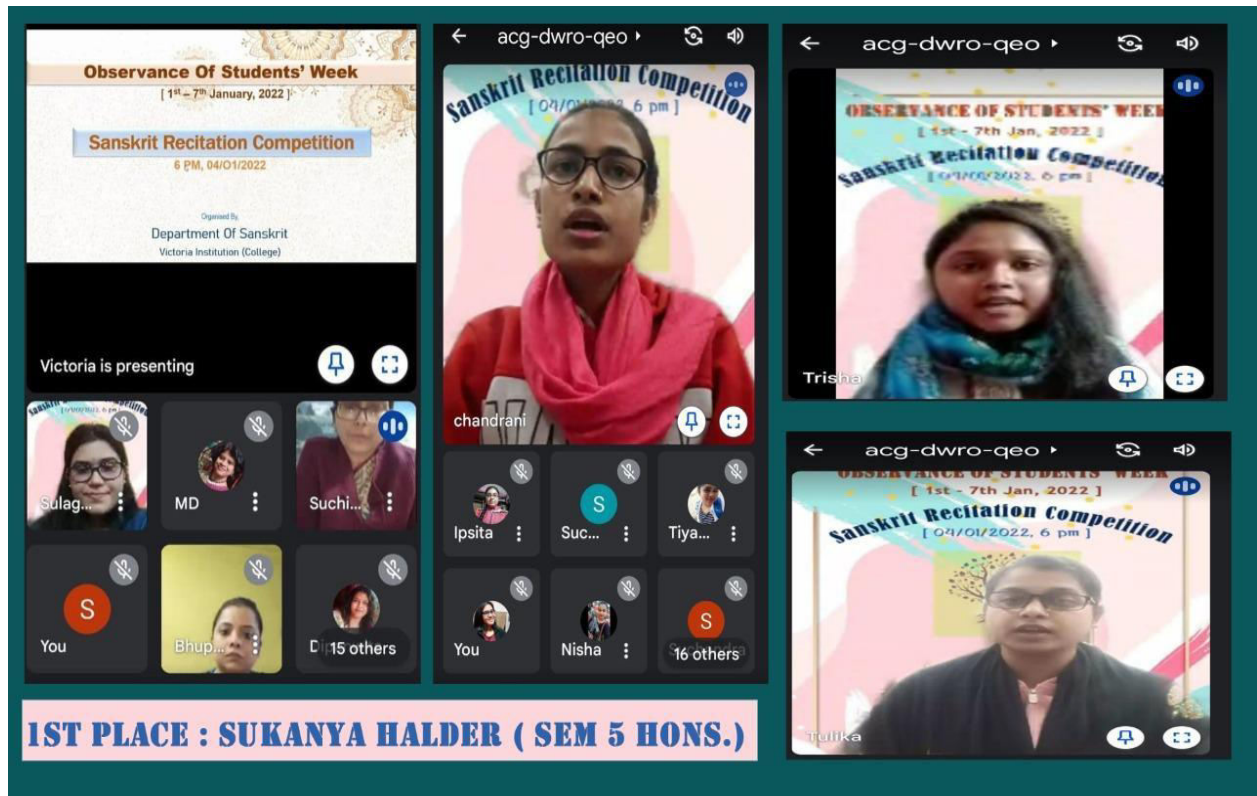

04.01.2022, Dept. of Sanskrit (Online)

