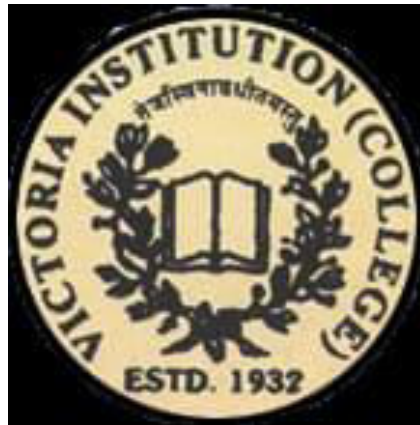

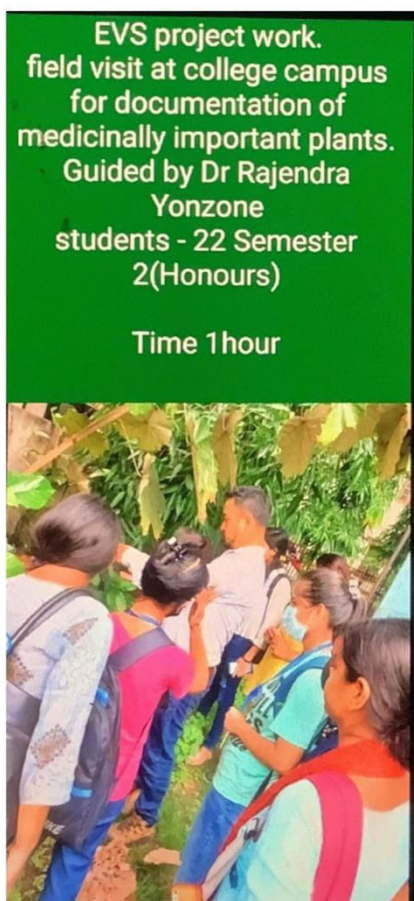

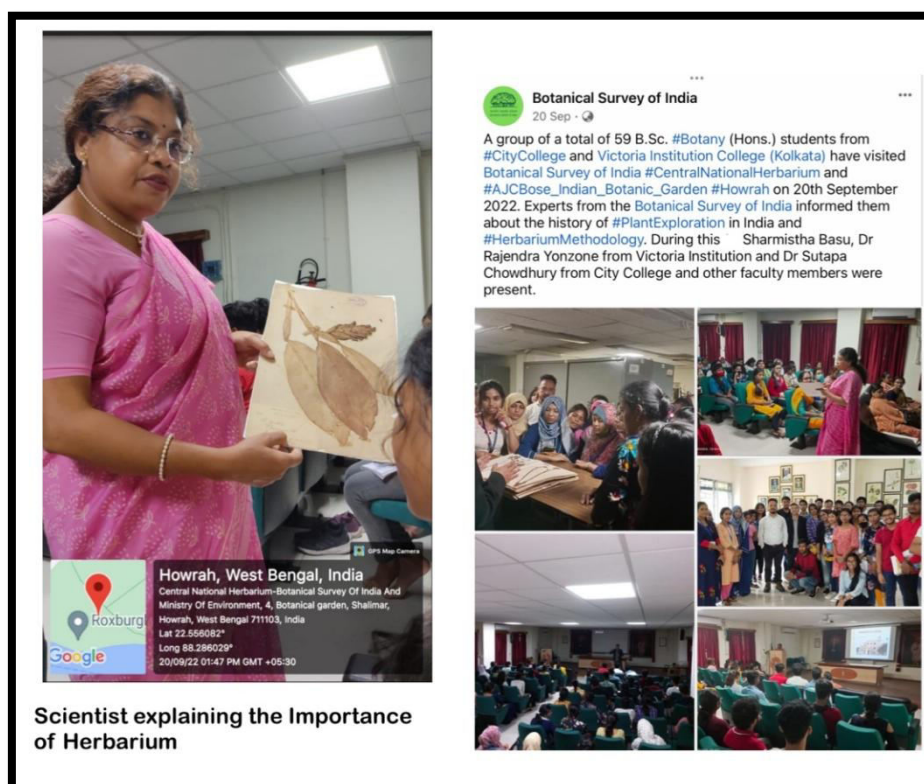
**2) Visit to AJCBIBG ,SHIBPUR, HOWRAH., Dept. of Botany**

On 20/09/2022, Students of Botany Honours Semester 3 and 5 visited the ACHARYA JAGADISH CHANDRA BOSE INDIAN BOTANIC GARDEN, under the guidance of Smt Sharmistha Basu, Smt Aditi Dey, Smt Payel Chatterjee ,Dr. Rajendra Yonzone and laboratory assistants Shri Hrishikesh Choudhury and Shri Sanjay Seal. The Acharya Jagadish Chandra Bose Indian Botanic Garden, previously known as Indian Botanic Garden and the Calcutta Botanic Garden, is situated in Shibpur, Howrah near Kolkata. They are commonly known as the Calcutta Botanical Garden and previously as the Royal Botanic Garden, Calcutta

The Trip started with the visit at the magnificent Great Banyan tree section. students recorded and visited the enormous collections of orchids, bamboos, palms, and plants of the screw pine genus (*Pandanus*). The garden has a rare variety of water lily (Scientific name *Victoria amazonica*). Its leaves are so large and robust that it is said that a leaf can hold an infant.

After visiting the garden almost entirely, we finally entered the Central National Herbarium, where students were introduced to the history of BOTANICAL GARDENS and various information regarding the Herbarium.

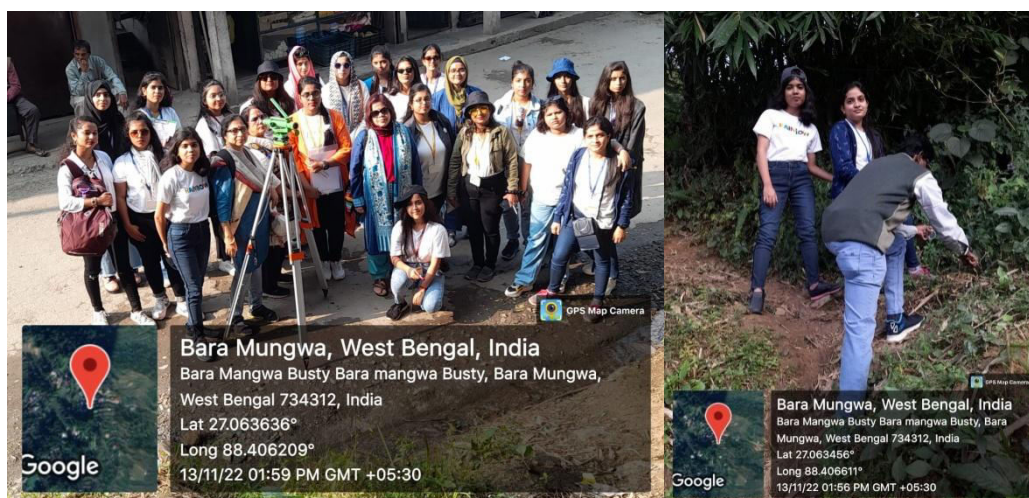
As a whole this trip was a great success.

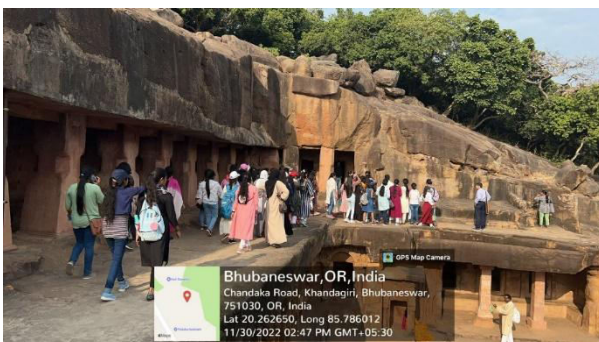

Department of History (Day & Morning) arranged a study tour with students of 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> semester both honours and general to Bhubaneswar and Puri from 28/11/22 to 02/12/22. Nine faculty members along with 77 students began their journey from Shalimar station at 7.15pm on 28/11/22. The study programme began next day i.e., 30/11/22. Students and teachers visited places like Dhauli, Lingaraj Temple, Khandagiri and Konark temple. At Khandagiri students saw the famous 'Hatigumpha inscription' of Kalinga ruler Kharavela. Students also watched 'Light & Sound' at Konark temple. They gathered firsthand experience of the stupa and temple architecture. Tour ended in the morning of 02/12/22 at Shalimar station.





## **7) Industrial visit to a Microbrewery on 30.11.2022, Department of Botany**

As a part of the curriculum, Fifth semester Botany Honours students(18 in total) of Victoria Institution (College) visited a brewery , The Brewhive( microbrewery) to understand the fermenter structure and construction & beer manufacturing process under the guidance of Smt. Sharmistha Basu,Smt. Aditi Dey and Smt. Payel Chatterjee, on 30/11/2022 at about 2:00 p.m. Laboratory assistant Shri Hrishikesh Choudhury also accompanied the trip. Microbrewery is a small company that makes beer, usually using traditional methods, and often has a restaurant where its beer is served. The purpose of the tour was to help the students learn the process of brewing production and to understand the fermenter design and various other downstream processings. Field visit was arranged by Smt. Aditi Dey and Smt. Sharmistha Basu (Assistant professor , Botany at Victoria Institution College ) in collaboration with Mr. Amitava Chandra General Manager ,The Brewhive(A unit of Vasudhaa Hospitality) PS Srijan Corporate Park | Tower -1, Retail -3 | Kolkata-700091).



Mr. Rahul Roy(Assistant Brewer) explained the entire brewing process. Beer-making process was explained to the students in detail. Steeping process, which includes soaking of barley and making it into green malt, Kilning that is roasting of barley to get desired colour for beer, Mashing is done by crushing the barley and adding hot water into it to extract the starch from it, Leutering is done to add hops which gives flavour and bitterness to beer and then boiling, whirl pooling, cooling it to start the fermentation process with the help of yeast and maturation after that. Filtration is done to clarify

impurities formed during fermentation. Bottling is not done at Brewhive. The students explored the production area, brewing process as well as the quality control stage. It seems that the beer production process is closed, automatic process with modern technology. Students after the tour were very happy and said that the visit was informative and knowledgeable. Mr. Rahul Roy and other brewery staff also appreciated the efforts of Victoria Institution (College) for encouraging students to participate in such educational visits. We can consider that the trip really gave the students practical experience with the meaningful about modern production processes and the community activities of The Brewhive to society





**8) Local excursion to Duttapukur, Dept. of Botany**  
**30.11.2022**

On 30/11/2022, Department of Botany organised one whole day local excursion to Duttapukur with the students of semester 3(H), Botany. About 17 students participated in the field trip and they were accompanied by Dr Sudip Kumar Sinha and Dr Rajendra Yonzone along with Laboratory assistant Shri Sanjay Seal.

The main objective of the excursion was to familiarise the students with the local flora and its distributional patterns. Students collected various plant specimens under the guidance of the teachers and recorded the field data for later analysis. 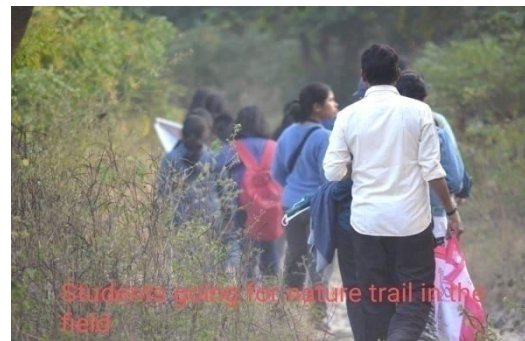

Manas National Park, Assam had been declared as UNESCO World Heritage Site because of its recognition as Biosphere Reserve in North-eastern Parts of India. This park is popular for richness in wildlife including tigers, leopards, elephants, rhinos as well as important bird area. Manas harbours the maximum number of endangered species from India as listed in the IUCN Red Book. Keeping these points of interest, the site was selected for exploration by the students of Zoology Honours.

The students gathered practical knowledge about poultry farming. They learned about the techniques of handling the birds, housing and feeding them.