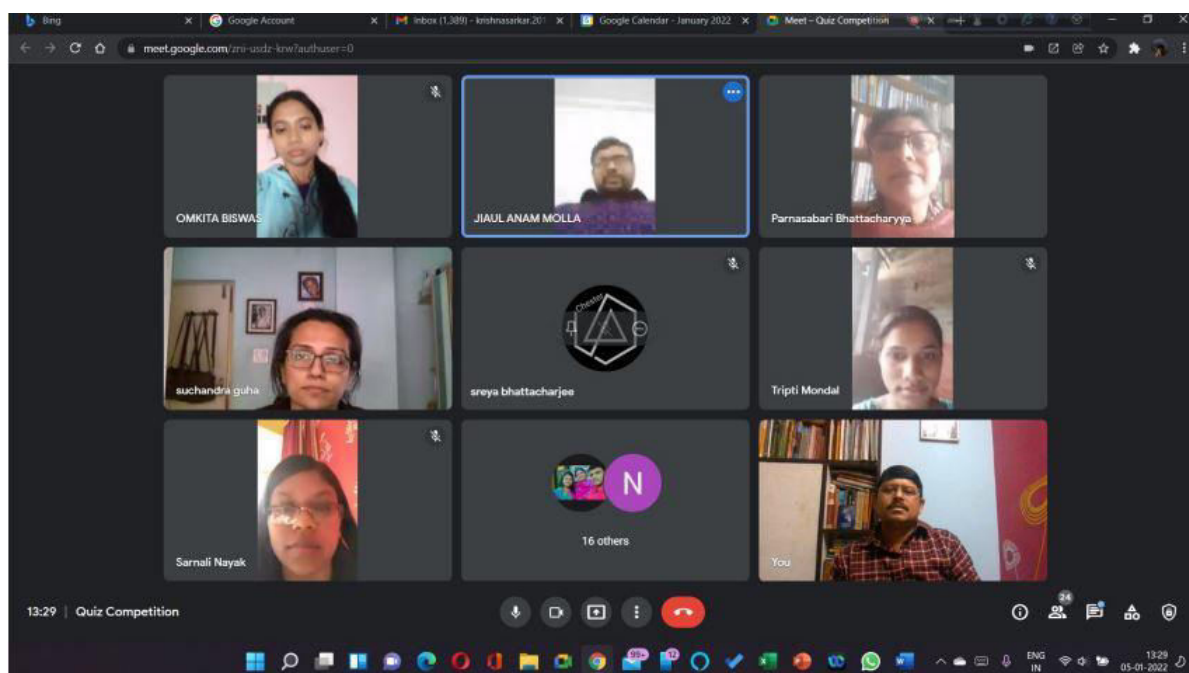

**05.01.2022, Dept. of History (Online)**

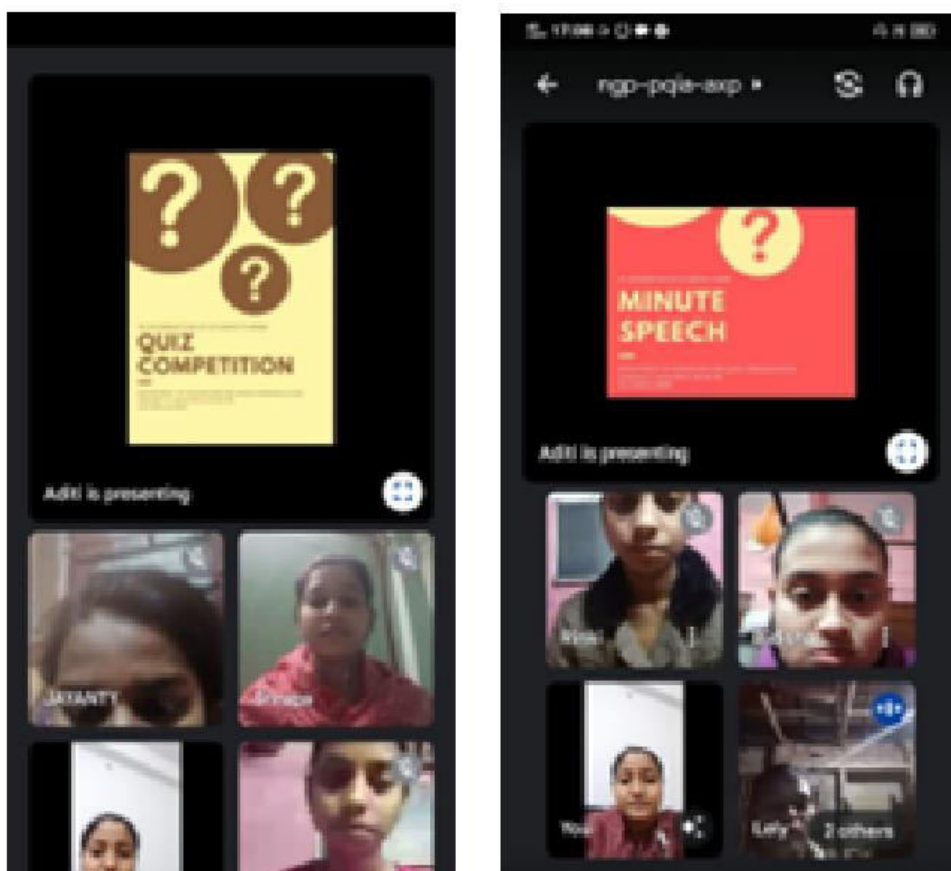

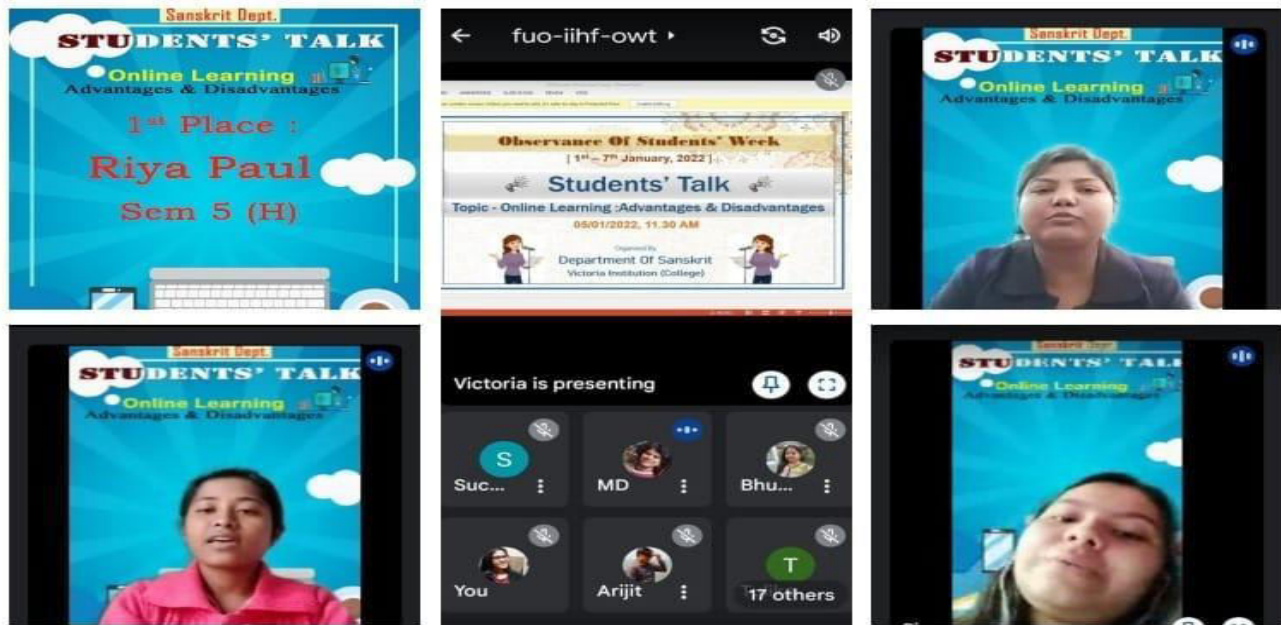




## **18) Students' Talk on "Online Learning: Advantages & Disadvantages"**

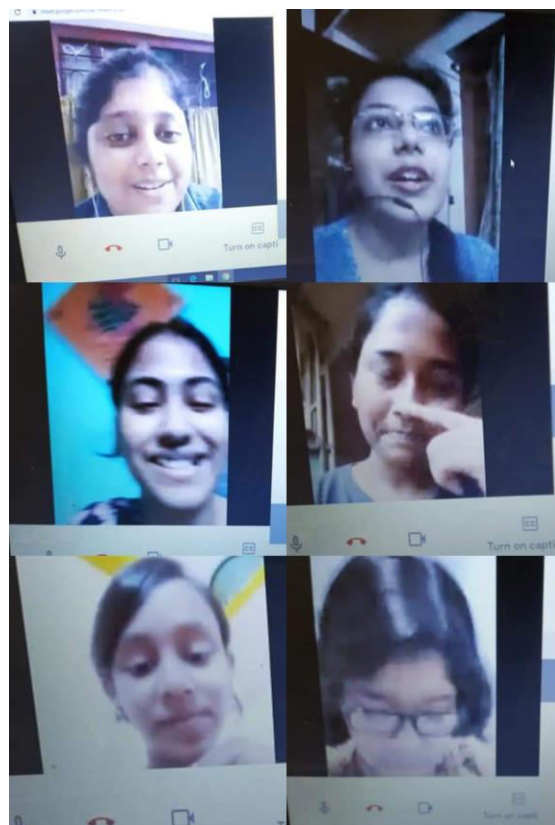

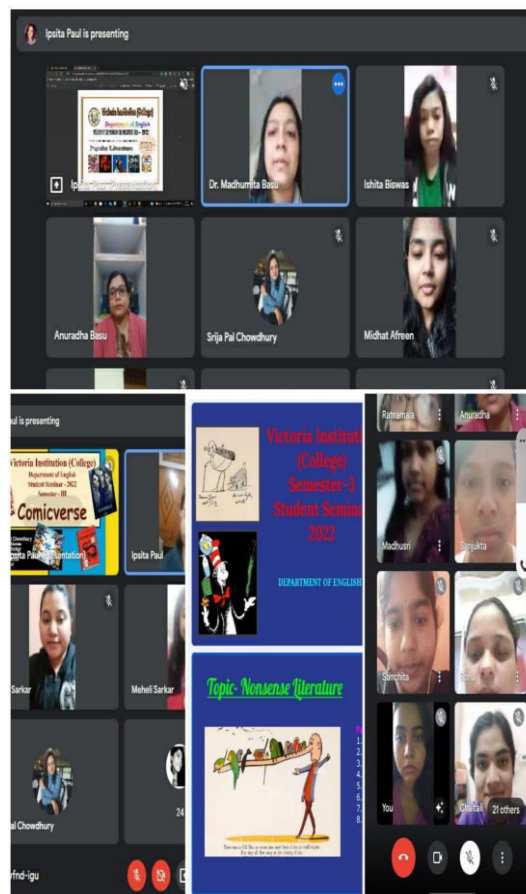
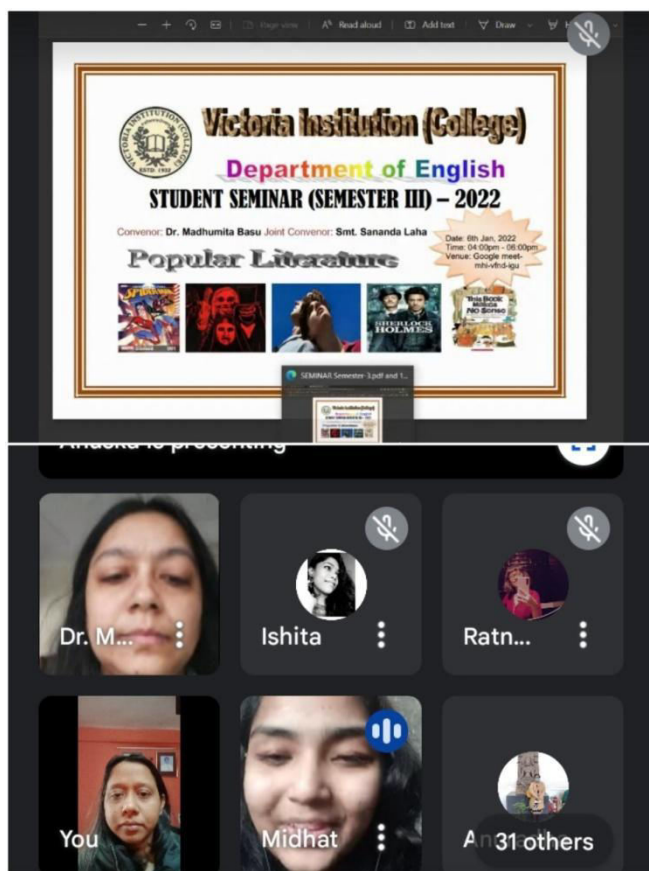
### Dept. of English (Online)

The enthusiasm and dedication of the students in preparing their respective presentations was really remarkable and the overall experience was great – they had fun and at the same time became confident of their abilities.