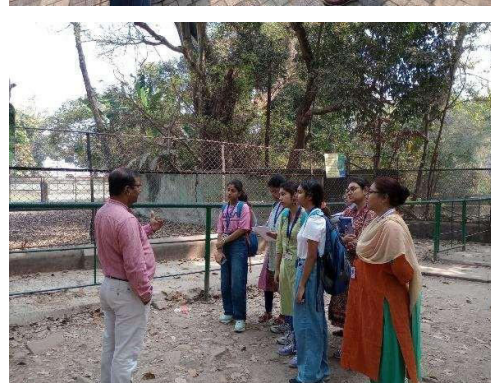




## **12) Study Tour at Alipore Zoological Garden, Kolkata on : 27.02.2023**

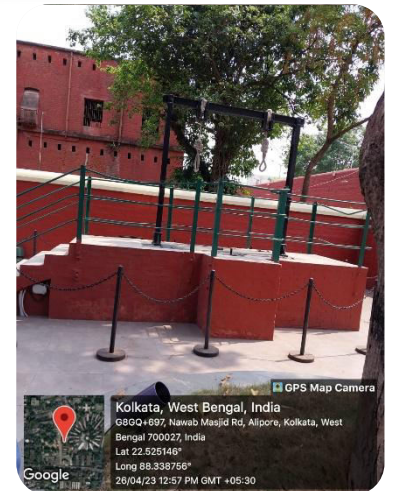

**16) Visit to Alipore Jail Museum, Dept. of History on 26.04.2023**

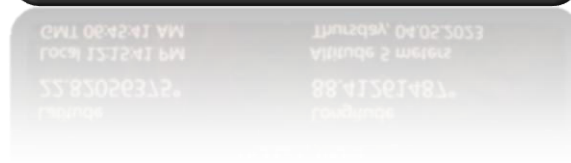

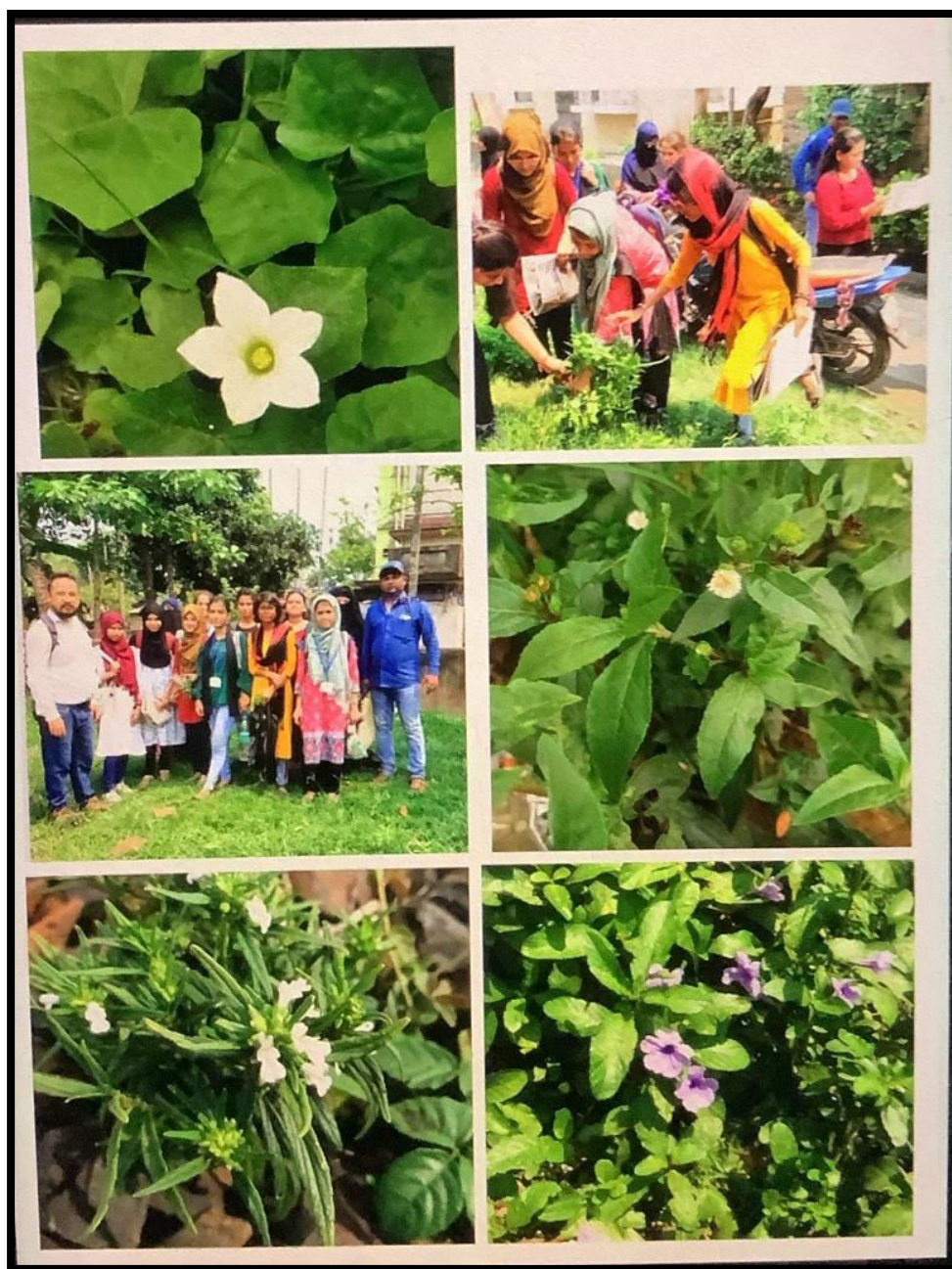

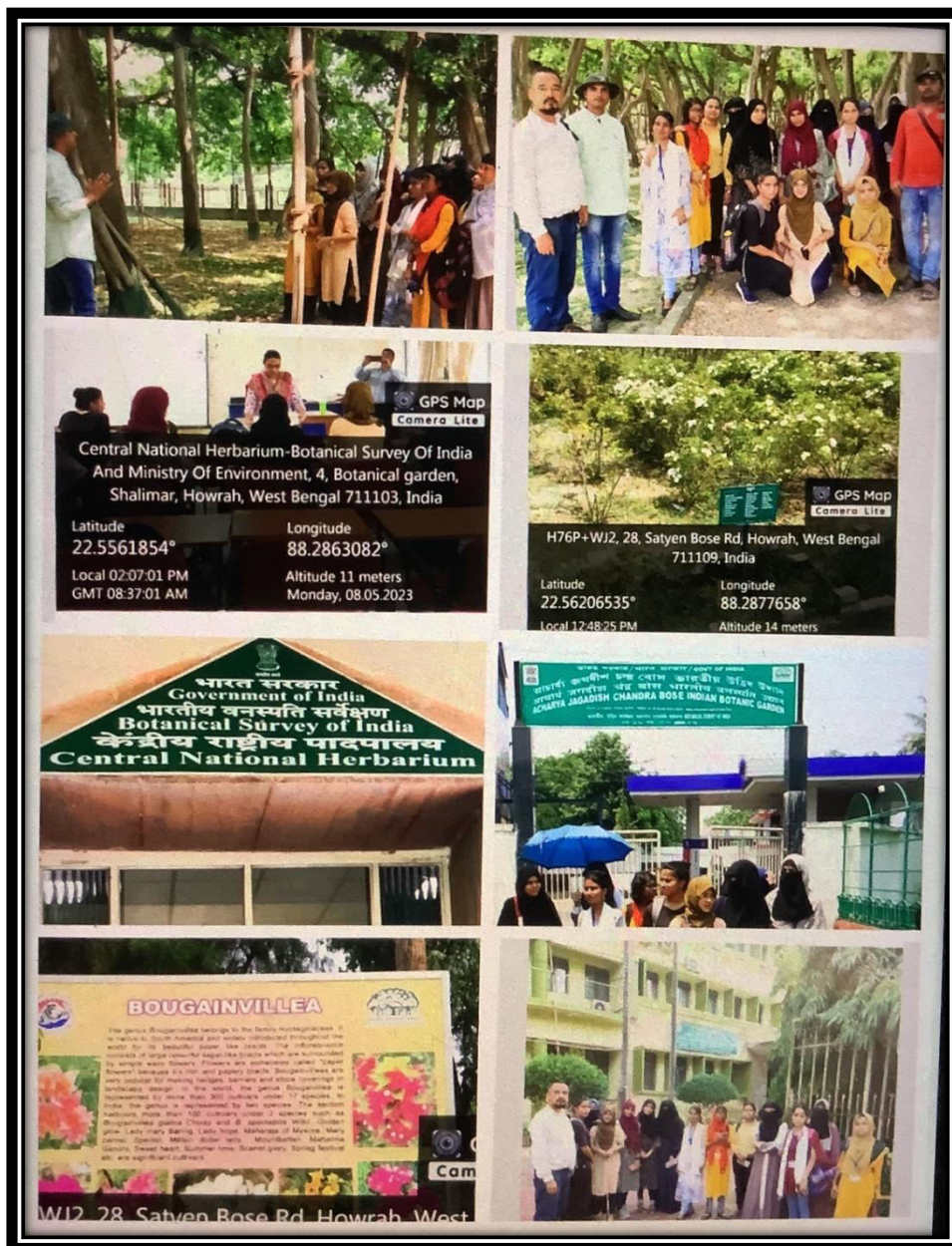
**18) Local excursion to Duttapukur, Dept. of Botany on 06.05.2023**

Every year in Victoria Institution (College), all the students of Semester 2 Honours and General courses are engaged in the an environmental studies project work as per the Calcutta University CBCS syllabus of AECC-2 compulsory paper, ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES.

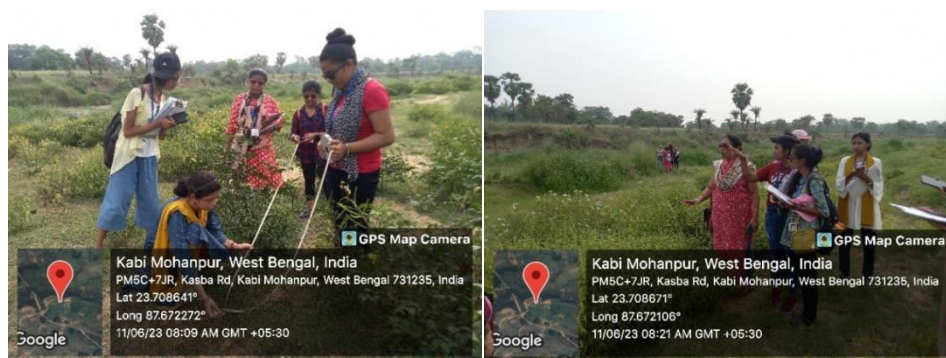

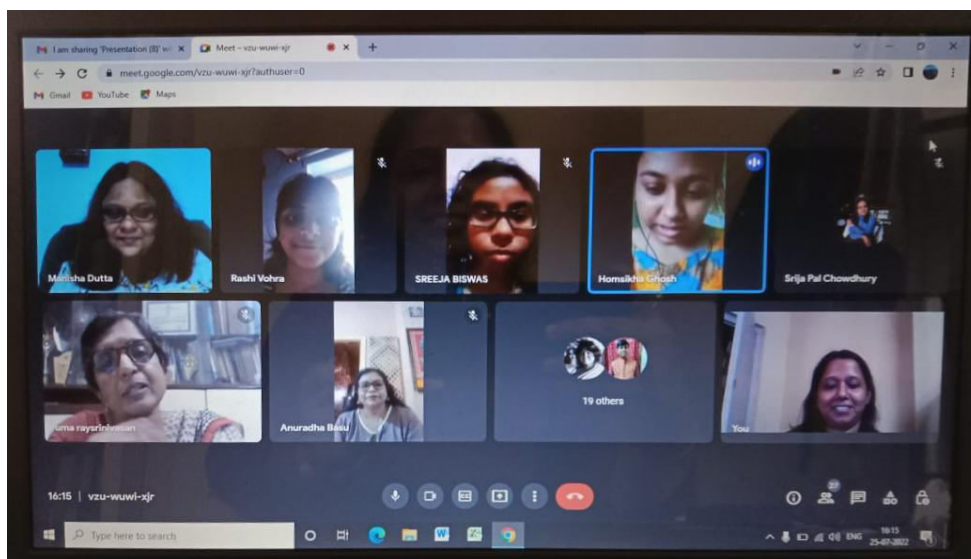

**6) Parent- Teacher Meet on 27.09.2022, Dept. of Mathematics**

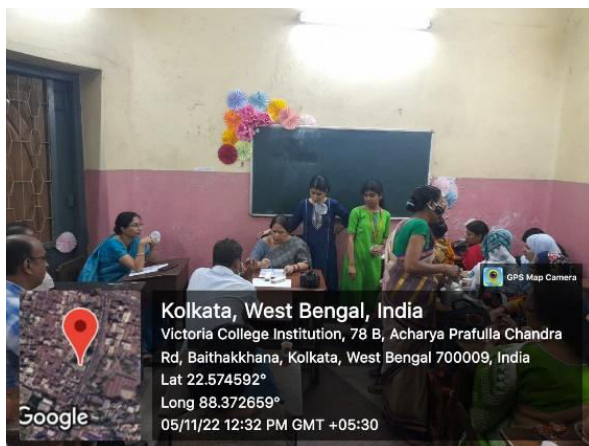

## 7) Parent-Teacher Meeting, Dept. of Geography

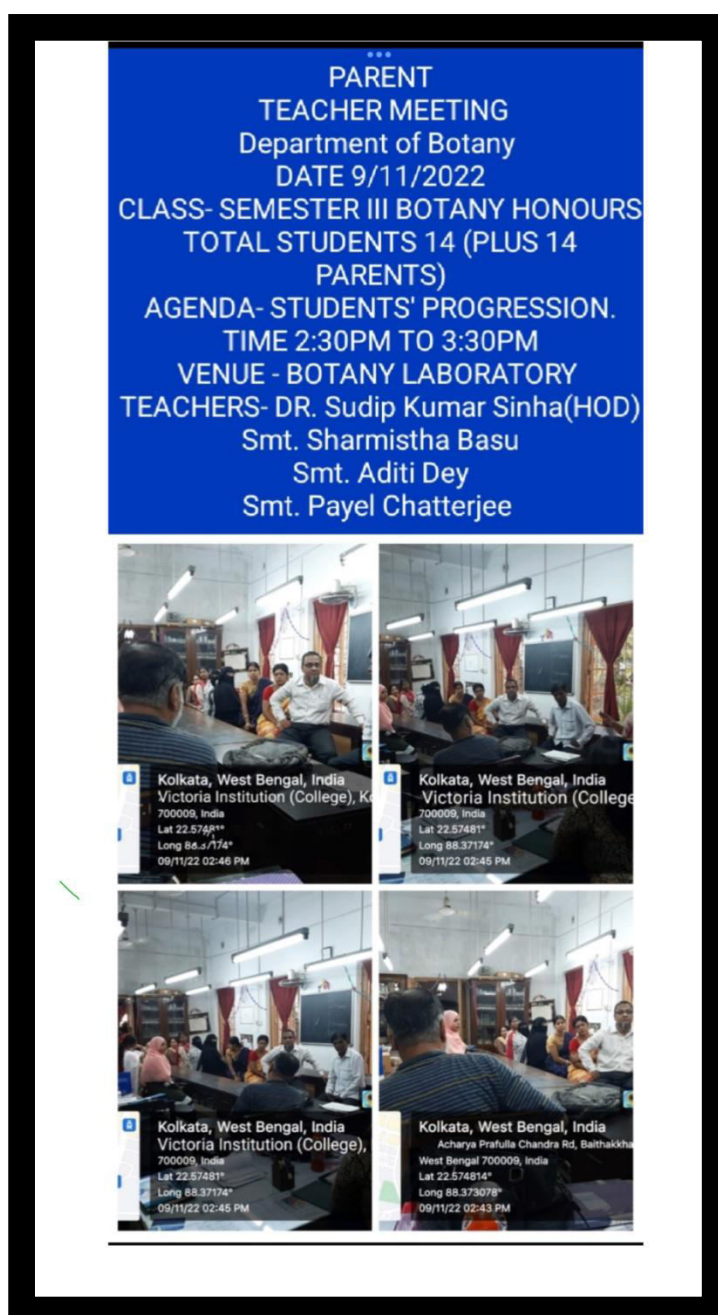
### Semester 5 Honours (5<sup>th</sup> November 2022)