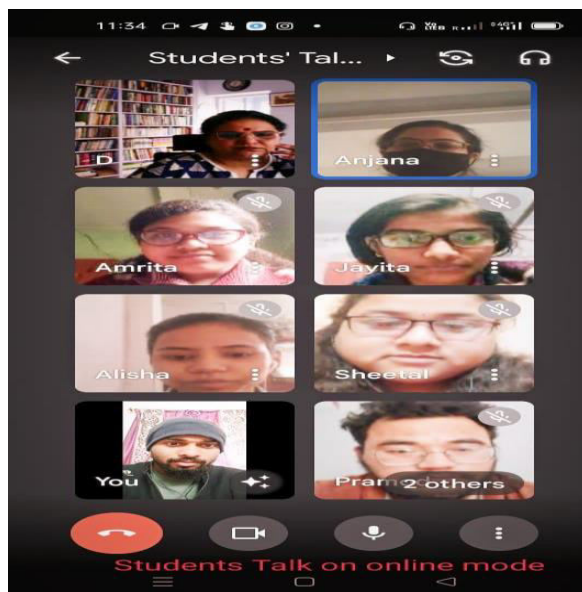


## 21) Online Students' Talk

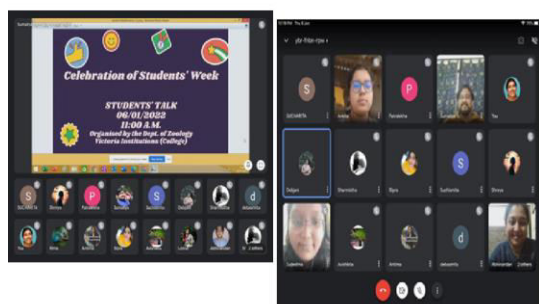

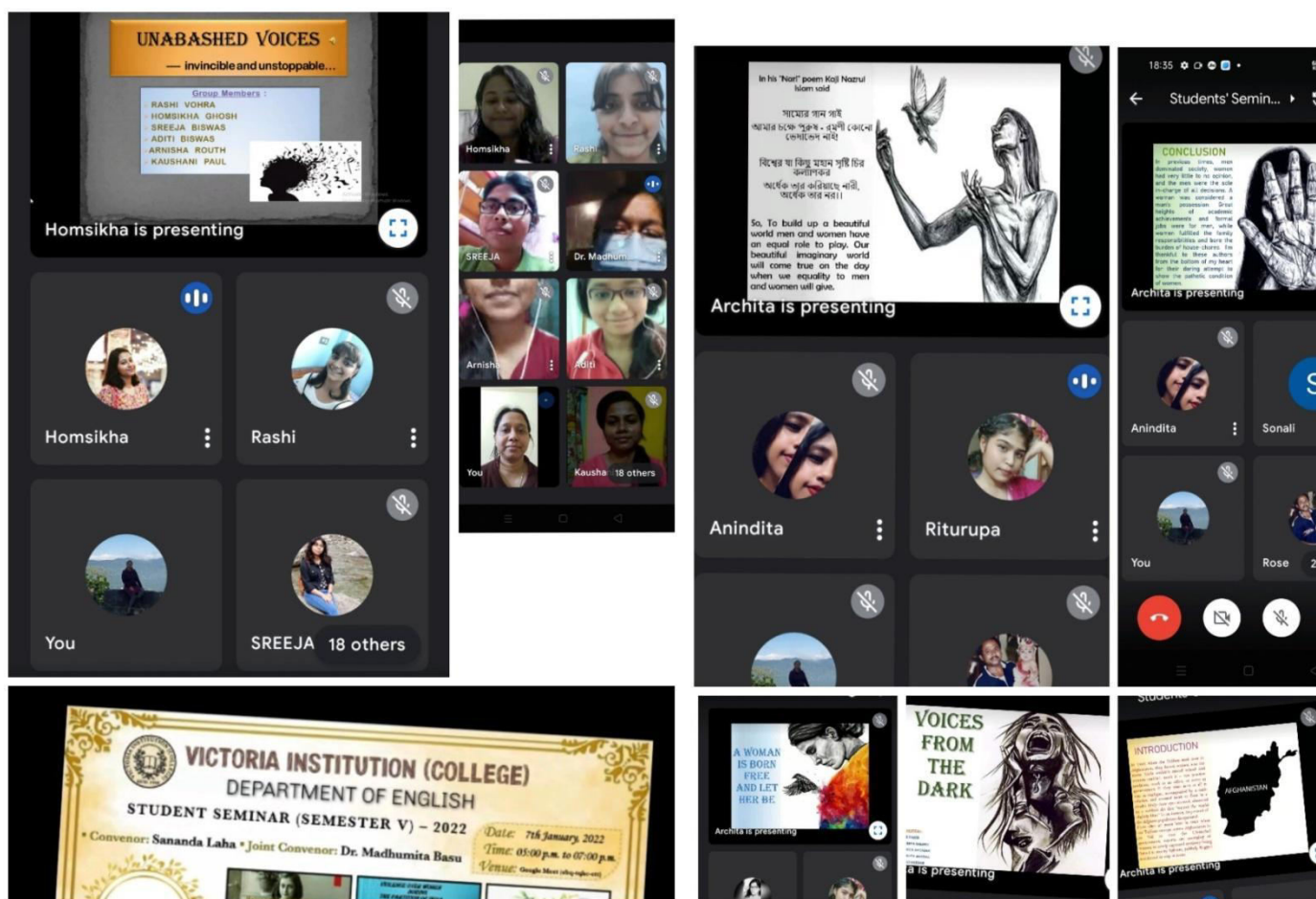

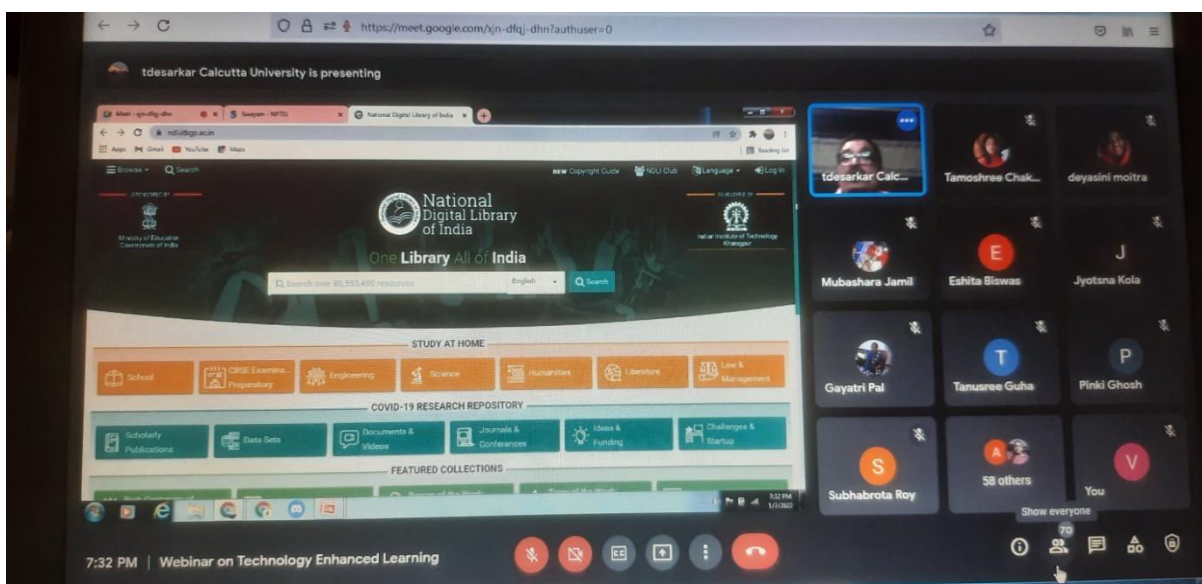
## **24) Webinar on "Technology Enhanced Learning (TEL): an Innovative Approach"**

The Library and Department of Physics of Victoria Institution (College) jointly organized a Webinar on 7<sup>th</sup> January, 2022 entitled "Technology Enhanced Learning (TEL): an innovative approach" as part of the celebration of Students' Week.

He enriched the discussion showing different online sources and search techniques to collect the course curriculum based resources especially for undergraduate students which would be also beneficial for faculty members. He also mentioned about SWAYAM courses and virtual laboratory. He concluded his speech that enhancement of online learning skill will also enhance the self-learning. **25) Workshop on Digital INGA@VECC: The Milestones Achieved & The Miles Ahead organized by Department of Physics & IQAC, VIC in collaboration with UGC-DAE Consortium for Scientific Research, Kolkata Centre 10<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> of March, 2022 (Online)**

The recent campaign of the Indian National Gamma Array (INGA), setup at the Room Temperature Cyclotron (RTC) in VECC, Kolkata, was implemented through more than 30 experiments carried out in different phases of the programme. The facility was sustained by resources pooled from VECC, SINP, and the Kolkata Centre of UGC-DAE CSR. The User Groups included those from Institutions, Universities and Colleges across the country such as Victoria Institution (College), Visva Bharati, TIFR, BARC, IIT-KGP, IEST, University of Delhi, University of Mumbai, CEBS-UM, SINP, VECC, UGC-DAE CSR and others. Results from some of these efforts have already been published in international peer reviewed journals of repute while some are currently in submission. Data analysis is in progress for some of the projects. This two-day online workshop was aimed at reviewing the physics results of significance, accomplished in the campaign, as well as at addressing the issues that might be deterring the progress of the data analysis exercise that are currently underway. The inauguration of the event was graced by the Directors of UGC-DAE CSR and VECC along with the Teacher-in-Charge of the Victoria Institution (College), the Centre-Director of the Kolkata Centre of UGC-DAE CSR, the Group Head of the Physics Group at VECC, the Head of the Experimental Nuclear Physics Division, VECC and the Coordinator of the IQAC at the Victoria Institution (College). The principal component of the workshop was presentations by research scholars who are spearheading the data analysis endeavours and the talks were followed by discussions, suggestions and comments by the audience that included resource personnel and senior members of the fraternity for nuclear structure research. The research scholars represented user groups from teaching and/or research institutions across the country that have used the INGA facility at VECC along with the associated digital DAQ of the Kolkata Centre and the software resources therewith. The workshop also hosted presentations by resource personnel of the INGA setup at VECC and other accelerator centers in the country. These talks reviewed the existing infrastructure as well as described the different developments being pursued for the advancement of the INGA facility. The workshop provided platform for discussions and exchanges on the pathways ahead in the domain of nuclear structure studies using INGA, that'll facilitate its evolution into sustaining a globally competitive research programme.



The online workshop was attended by 35 participants and hosted around 20 presentations by research scholars, resource personnel of the INGA facility and other experts in the domain.

The key points that was discussed were as follows:

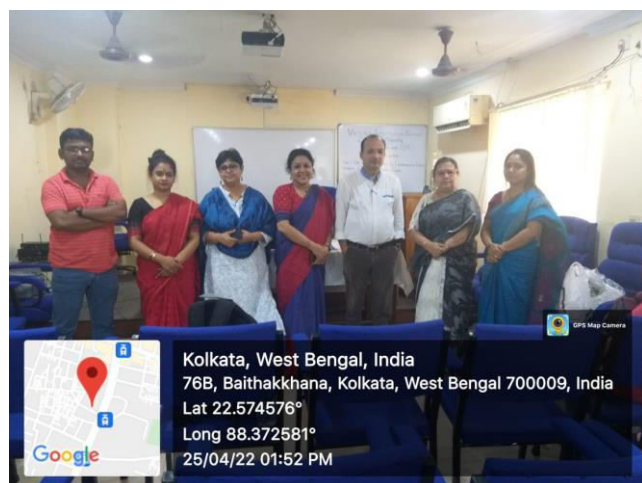

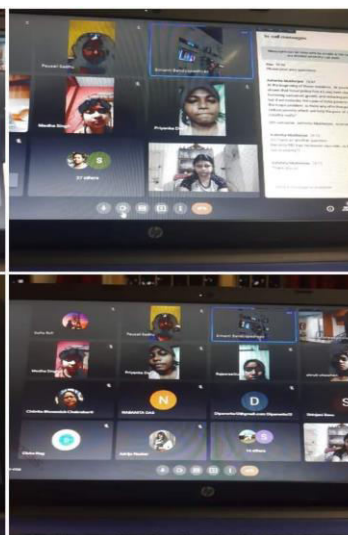
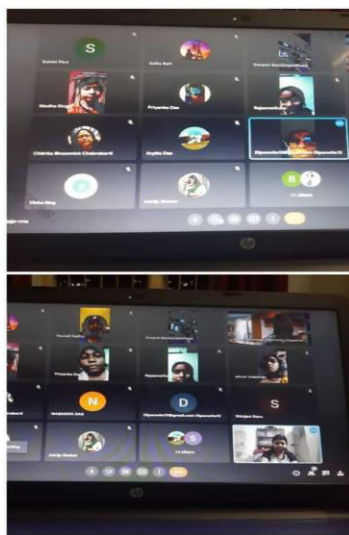
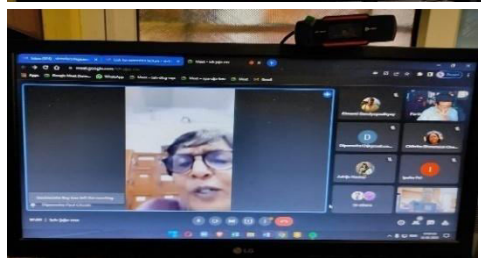
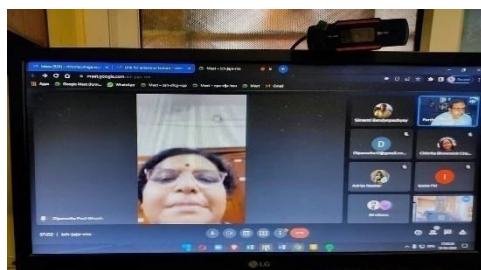
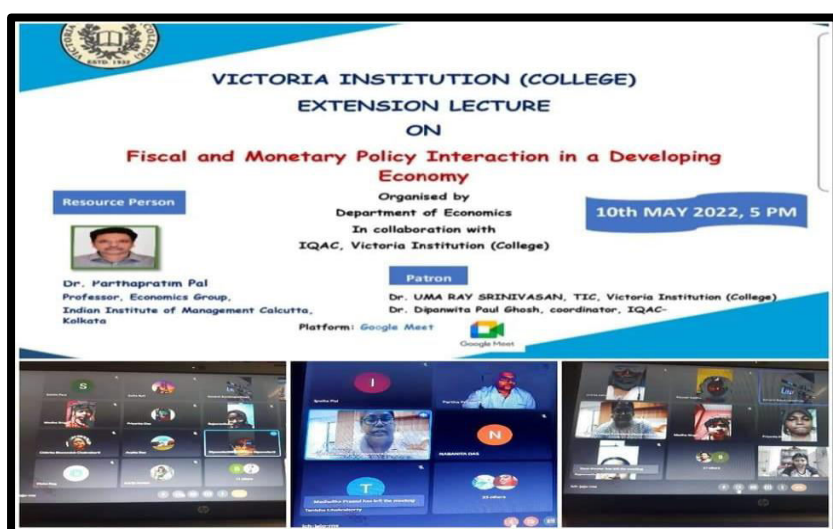


## **52) Online Extension Lecture, Dept. of Economics and IQAC, 10.05.2022**

The event ended with the vote of thanks raised by Mrs Alok Mukhopadhyay.

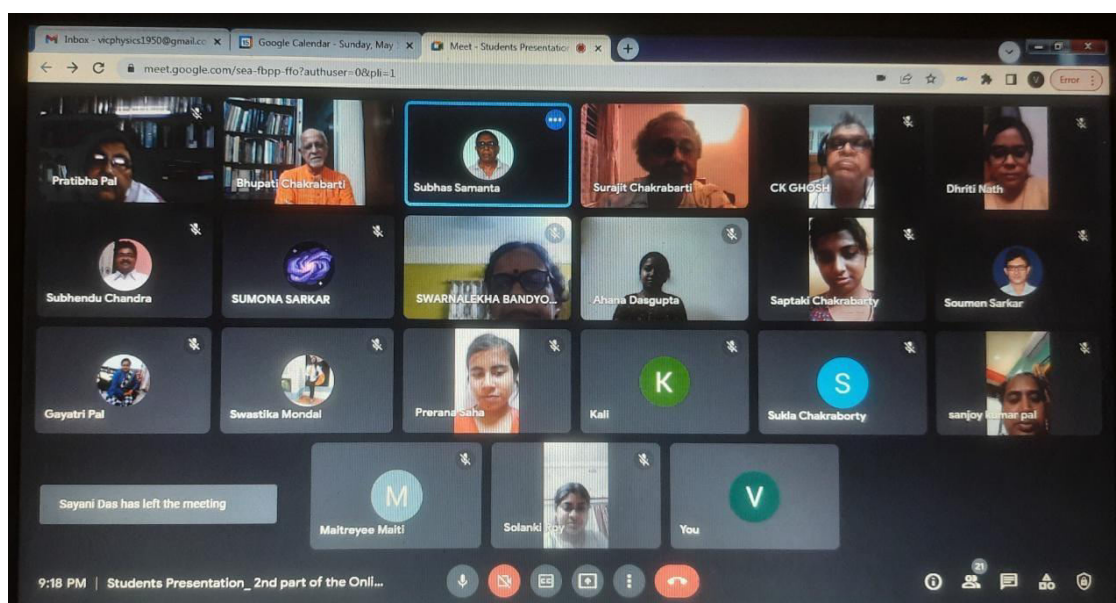




**54) A brief report on the Students' Presentation on "Undergraduate Physics Experiments"**

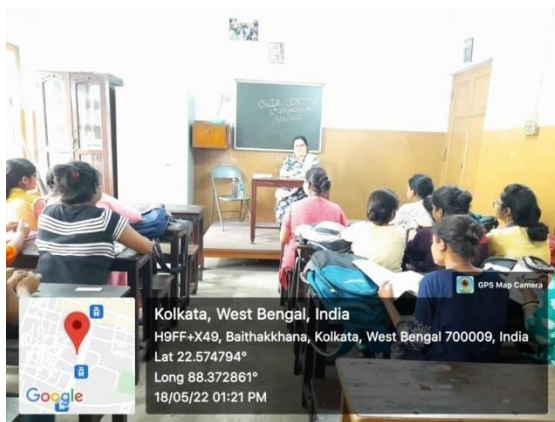

We rewarded all the participants with notebooks and pens.