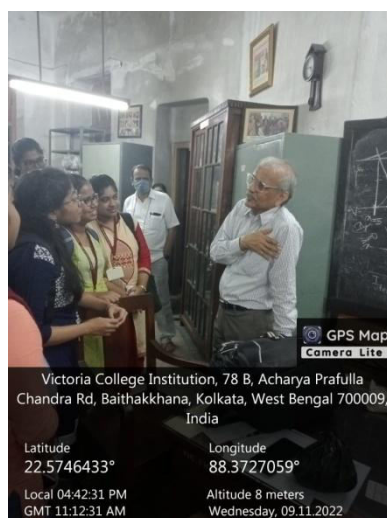
**9) Report on International Seminar on “From the Atomic nucleus to the Stars” organized by Department of Physics, in collaboration with IQAC on 09.11.2022**

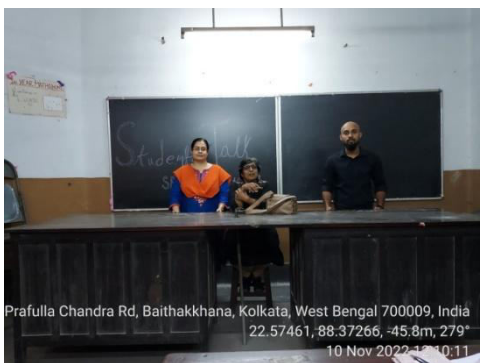

## 12) Report on Series of Students' Seminar, Dept. of Physics

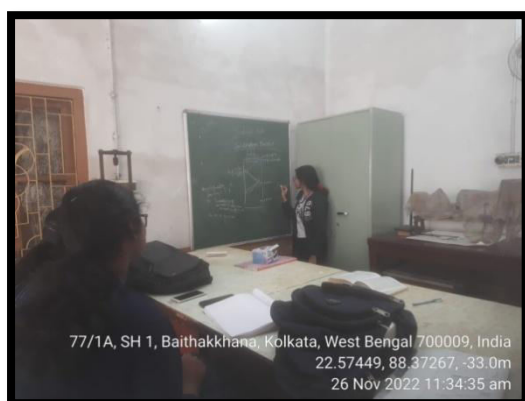

### 16) Parent – Teacher Meeting, Dept. of Urdu, 22.11.2022 and 29.11.2022

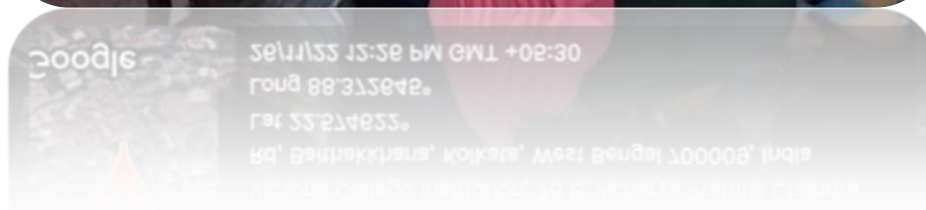

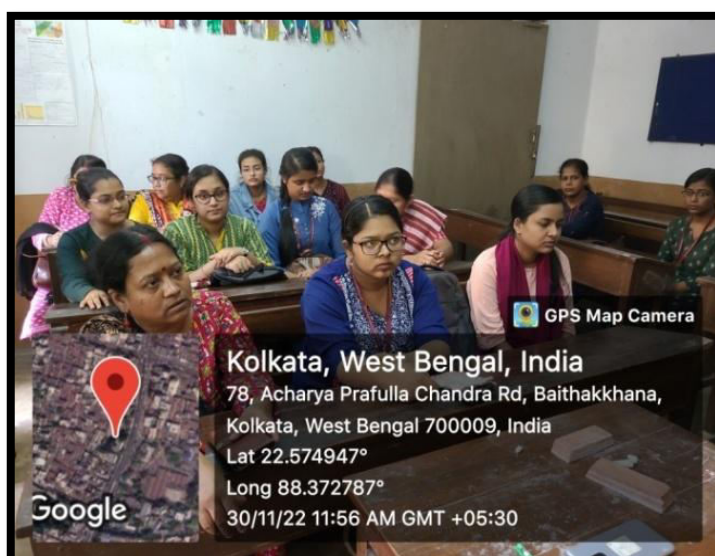
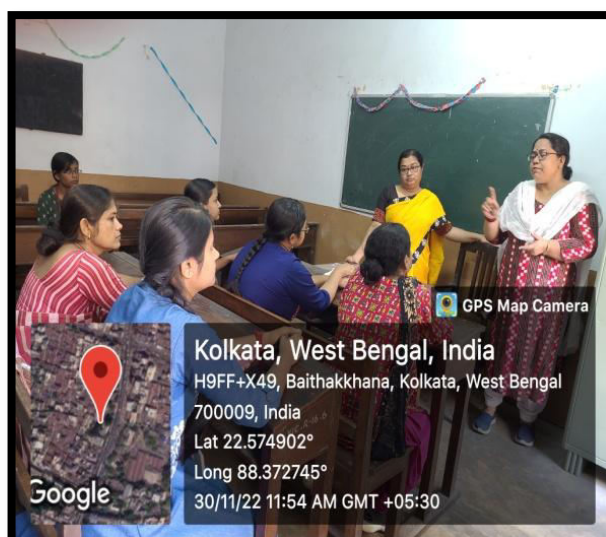
**17) Parent-Teacher Meeting, Dept. of Geography**

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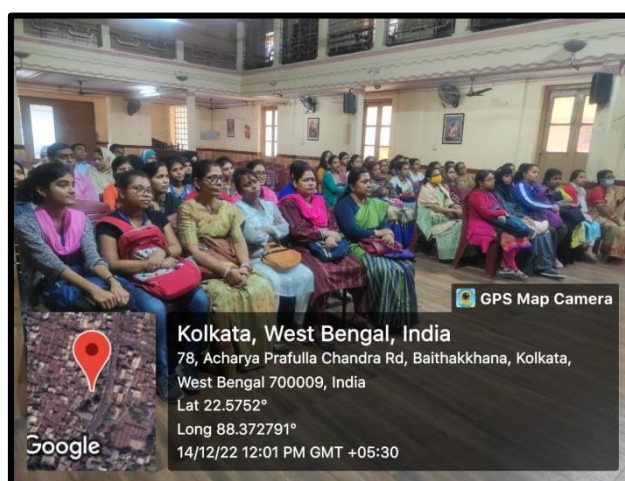
**24) Parent-Teacher Meet on 13.12.2022, Dept. of Mathematics**

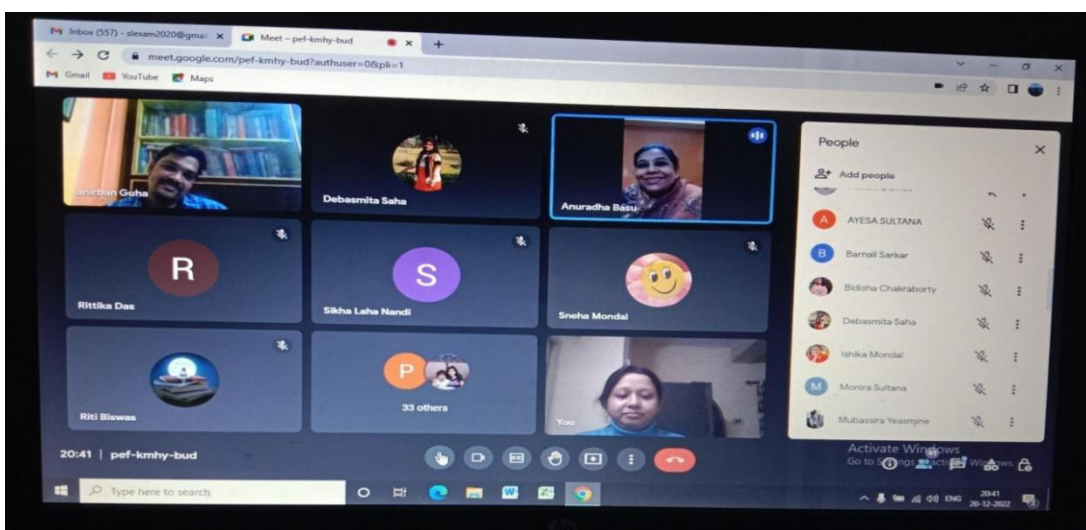




**29) (Online) Extension Lecture on Tintin in Tibet organised by the Department of English in collaboration with IQAC**

Anselm began with the concept of God as that than which nothing greater could be conceived. To think of such a being as existing only in thought and not also in reality involves a conversation, since a being that lacks real existence is not a being than which none greater can be conceived. A yet greater being would be one with the further attribute of existence. Thus the unsurpassably perfect being must exist; otherwise it would not be unsurpassably perfect. This is among the most discussed and contested arguments in the history of thought.

Our Speaker's delivery was mesmerizing. Her study is in - depth, and that was reflected in her speech. The auditorium was full with our students, and they were engrossed in the lecture. At the end of the lecture there was an interactive question answer session like an icing on the cake.

With a modest budget we could offer her a flower bouquet, a cloth folder and some sweets. Some refreshments was arranged for the students as well.

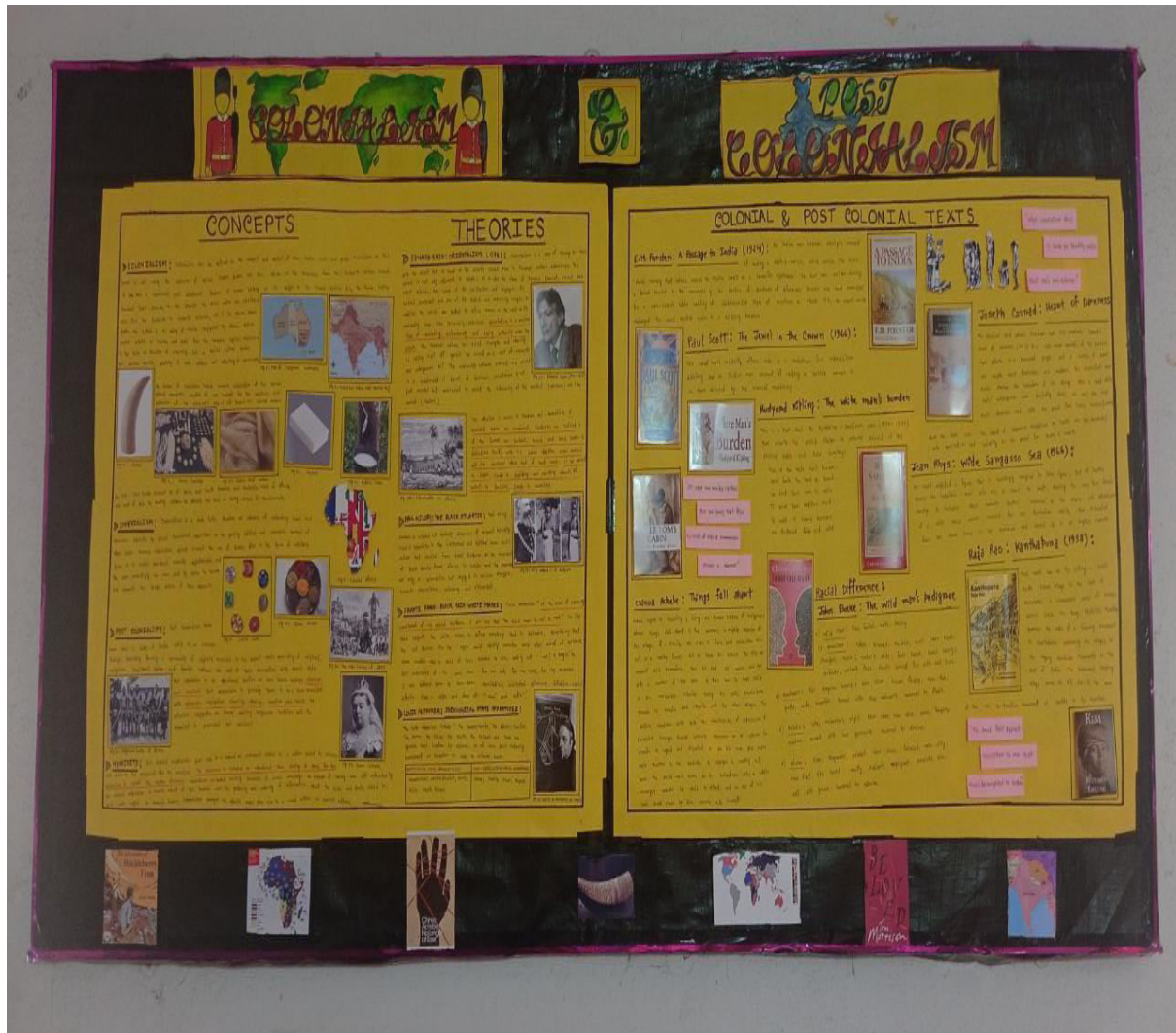

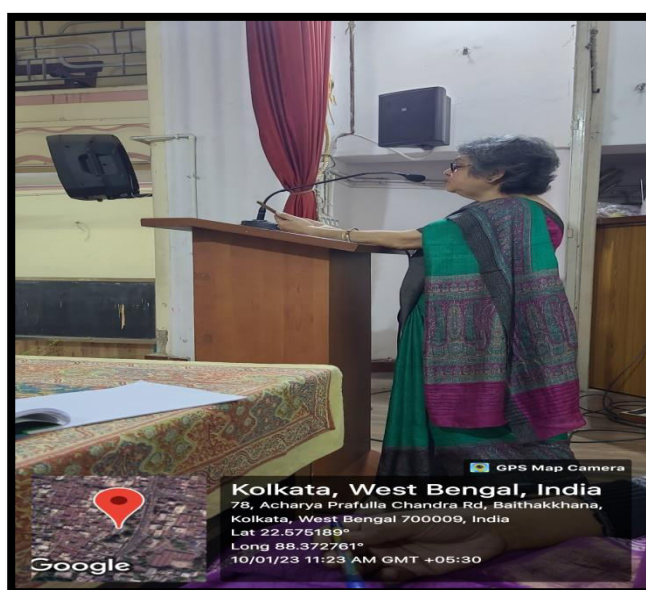


**36) Talk Series On Impact Of Covid 19 On Woman: The Final Lecture**

The Nyaya Darsana is one of the six orthodox Hindu Schools of Philosophy. It is highlighted as essentially being a school of logical thought, debate and reasoning. The word 'Nyaya' itself may be translated as 'right' or 'justice' and therefore its practice, Nyaya - Sastra translates as "The science of right judgment".

The Nyaya Sastras propose sixteen categories ( padarthas) which are meant to represent all that can and does exist. These sixteen categories are pramana. Prameya, samasya, prayojana, drstanta, siddhanta, avayava, tarka, nirnaya, vada, Jalpa, bitanda, hetvabhasa, chal, jati, nigrahasthana. This extensive list has, however, been reduced by subsequent commentators on the Nyaya- Sutras to only include the first two categories , pramana and prameya; as pramana pertains to the observer while prameya pertains to that which is observed. Therefore, the investigation of pramana and prameya forms the foundation of the classical Nyaya Darsana.

Professor Ghoshal gave a lucid account of the otherwise difficult topic. The students were very much attentive and listened carefully to his deliberation which was evident in the subsequent interactive question and answer session.

The remuneration is quoted by the Council. Other than that, we offered him a bouquet of flowers, some sweets and a nice folder.

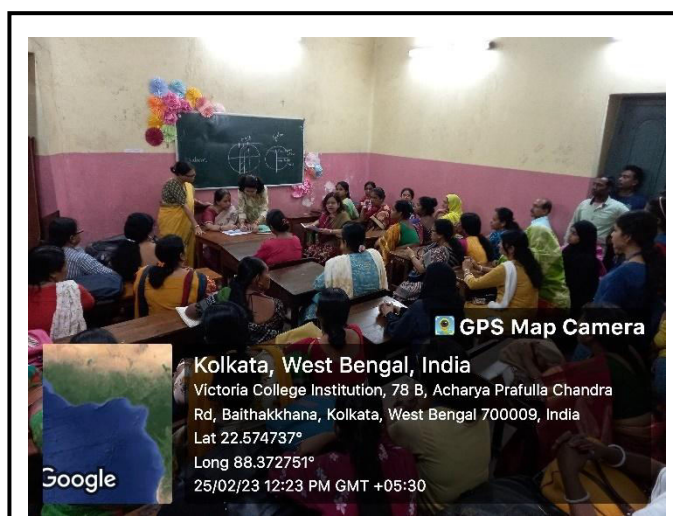
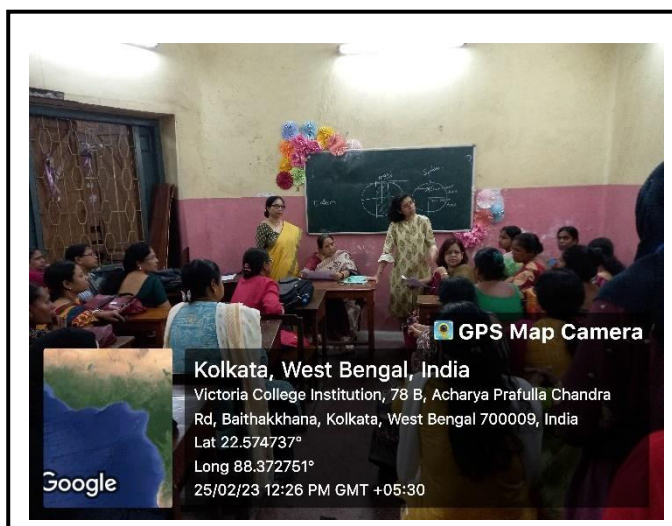
Some refreshment was arranged for the students as well from our college canteen.

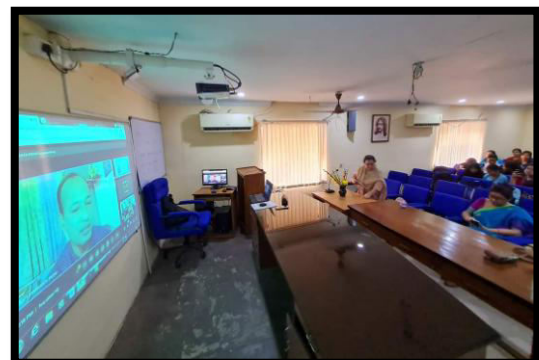
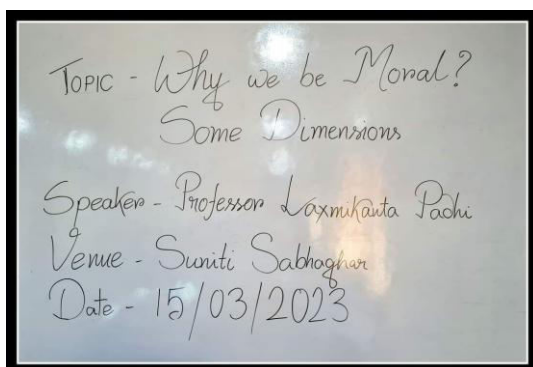

Justifying why one should behave morally is a surprisingly difficult task. Proposed justifications are found throughout the history of moral Philosophy, but these reasons to be moral remain controversial. The fundamental question -- "Why be moral?" -- still seems in need of a satisfactory answer.

The question can take other forms. Why should I care about morality? Why do moral considerations have normative force? Why are the demands of morality obligatory? However, no matter how it is phrased, it always addresses the foundation of morality -- Why we believe moral considerations should influence how we ought to act. As the demands of morality become more burdensome the question becomes more relevant.

However, our resource person could do justice to the topic. He produced an extensive and thoughtful lecture. Students were highly satisfied. A question answer session followed.

We sent his honorarium through Google Pay. A modest refreshment was arranged for the students.

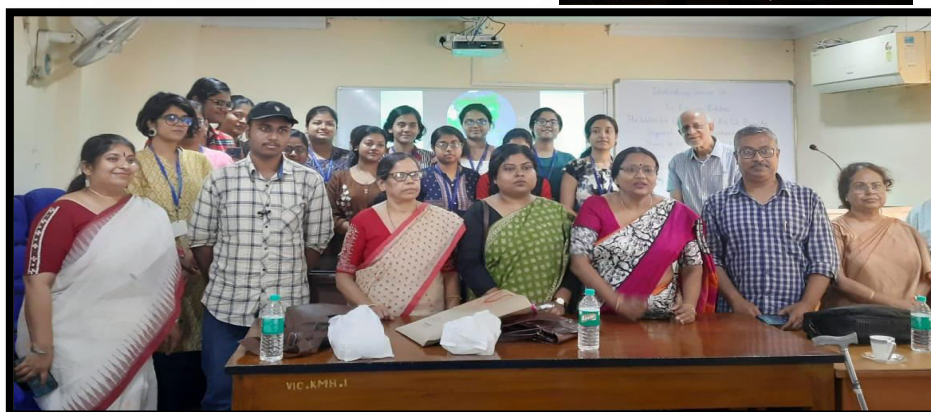
#### Department of Physics in collaboration with IQAC, VIC and IAPT, RC 15 on 24.03.2023

In one way or other notions of logical or Analytic Truth have played an important role in logic, and hence in philosophy.

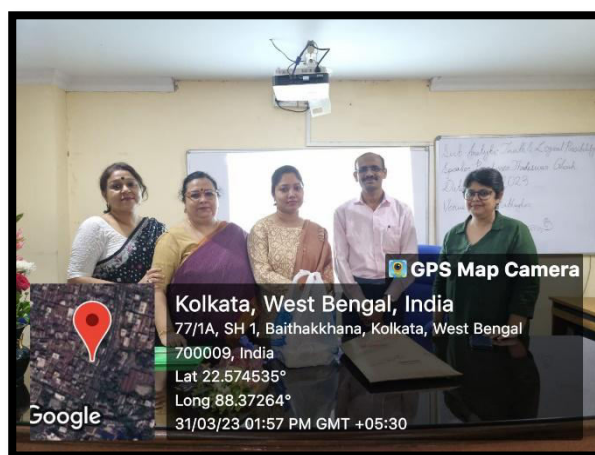
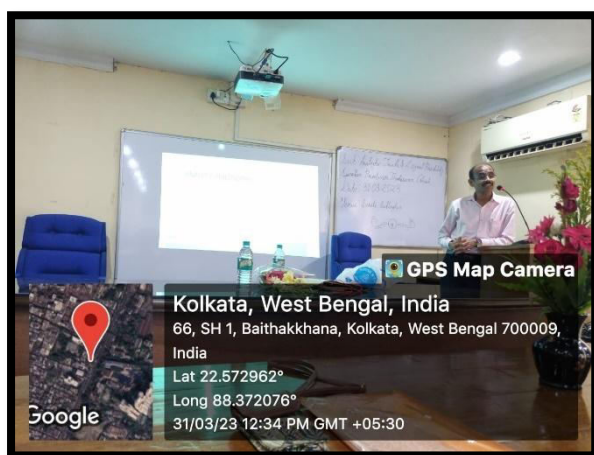

A synthetic Truth is then described as one which depends for its Truth fundamentally upon matters of fact. Another way of stating this is that Analytic Truths are true in "all possible world". (Leibnitz).

Possibility, in logic and metaphysics, implies the absence of contradiction. Possible things or states of affairs are simply those whose conception involves no contradiction. To determine the empirical Possibility of a thing, it must be ascertained whether the nature of a thing in question conforms to the conditions of actual experience. Some philosophers hold that the actual world together with the infinite number of possible but nonactual worlds constitutes the realm of "possible worlds".

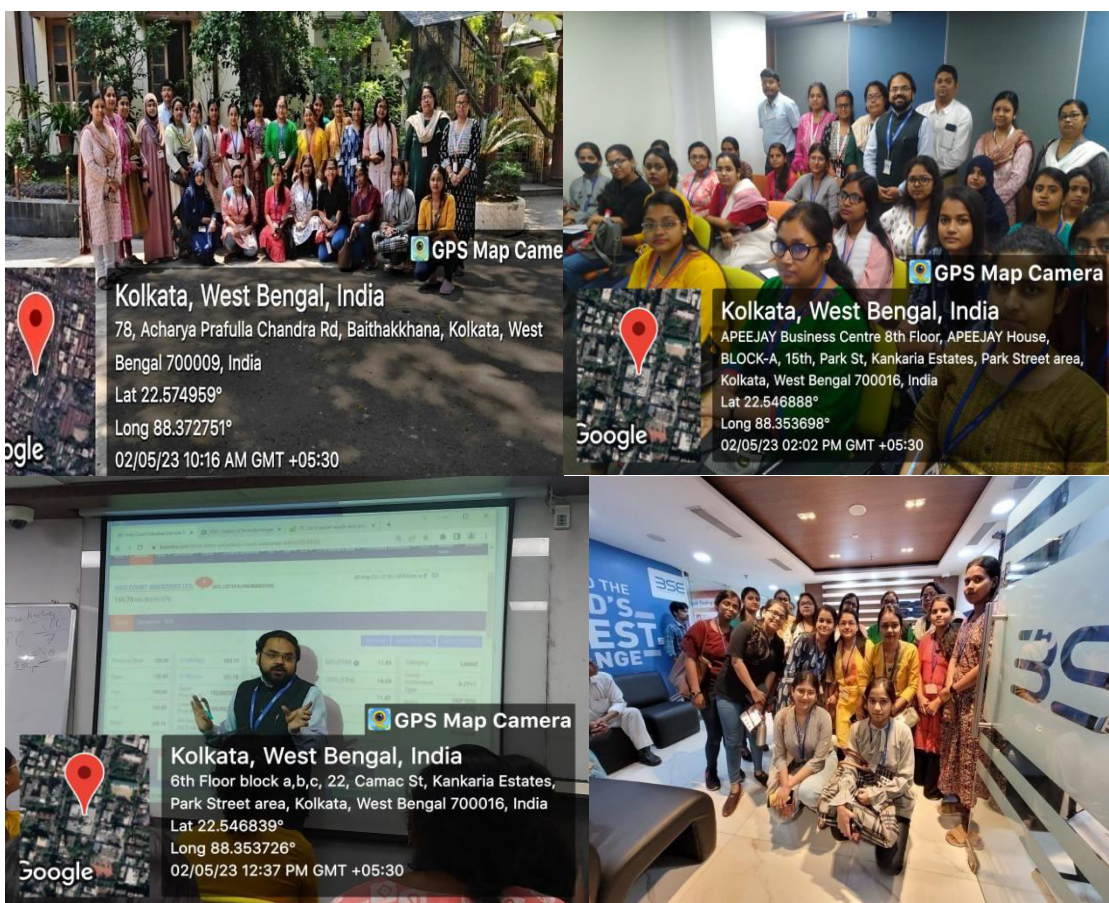


### 50) Visit to the Bombay Stock Exchange

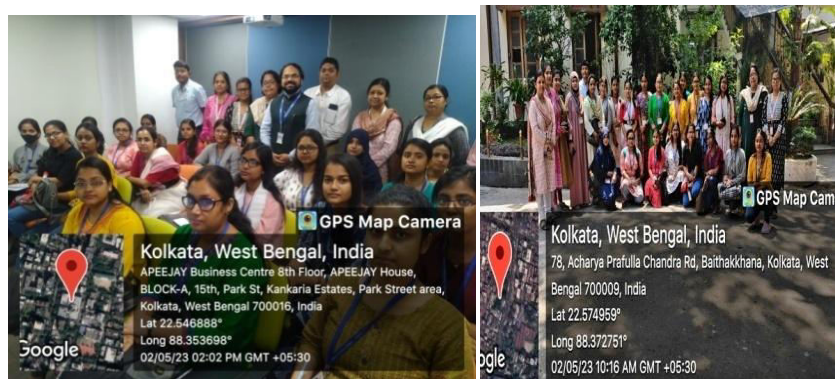
### 51) Visit To Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE), Kolkata