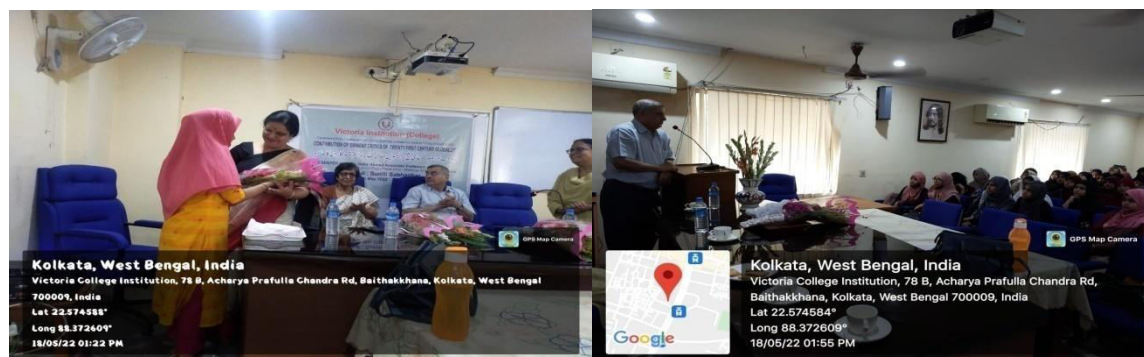

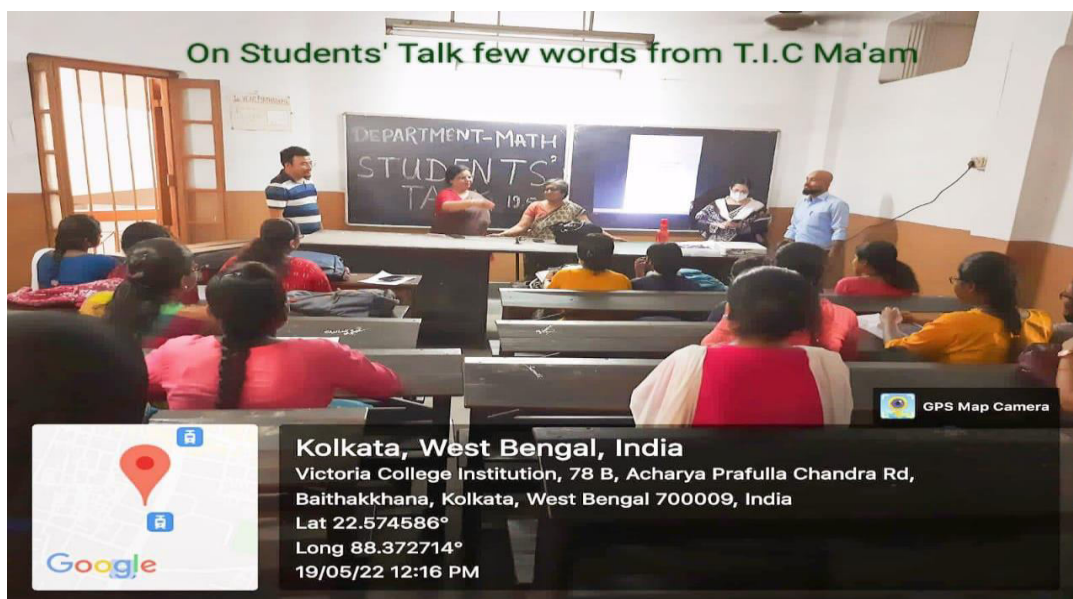

19.05.2022, Dept. of Mathematics

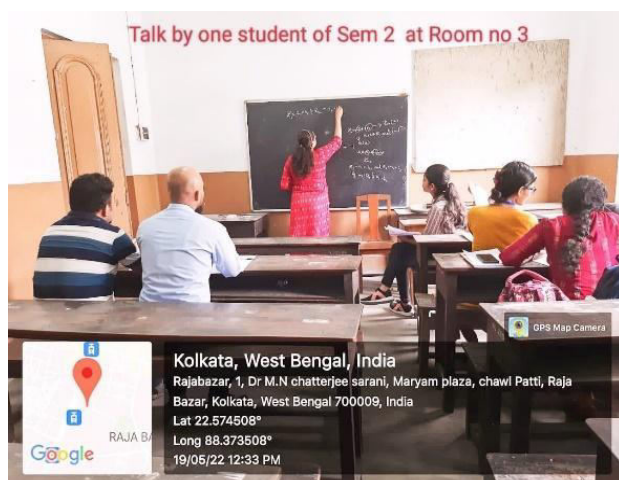

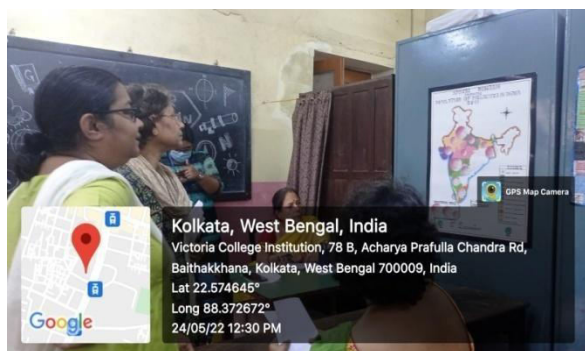




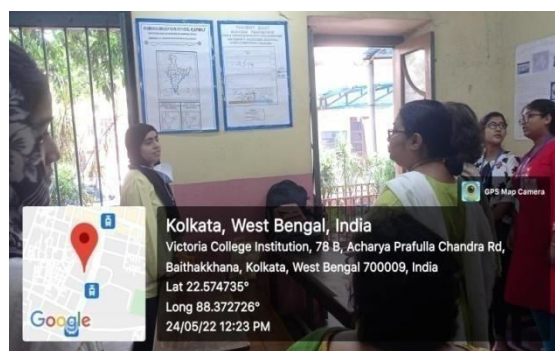
### **63) Participation in Poster Competition**

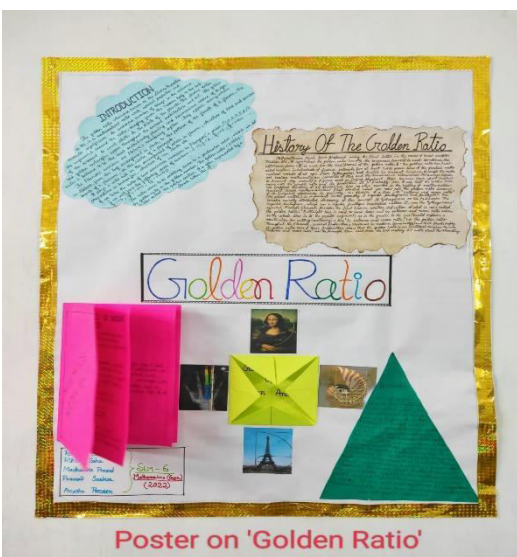

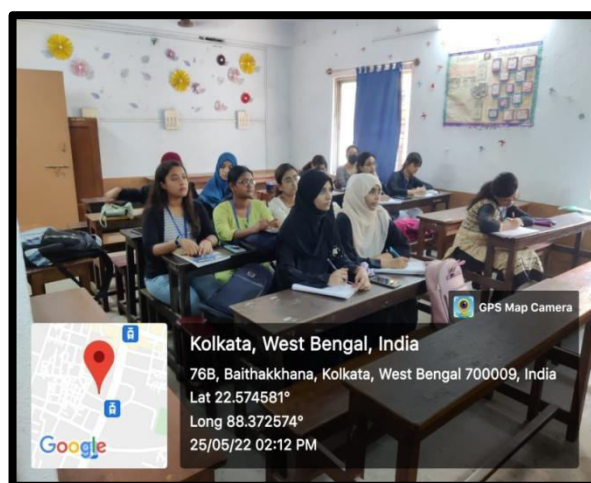

**69) Parent- Teachers' Meeting , dated 28.05.2022****Dept. of English**

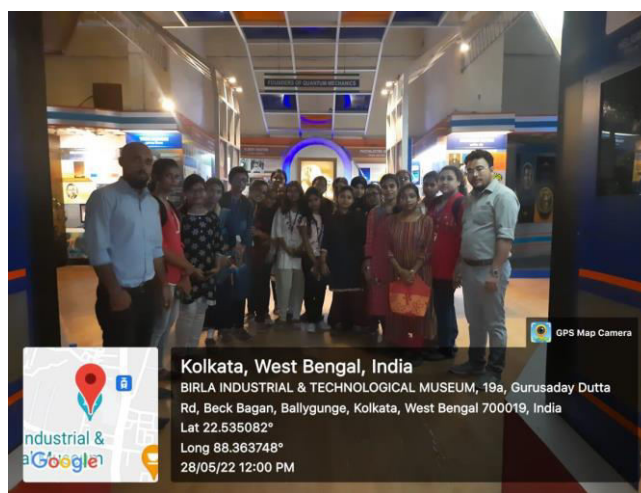

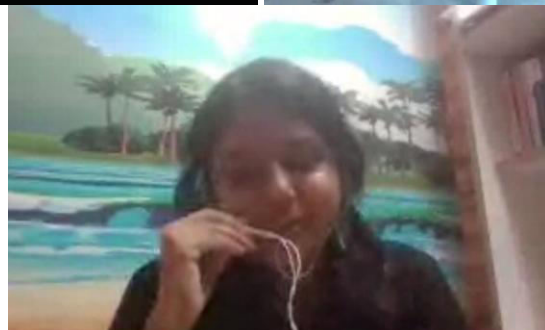
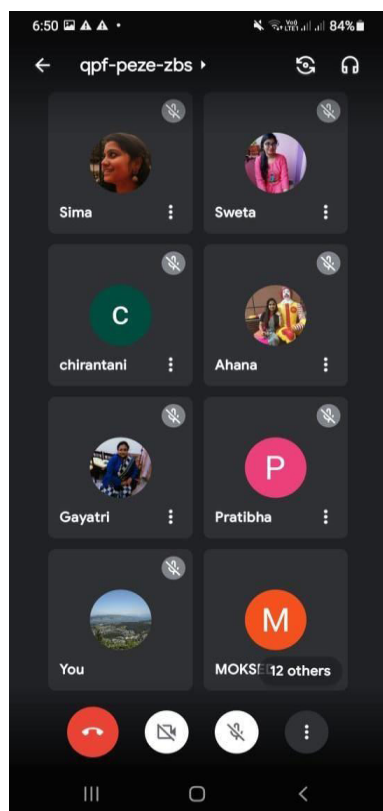

**1<sup>st</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> January 2022, Dept. of Bengali**

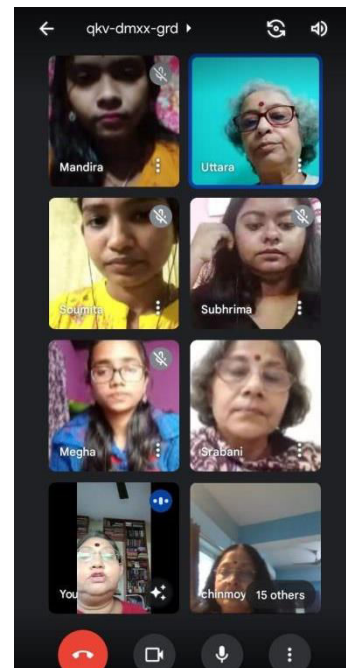
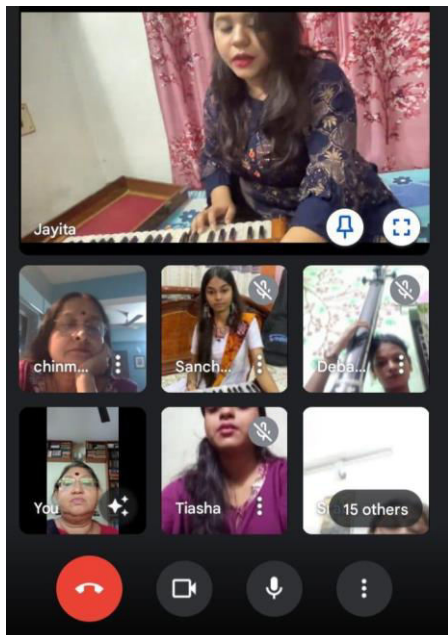

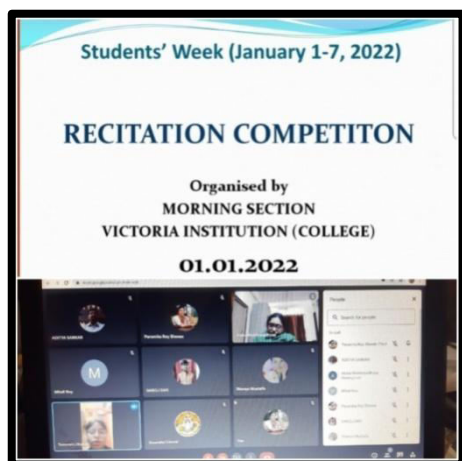

All three events were conducted successfully and the students were enjoyed the events thoroughly.