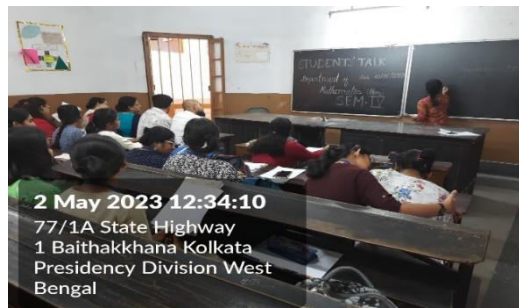

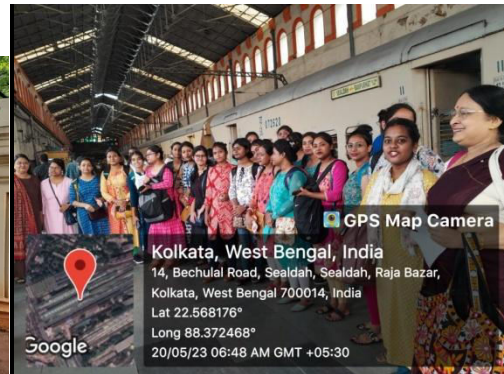




### **58) Excursion at Santiniketan conducted by Department of Bengali**

## **60) Publication of E-Magazine, FIZIKA**

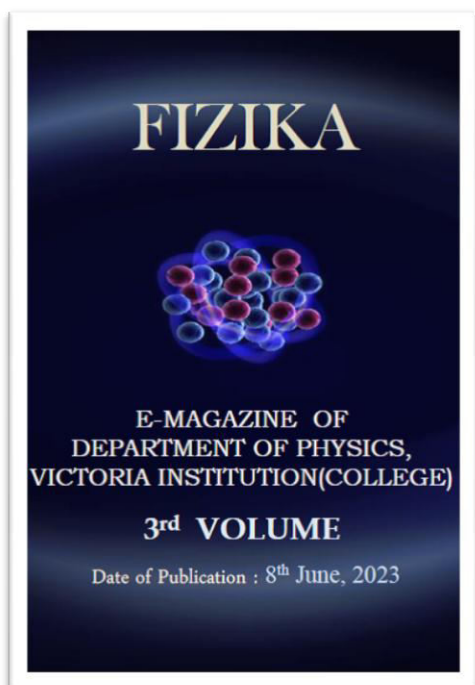
**Department of Physics , 08.06.2023**

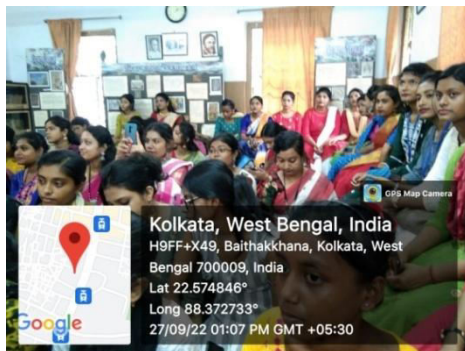




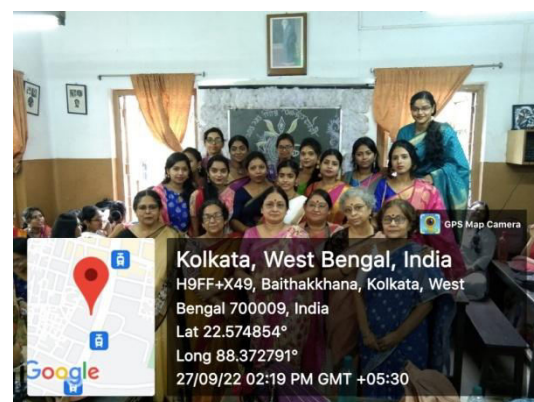
### 6) Farewell and Sharadiya Programme, Dept. of Bengali, 29.09.2022

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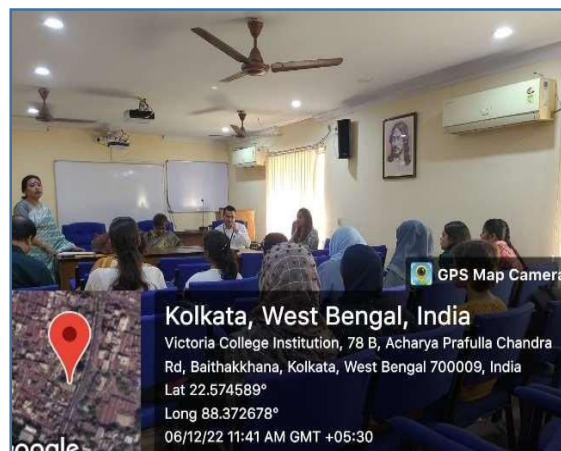
### 7) Fresher's Welcome on 24.11.2022, Dept. of Mathematics

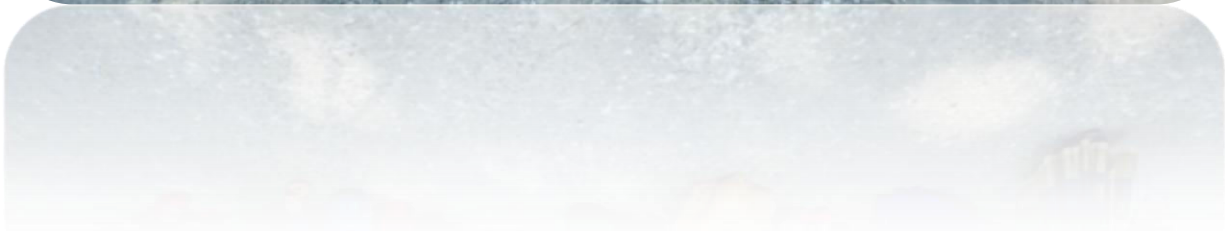

### 10) Annual Sports (2022-2023)

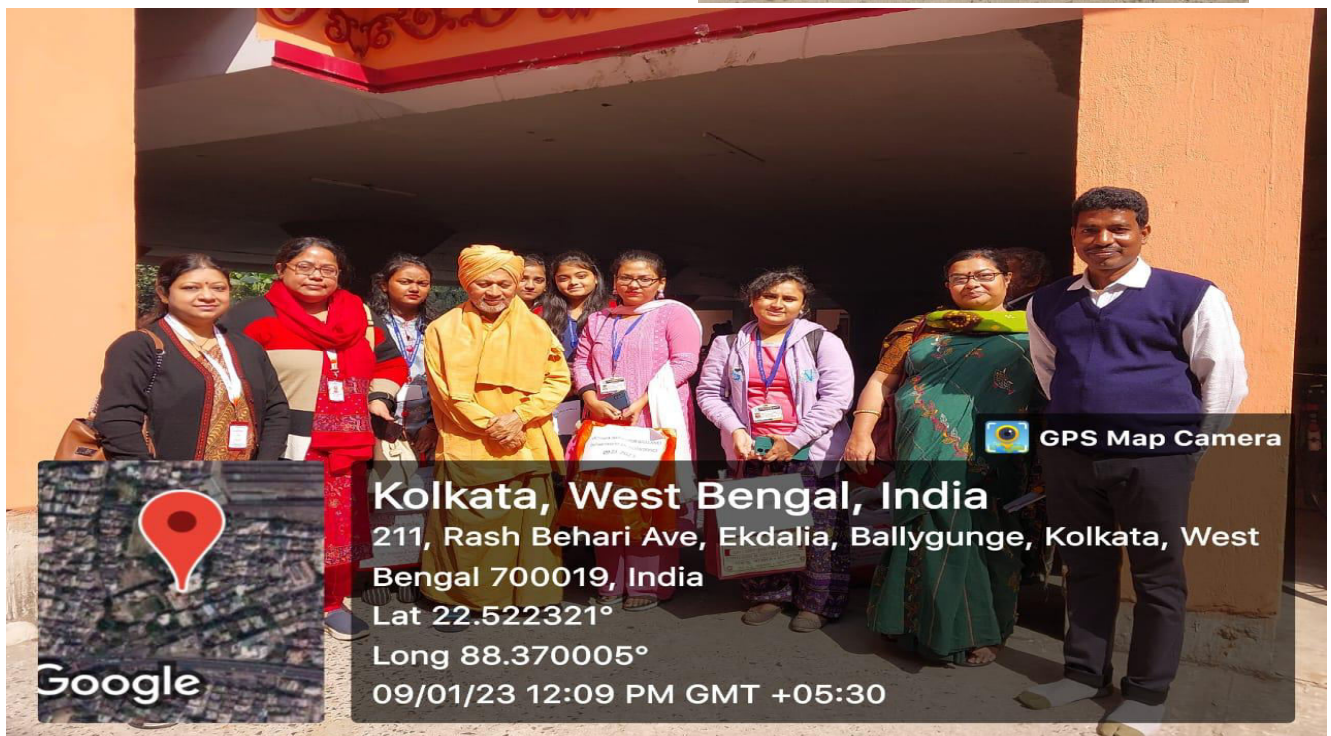

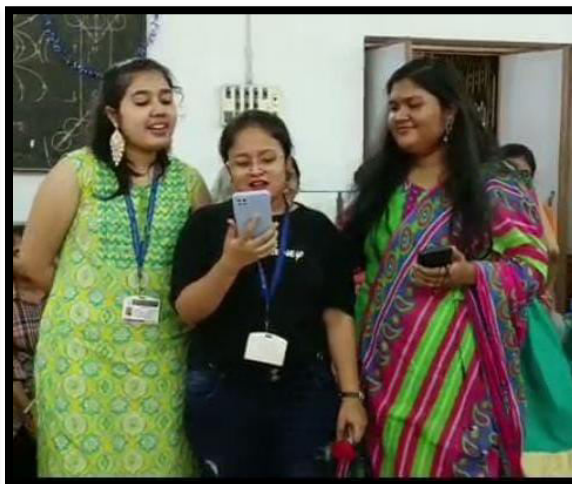

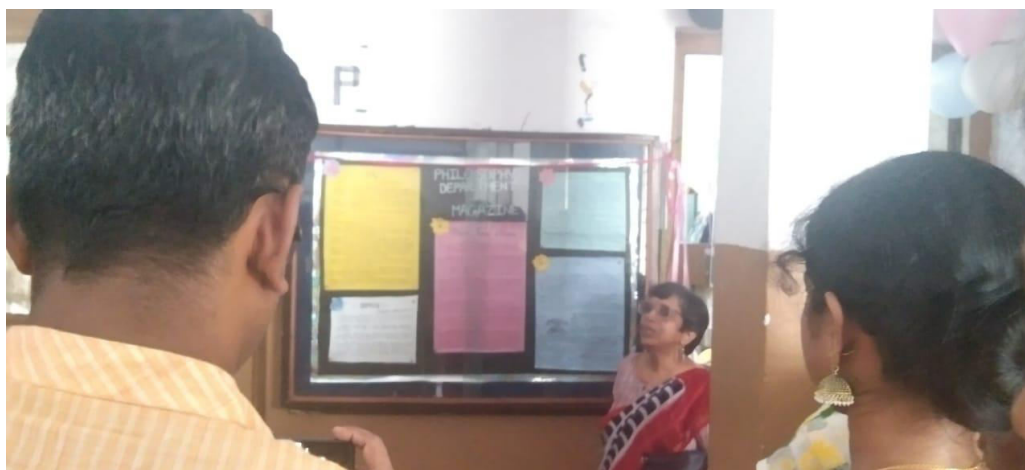


## **7) Inauguration of Departmental Wall Magazine and Observation of Teacher's Day.**

### **Victoria Institution (College) on 19.11.2022**

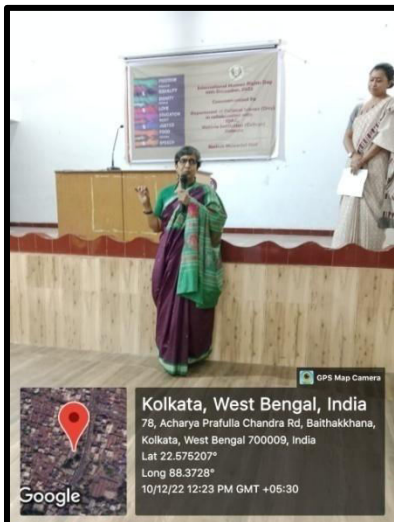

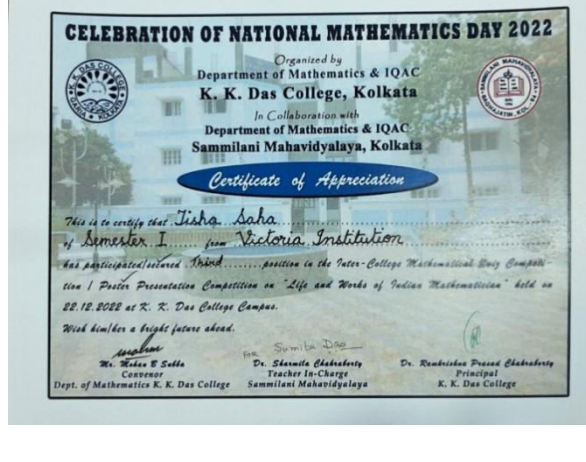
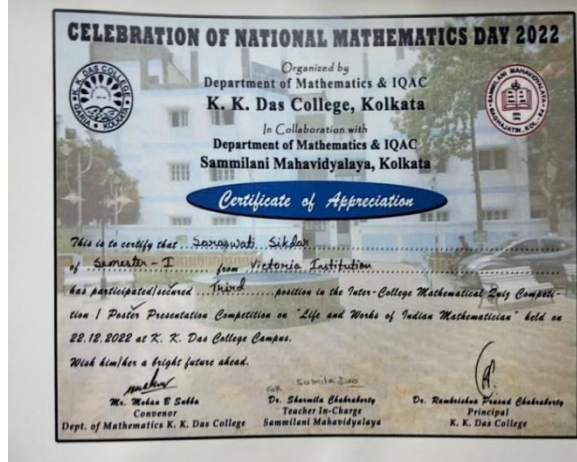
**11) Commemoration of International Human Rights Day, December 10<sup>th</sup> 2022**

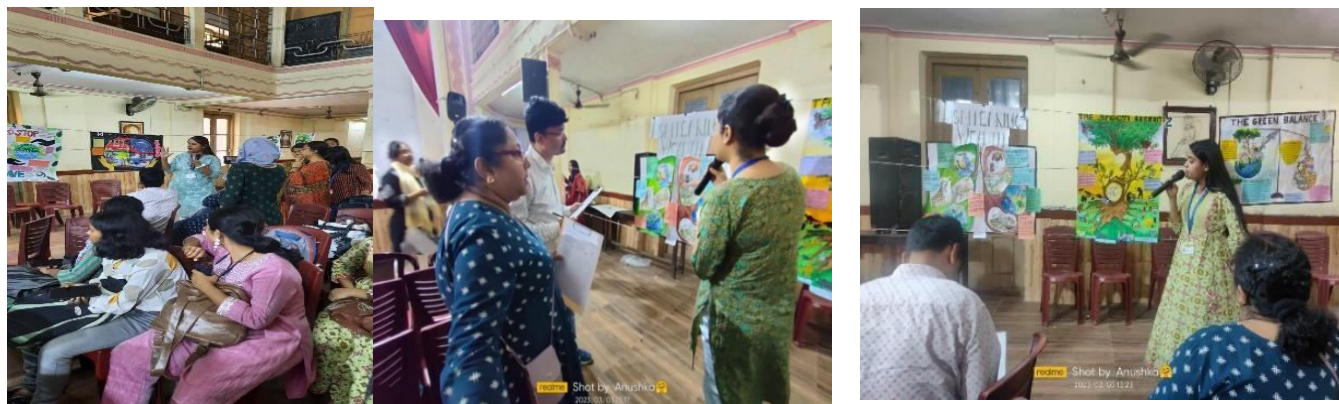

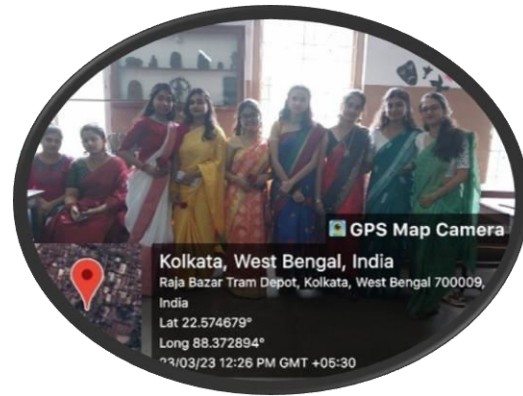

**17) Celebration of International Women’s Day, Dept. of History on 23.03.2023**

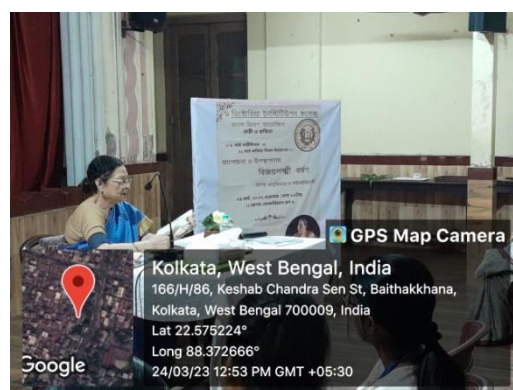
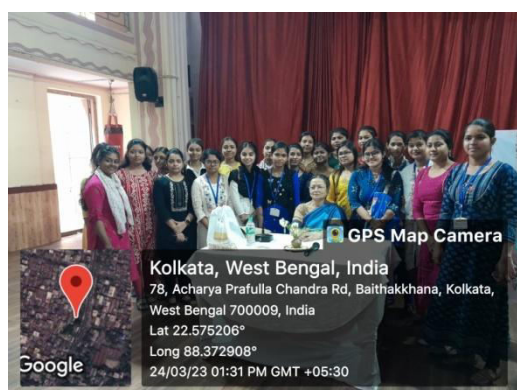

**21) Celebration of Rabindra Jayanti, Dept. of History on 15.05.2023**

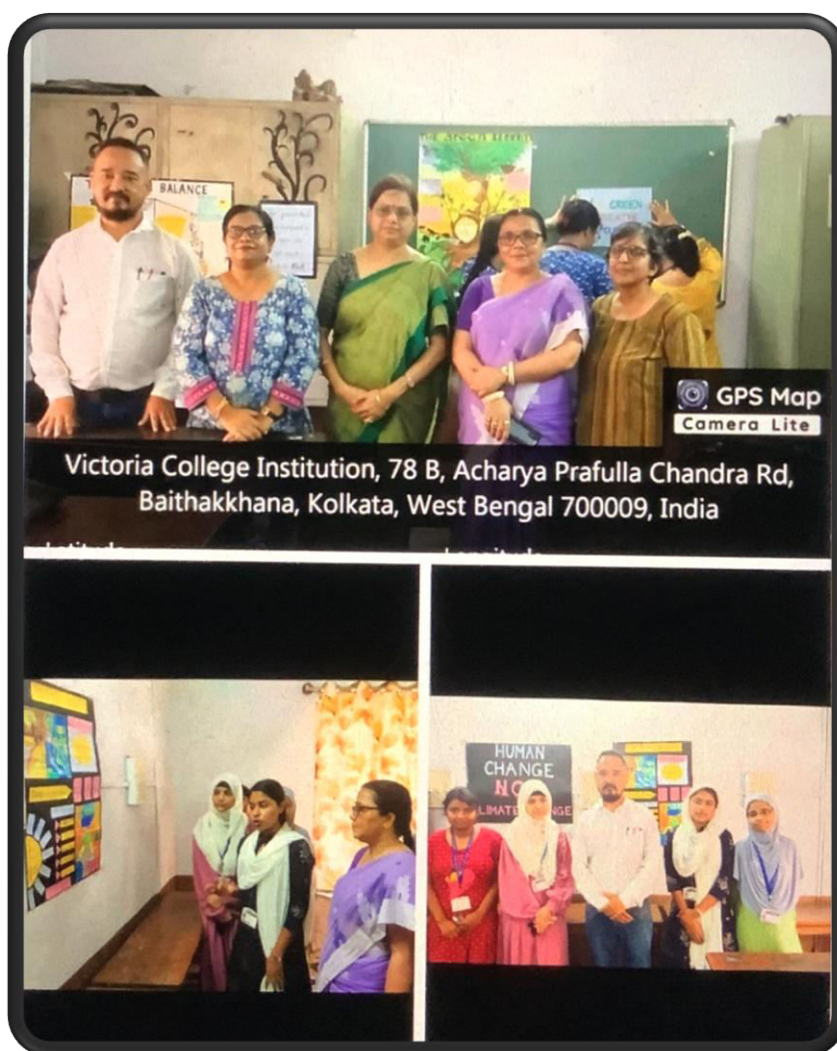

## **2) One day Teachers' Orientation Programme on Communication with Students to promote their Psycho-social well-being organised by IQAC, dated 24.08.2022**

A One day Teachers' Orientation Programme on Communication with Students to promote their Psycho-social well-being was organised by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell of Victoria Institution (College) on 24.08.2022, for the teaching faculty. The main objective of the programme was to build a conceptual understanding of what constitutes Psycho-social well-being of the young learners, as they enter the academic arena; and to promote teachers' awareness of the same, to ensure the overall well-being of our wards. Besides, the programme also intended to guide and brief the teachers about the upcoming Mentor-Mentee project. The faculty of the Psychology Department acted as the resource person for the said event, with a well-illustrated PowerPoint presentation they explained and informed the teachers regarding the various factors that affect the Psycho-social well-being of an adolescent, and how through the upcoming Mentor-Mentee programme we can interact with our students to identify their problems (if any), and to help them out in the best possible manner, create a conducive environment for effective teaching and learning and of course promote a healthy, dynamic teacher-student relationship. The session went on to become quite interactive as the teacher-participants came up with their many queries and opinions on the issue. The event proved to be truly productive and useful.



### **3) Mentor-Mentee Programme (Sep 2022 onwards ) by IQAC**

To ensure a continuous and systematic mentoring of students for academic, social , personal and career related guidance, Victoria Institution College has instituted a special Mentor-Mentee programme from 6<sup>th</sup> September 2022, to be conducted on a regular basis for all the semesters. A separate committee, supervised by the IQAC is in charge of scheduling and formulating the basics of the mentoring sessions. All the faculty members have been engaged in this mentoring process. Every Mentor is assigned with a group comprising of 30-35 students ( from the same department).

The main objective of the program is to promote the Psycho-social well-being of the students - help them maintain a balance between their physical and emotional health, encourage and update them about academic and extracurricular activities to enable them to tackle challenges in the academic field and beyond. The programme also aims to identify problems (if any), and as per situation contact guardians, even consult the college psychologist in special cases to take necessary actions.

So far 5 mentoring sessions have been conducted, during which the mentors have tried to record and assess the background, potentials, skills, weaknesses, social and personal experiences of their mentees through one to one interaction as well as group discussions. Feedbacks received from the Mentors are also quite favourable, as some of the students have voluntarily opened up to their respective Mentors and shared their personal problems, seeking advice. Besides, some of the Mentors have been able to identify special skills and hidden talents of their mentees. The rapport established between the Mentors and the Mentees, resulting from these sessions is also quite commendable.

After completion of each session the Committee in charge is to submit a brief report to IQAC to suggest necessary actions.

#### 4) ORIENTATION PROGRAMME 2022

##### For Welcoming SEMESTER-I STUDENTS, 19.09.2022

Beside regular academic courses the college offers two add-on courses: Shotokan Karate-Do Class and Computer Literacy Training course. The coordinators of the courses described briefly about the advantages and importance of both the courses.

The programme officers were present to motivate the students in joining the NSS and NCC units by highlighting the necessity of being a social worker and responsible citizen of the country apart from obtaining the academic degree.

The upcoming course related to Photography was also mentioned by the course coordinator and he informed

### 5) INDUCTION PROGRAMME 2022 for SEMESTER-I Students, 20.09.2022

The Counseling Cell of Victoria Institution (College) organised an induction programme for the students of Semester-I on 20<sup>th</sup> September, 2022 at the Keshub Memorial Hall from 10 am onwards.

All the members of the counseling cell were present in the program along with the faculty members (advisors of the cell) from the Psychology department and some non-teaching staff who are also the members of the cell. The program was started with a welcome address given by Dr. Paramita Roy Biswas from Dept of Economics followed by a lucid and interesting presentation by the convenor of the cell, Dr. Debjani Das Ghosh from Dept of Zoology. The presentation highlighted different activities carried out by the college throughout the year beside the regular academic pursuits. The objective is to offer the students a holistic learning environment.

The faculty members from the Dept of Psychology addressed the students with the theme Familiarization: wellbeing of the students. They also presented attractive slides and explained the challenges and attractions in entering higher education after completing school education.



The last session of the programme was enriched through a motivational talk delivered by Smt. Aloka Mukhopadhyay from Dept of Geography. Being a longtime NSS coordinator, she encouraged the students in participating community life, social works. A very brief psychological counselling was there for each student. Almost 520 students participated and enjoyed the programme thoroughly. The whole programme was scheduled in different slots for ease of conduction and all the members of the cell along with the designated Non teaching staff conducted the programme efficiently.