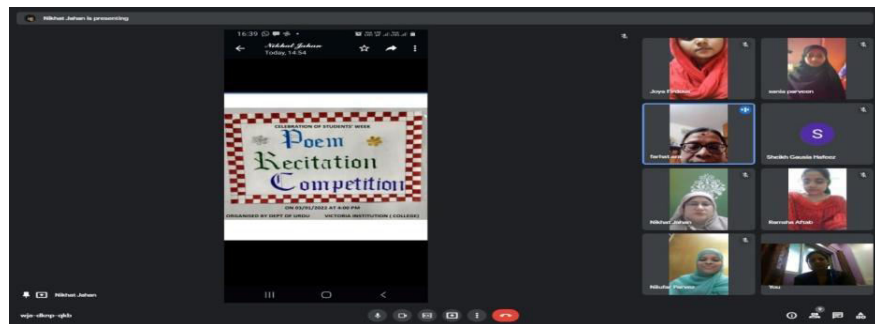
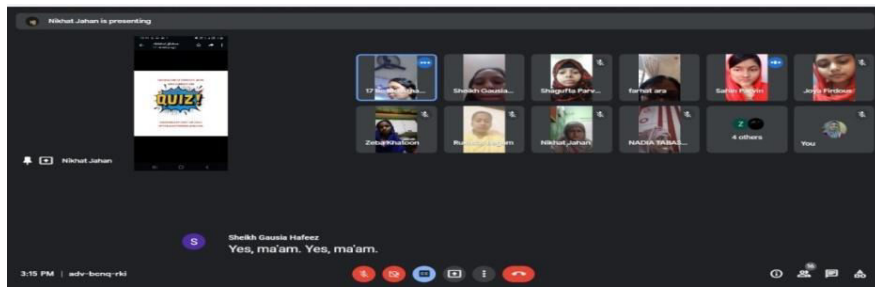
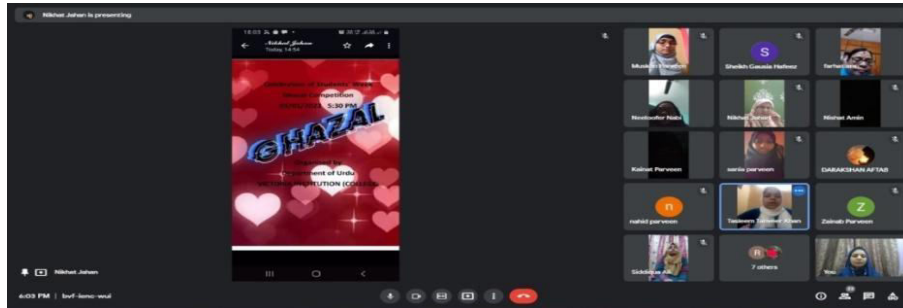

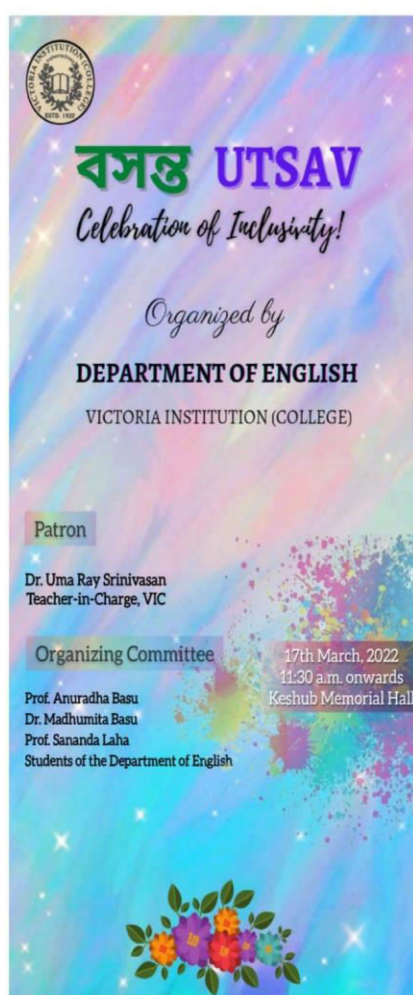
### **9) Students as Mentors in Department 2022** **Department of Psychology on 16.03.2022**

## 10) Basanta Utsav, dated 17.03.2022 Dept. of English

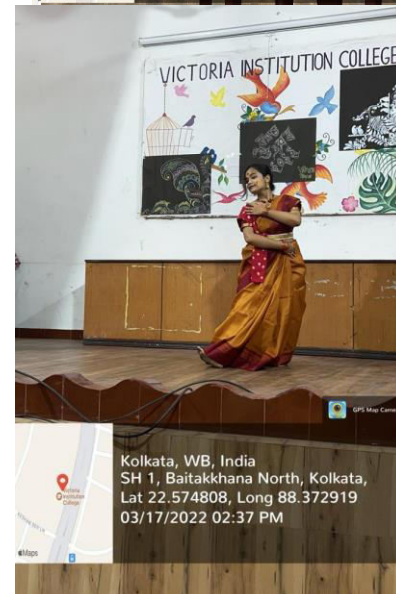
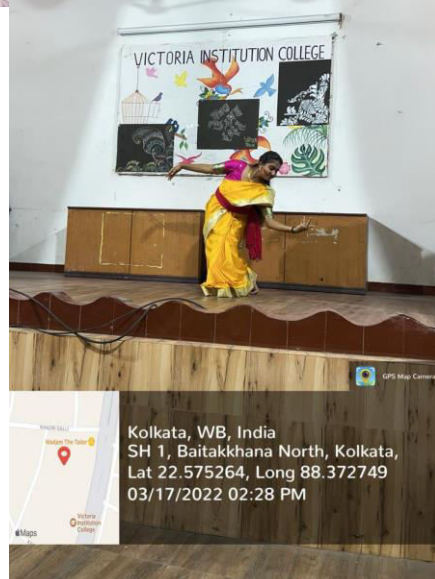

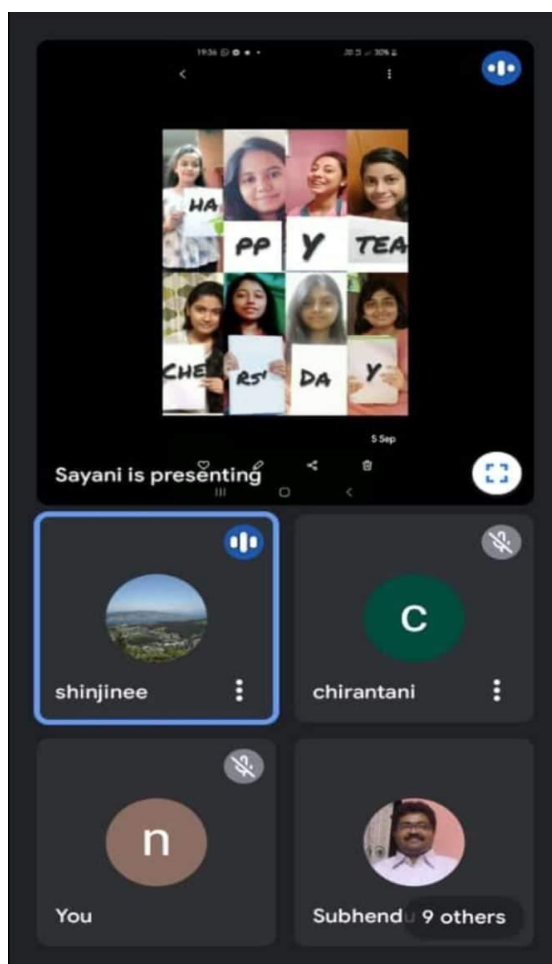


#### **4) Teacher's Day Celebration (Online) 05.09.2021**

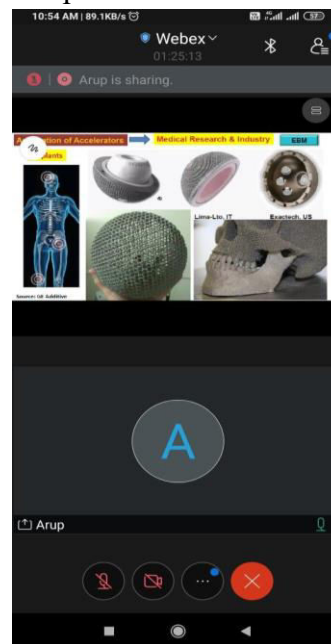
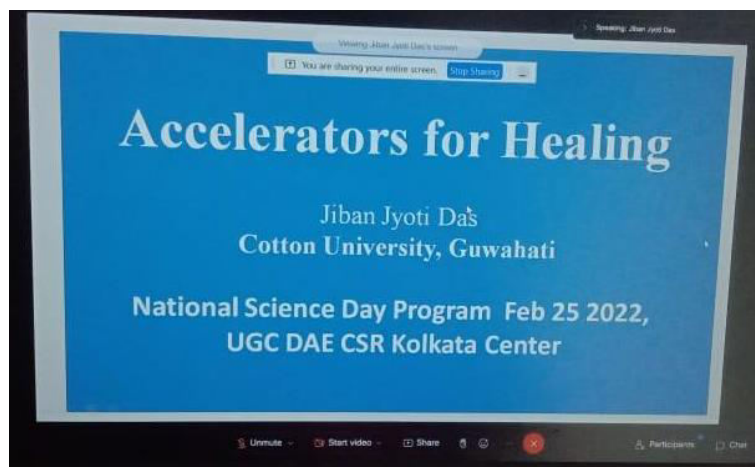