### **6) Workshop on Domestic Violence and Mental Health by the West Bengal Commission for Women, organised by IQAC, dated 8.12. 2022**

A Workshop on Domestic Violence and Mental Health was conducted by the West Bengal Commission for Women in collaboration with IQAC, Victoria Institution (College) on 8<sup>th</sup> of December 2022, to sensitize students regarding gender related issues. The esteemed Chairperson of the West Bengal Commission for Women, Smt. Leena Gangopadhyay and her team members Dr. Dipanwita Hazari, Smt. Sujata Pakrashi Lahiri, Smt. Debjani Chakraborty spoke on various aspects related to gender discrimination with special emphasis on the grave issue of Domestic Violence and how it is still rampant even within the educated and elite section of the society. Smt. Gangopadhyay cited several cases of domestic abuse handled by her as the Chairperson of WBCW, giving us an insight into the horrid and varied nature of such abuse and malpractices and the current judicial scenario as well. The audience were also made to understand the importance of being self aware , having knowledge of the procedures of filing a complaint , the legal consequences of such matters and the importance and sincerity with which such grievances are handled by the Commission.

The second half of the workshop focused on the issue of Mental health in general and also of the repressed and subjugated lot. This session was conducted by Dr. Subrata Bhattacharya and Dr. Chandan Naskar, assisting members of the WBCW Team. They not only discussed various cases but also encouraged and invited questions/ problems from students sitting in the audience, to help them out with their concerns. The response from the students was indeed overwhelming. The workshop was envisioned as a part of a greater drive to spread gender sensitivity amongst students, to promote awareness and encourage them to raise their voice against any kind of injustice or gender biasness.





### **7) Observance of Students' Week, 2023** **Organized by IOAC, 02.01.2023-07.01.2023**

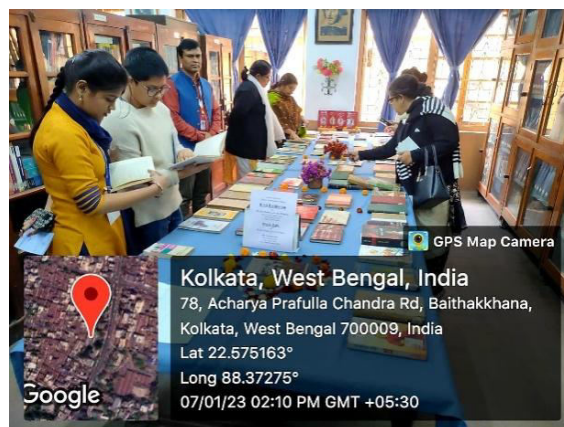
A Poster-Making Competition on Environment was held on 4<sup>th</sup> January in the College Greens.



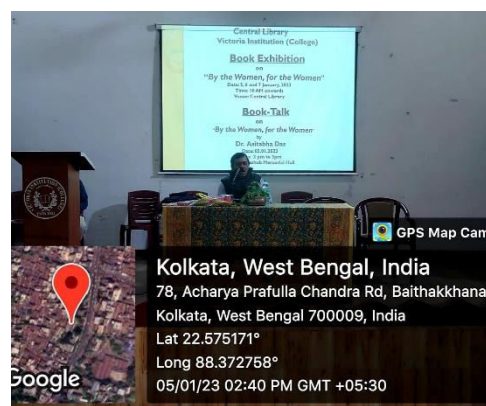
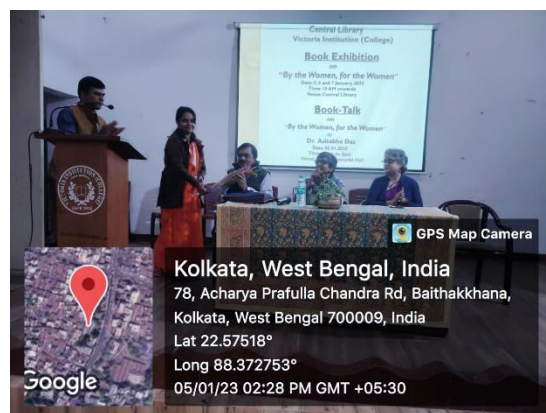

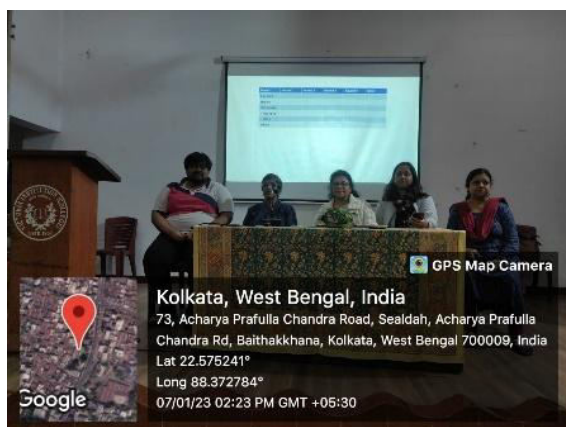

The inaugural address was delivered by Dr. Madhumita Manna, who motivated the audience with her insightful and encouraging words.

The first speaker of the Technical session Prof. Tushar Kanti Ghara, Joint Director of Public Instruction, Education Directorate, Government of West Bengal emphasised on the responsibilities of various stakeholders of higher educational institutions in performing multi-dimensional processes for quality assurance, and the importance of maintaining a Centralized Data Repository. ### **3) Report on ADD-ON COURSE: COMPUTER COURSE, 22.11.22 onwards**

Victoria Institution (College) in collaboration with WEBEL Technology Ltd (Govt. of WB undertaking) conducts a Computer Literacy and Training Program, a Career Oriented Certified Computer Course, for the college students. Two courses are now conducted: 1. Certificate Computer Application Course (CCA) and 2. Diploma in Computer Application Course (DCA). The duration of each course is six (6) months with nominal fees (Rs. 120/- per month). After completion of the course, students will get authorized certificate from WEBEL Technology Ltd. Classes are conducted at college premises. At present, more than 100 students have enrolled their name for the course and it is running successfully.



#### **4) Add-on-Courses on Communicative English and Soft Skills, Life Skills and Digital Literacy organized by Counselling Cell , (22.02.2023 to 04.03.2023)**

The Counselling Cell recently organized Add-on-Courses on Communicative English and Soft Skills, Life Skills and Digital Literacy. It was held on 22.02.2023 to 04.03.2023 (9 days course for 36 hours). This highly demanding course was conducted by Naandi Foundation (NGO) in collaboration with the Mahindra Group. 221 students from all departments and streams joined in Soft Skill class and 107 students in Communicative English class. Six efficient trainers conducted the two courses parallelly in different rooms of our college. The Communicative English, also termed as “English at Work”, mainly focused on the basics of communication, professional communication with peers, professional communication with leadership team and interview skills. The Soft Skill Course consisted of the development of Employability Skills, including body language, professional grooming, time management, digital literacy, critical thinking, professional ethics, problem solving, conflict management and so on.

Both the courses had huge positive response from the students, as they have been truly beneficial for their future prospects. After assessments, ranking students were provided with medals and trophies. All participants were provided with certificates.



### 5) Add-on Course : Photography, 05.04.2023 onwards

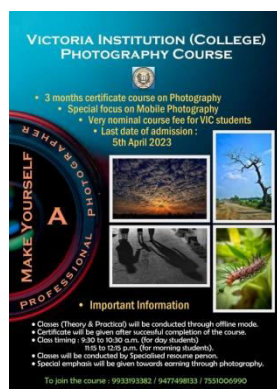
In recent years, Photography has become more than just a passionate hobby, it has gained even more importance as a profession, and has opened up new avenues for creative minds and aspiring photographers. It is not just an artistic thing but involves a lot of technical and practical training and thinking as well.

This Add-on course in Photography is so designed as to provide a carefully structured guidance for our young enthusiasts about the basics of photography - Camera fundamentals, Aperture, Manual mode, Shutter speed, the importance of lighting, and the craft of framing, various metering modes and color filters, as well as basic to advanced editing skills. Alongside theory classes we have Practical sessions in the form of field trips to provide

A course on Arduino helps the students to prepare themselves for the new edge technologies as Arduino being an electronic proto-typing is the gateway to Automation / Robotics. Students of Physics Hons are offered to take an introductory course on Arduino as a part of Skill Enhancement Course which emphasizes on the applications of Arduino in Physics.

In this context the above mentioned add on course was aimed to bridge between the Environmental Issues like measurement of pollution, developing energy saving devices and automation. Thus facilitating the students to be aware of the Environmental Crisis as well as the technological need of present time to overcome it .

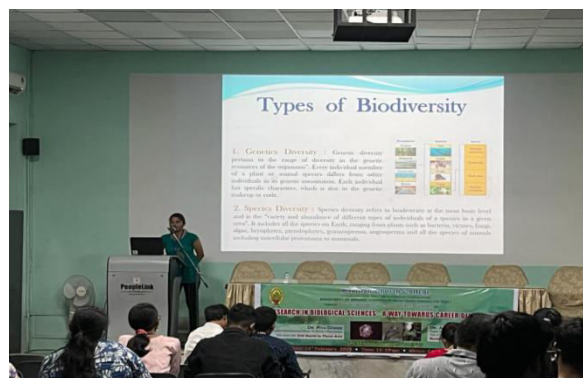

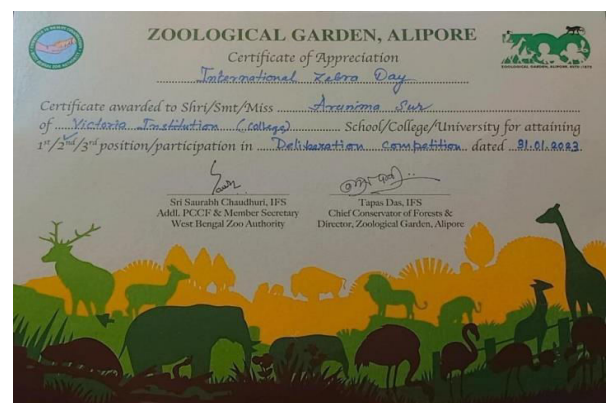
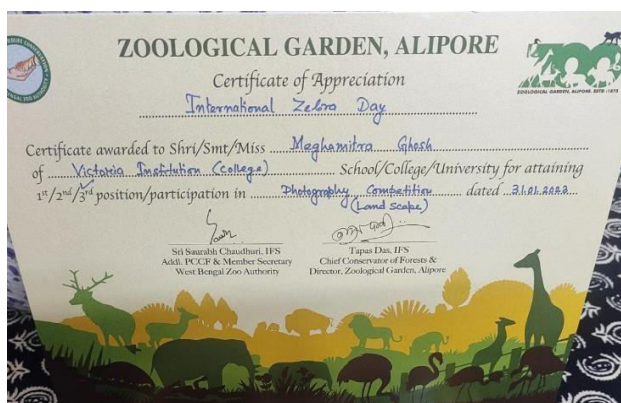
**ACTIVITIES:**

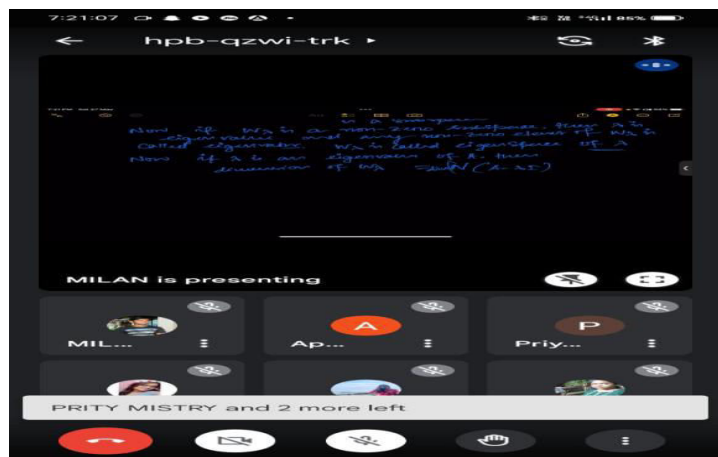
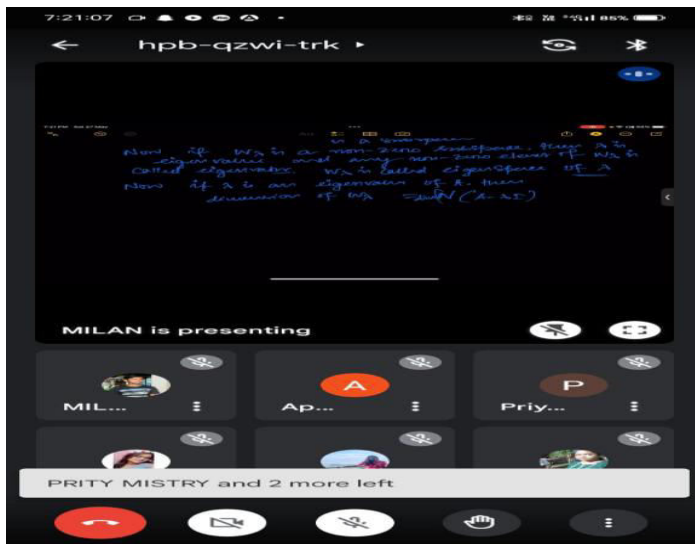

To fulfill the above services our cadet also took active part in Blood Donations campaign on 17.11.2022 at South City International school with the support of Command Hospital.