## **8) Brief Report on the National Webinar to Celebrate National Science Day, 2022**

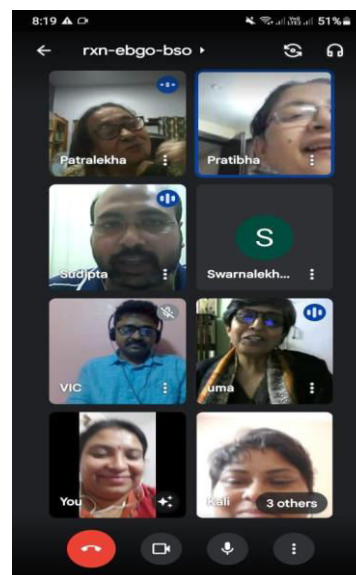
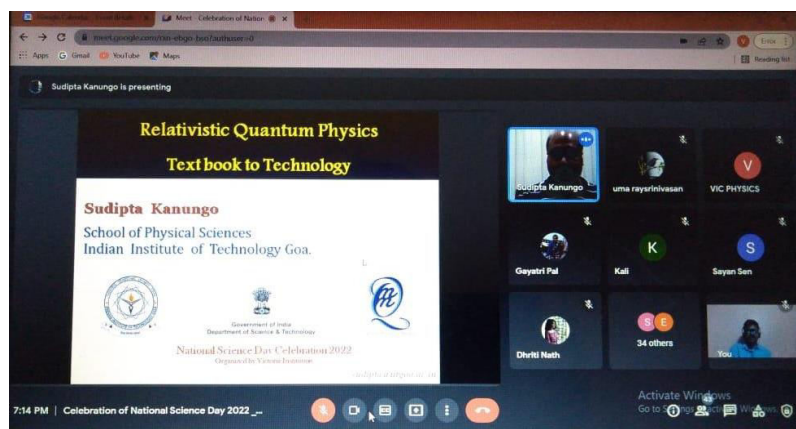
**Organized by the Department of Physics in Collaboration with IQAC,**

**03.03.2022, Dept. of Zoology**

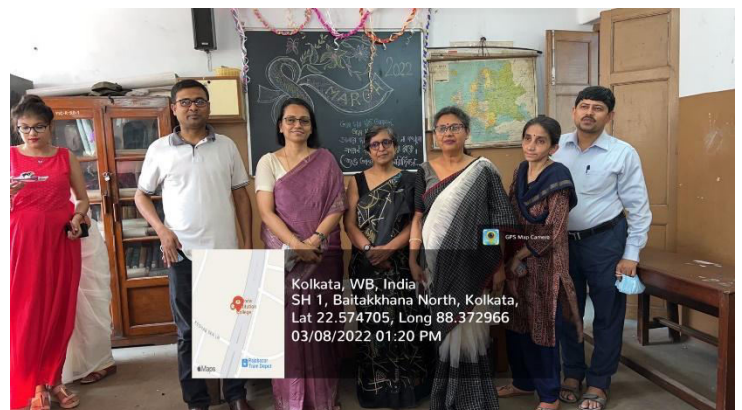

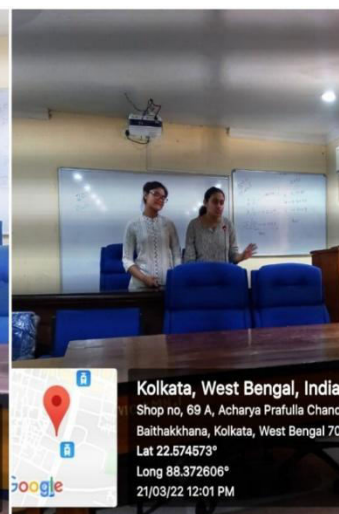
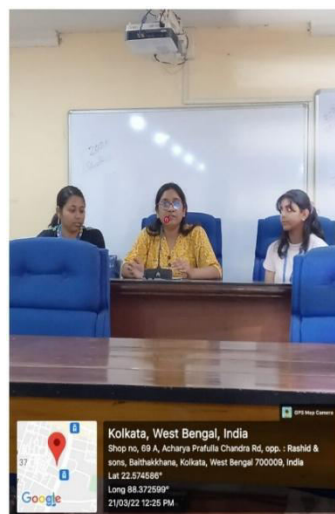
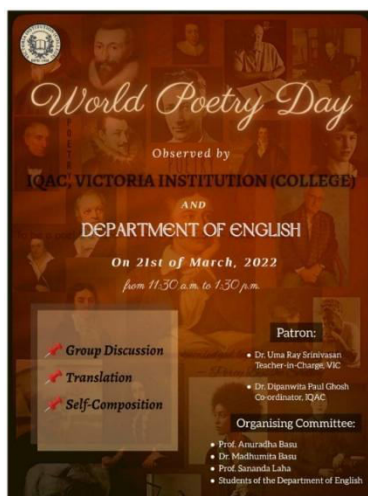




## 16) World Poetry Day Celebration, dated 21.03.2022

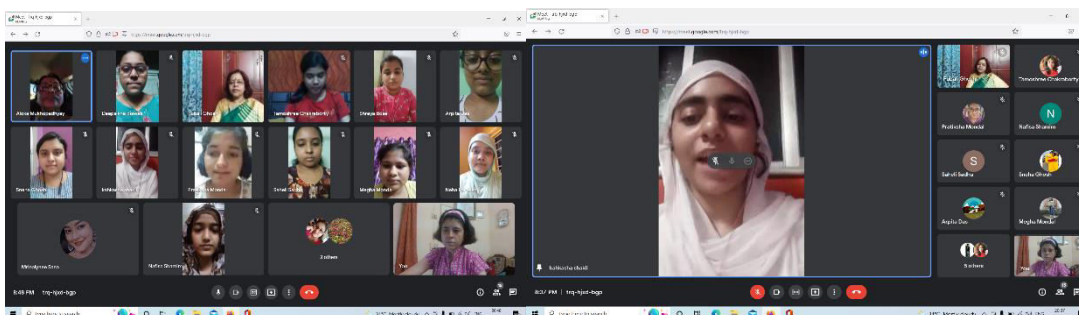
## 24) Celebration of International Museum Day on 18.05.2022, Dept. of History

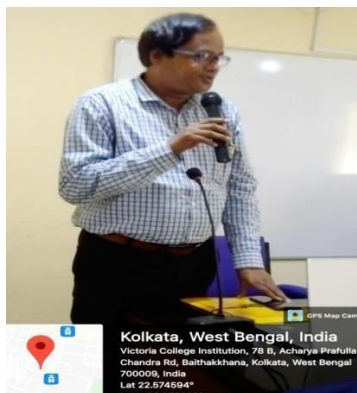
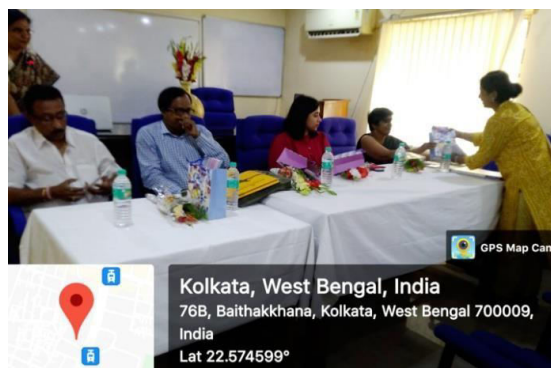
### **1) Teaching Staff- training Program on 28.03.2022 in the Suniti Sabhaghar.**

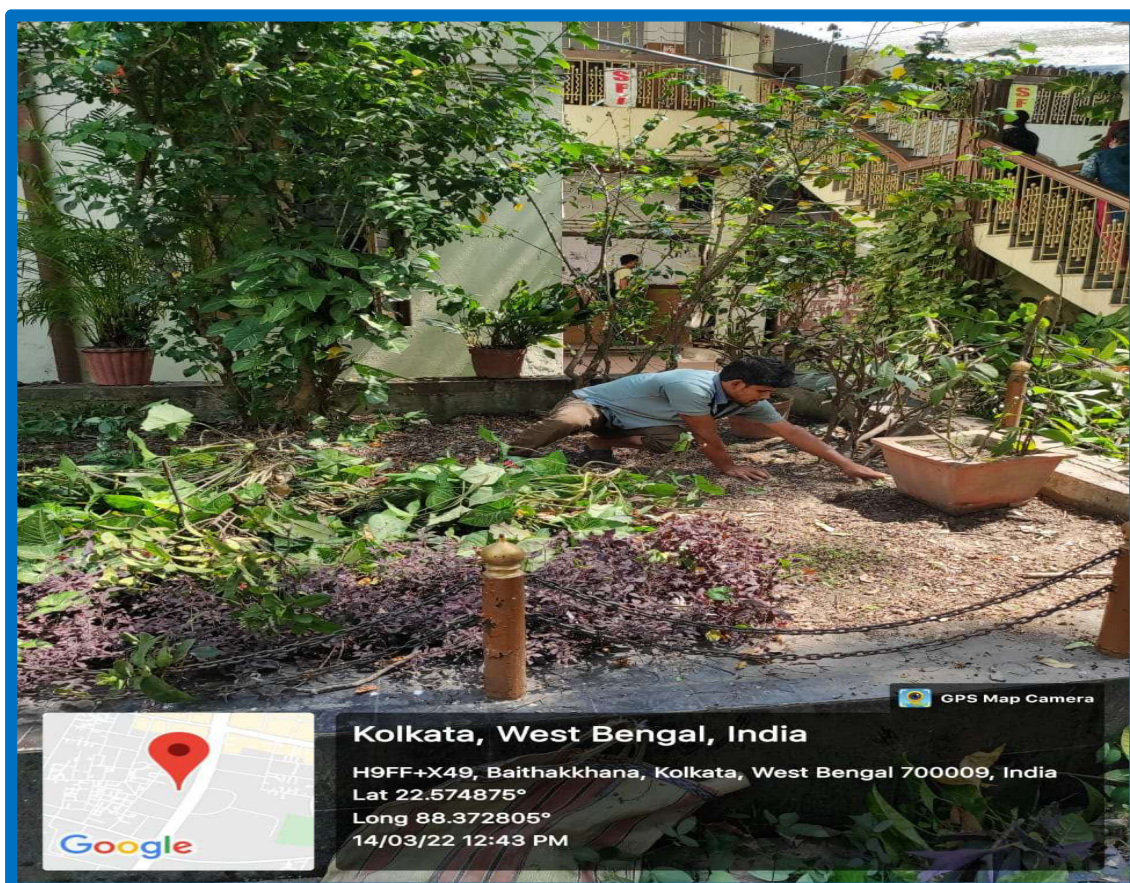
## **PART F: Initiatives of NSS and NCC**