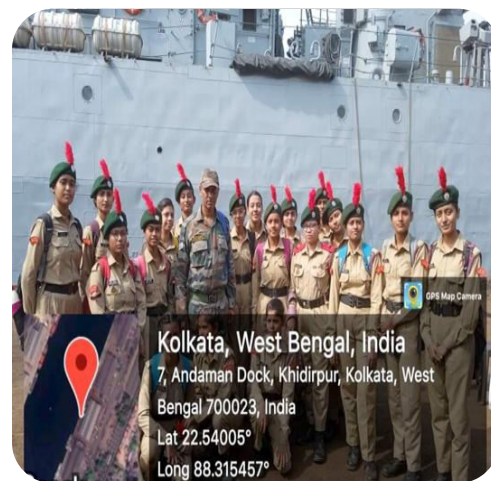
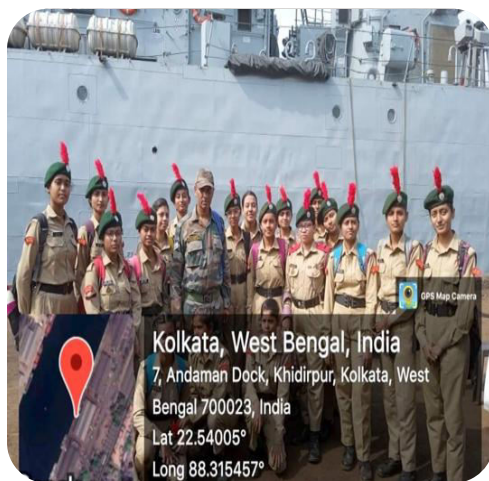




### 3) Visit to Indian Naval Ship by NCC on 19.11.2022

### **5) Peace and Harmony Run on 15<sup>th</sup> April, 2023**

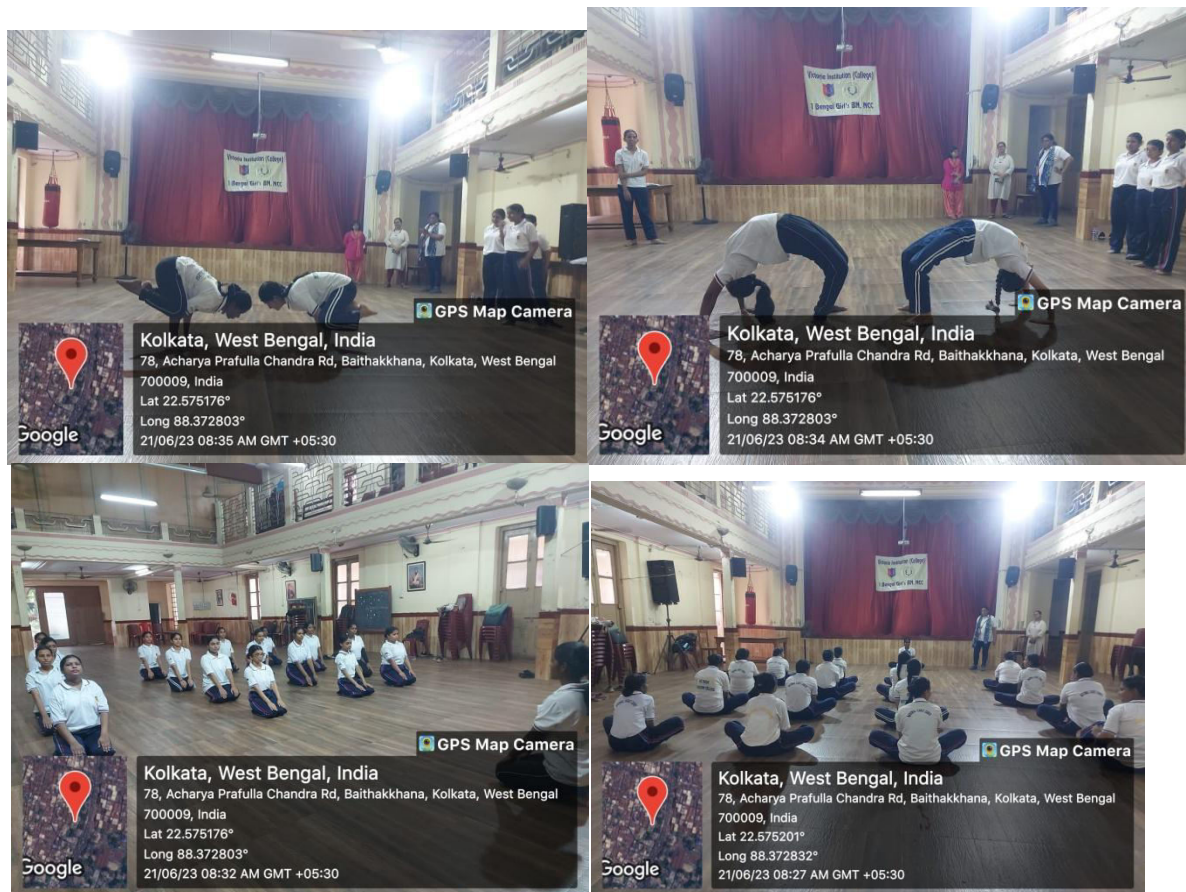

### **8) Sapling Plantation on 18.05.2023**

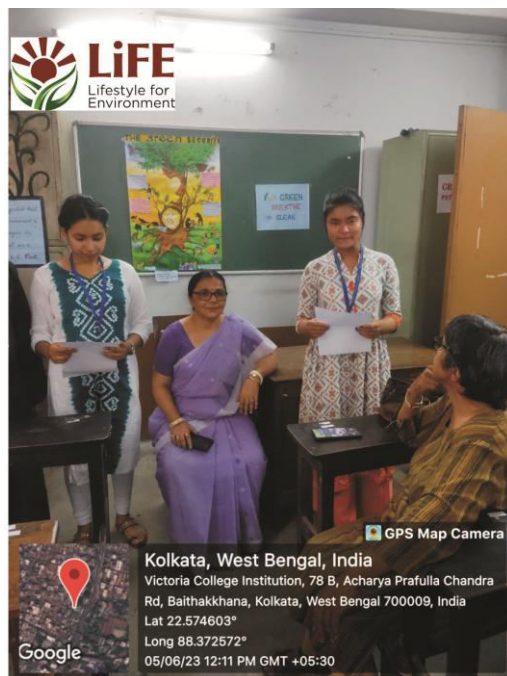

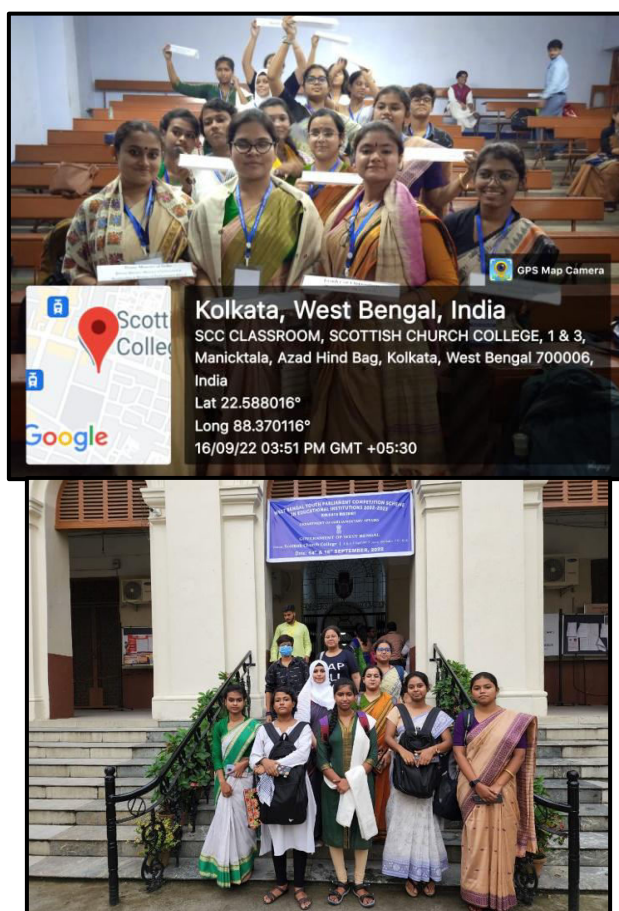
## Part J: Activities of Students' Clubs

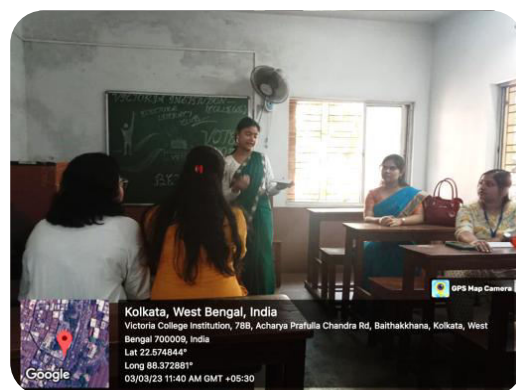


Mock Parliament Participants being awarded at Betarbani, Sreerampore after their demonstration by the Organisers.

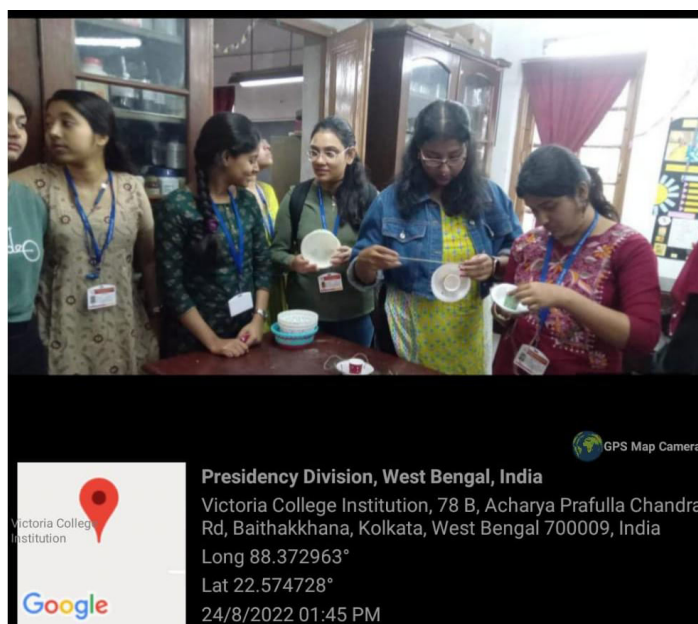
### 7) Preparation of Posters and Planning Future Activities

The Students were involved in various club activities like preparation of posters and banners, preparation of bird feeds etc.

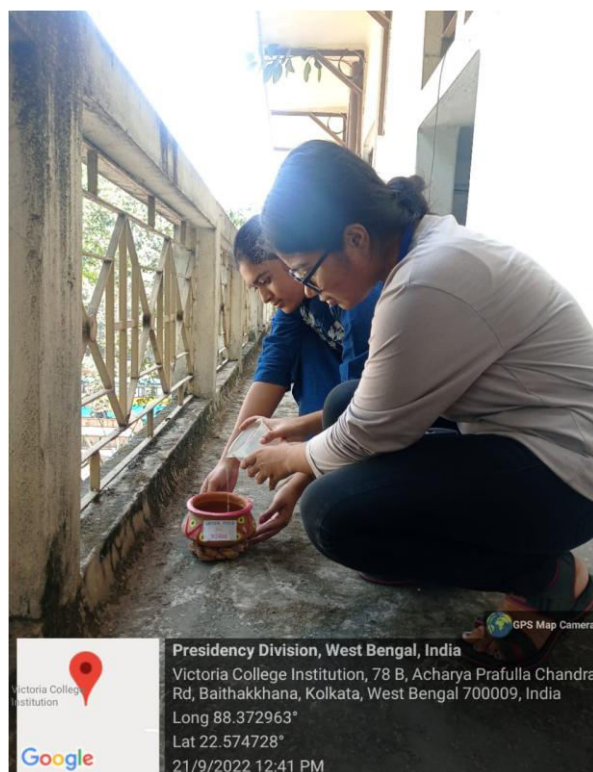


## 8) Placing of Bird Feeders and Water Feeders

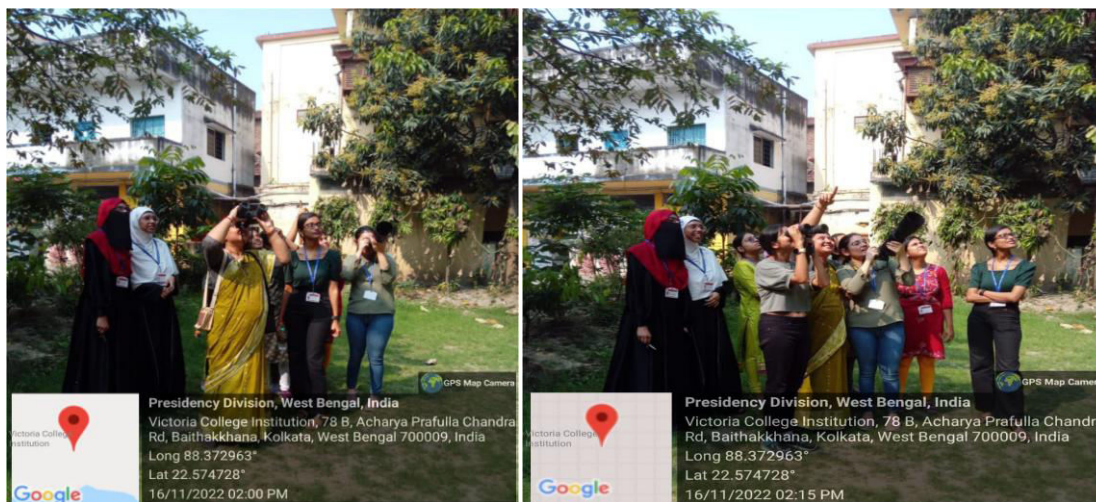


## 9) Bird Watching within the Campus