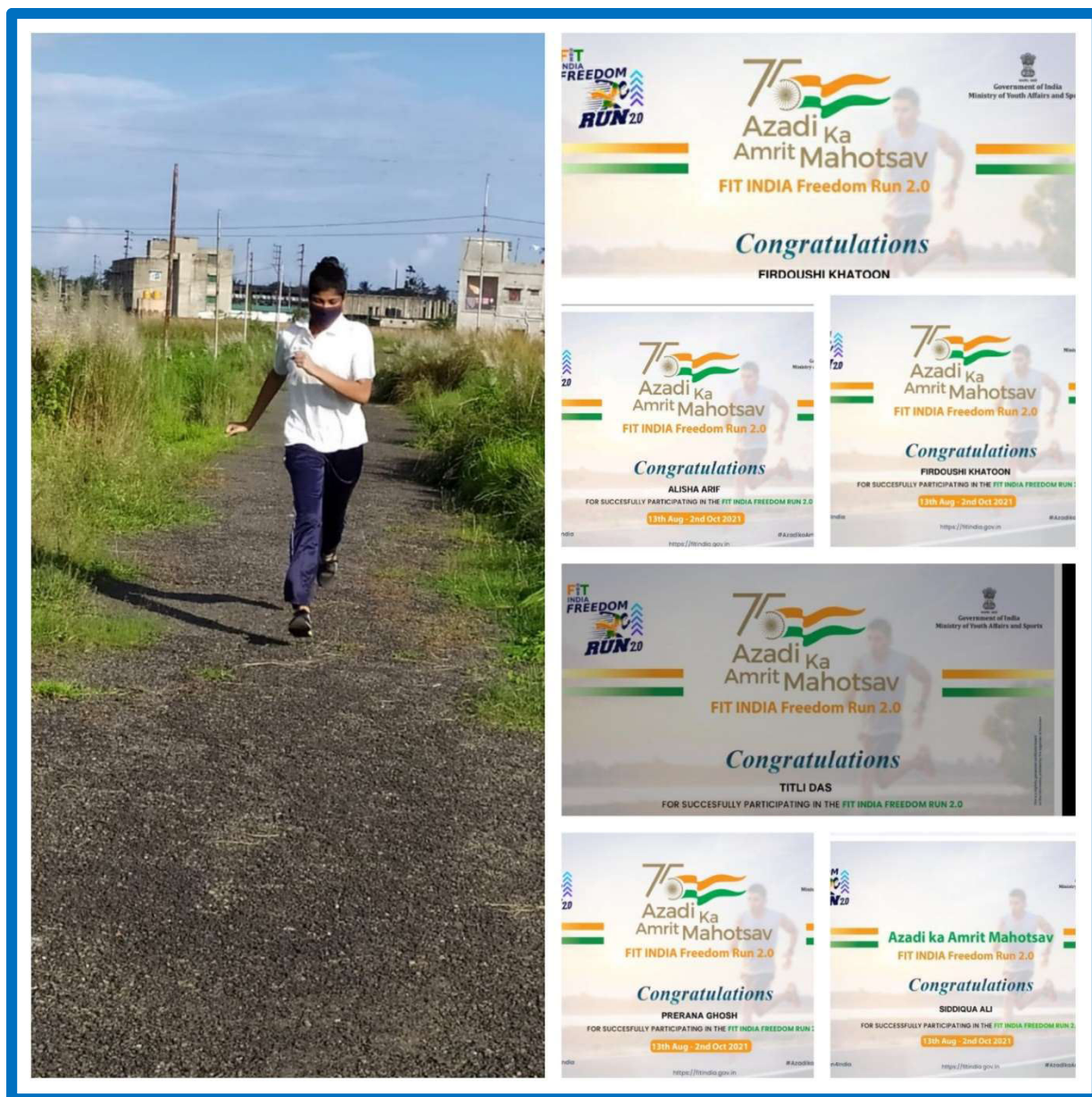

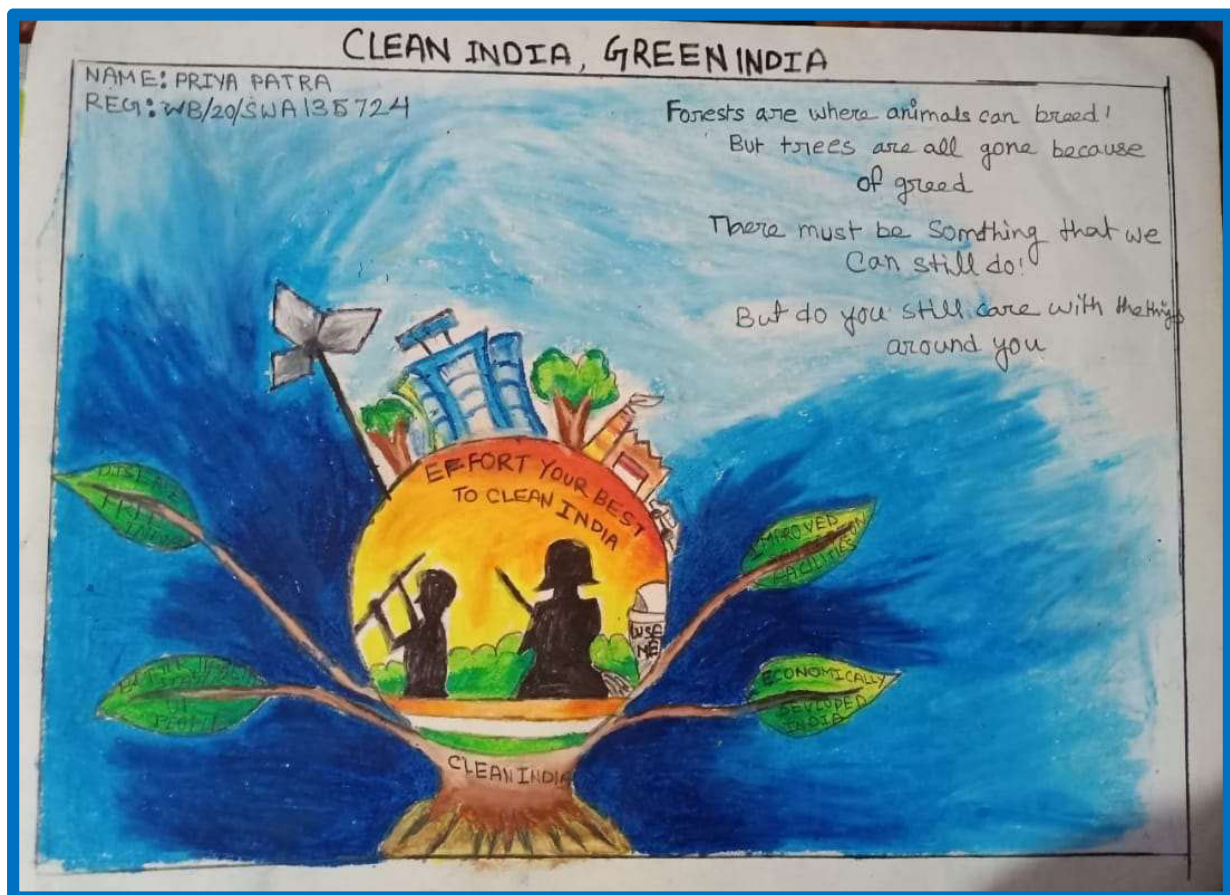

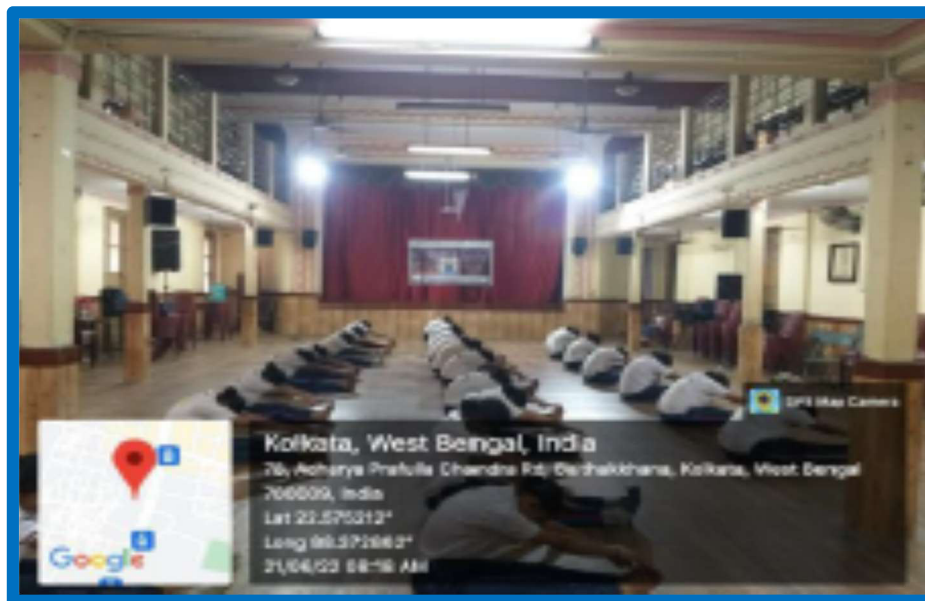
