1.) Report on One-Day Workshop on Curriculum and Credit Framework (CCF,2022) held on 5.7.2023

The Department of Economics and the Department of Commerce, Victoria Institution (College) in collaboration with IQAC organized a one-day workshop on Curriculum and Credit Framework (CCF,2022) under National Education Policy on 5th July,2023 at the Keshub Memorial Hall of the college. The workshop started at 11 AM. The two eminent speakers in the workshop were Sri. Debasish Biswas, Inspector of Colleges, University of Calcutta and Sri Gurupada Saren, Secretary, Council for Undergraduate Studies, University of Calcutta. The Principal of VIC, Dr. Maitreyi Ray Kanjilal and the IQAC coordinator Dr. Sumallya Karmakar were present in the workshop with their wholehearted support and cooperation. Almost all the faculty members from Victoria Institution (college) and a large number of teachers from various undergraduate colleges under Calcutta University enthusiastically participated in the workshop. The number of teachers participated from the college were 69 and those from other colleges were 44. The Inspector of Colleges explained the CCF,2022 in detail to the audience. There was an interactive session at the end of the two lectures where the Inspector of Colleges patiently addressed all the queries of the audience regarding the new system of learning. The workshop was a great success and was immensely beneficial for the participants especially before the beginning of the first session under the Curriculum and Credit Framework, 2022.

2.) Educational Excursion to Bengal Safari Park, Salugara, Siliguri by Semester 5, Hons students of Zoology Department from 04/10/ 2023 till 08/10/2023

Students (06) of Semester 5, ZOOLOGY HONS, were taken to BENGAL SAFARI PARK, SALUGARA, SILIGURI and MAHANANDA WILDLIFE SANCTUARY from, 4th till 8th October, 2023 under the guidance of Dr.Debjani Das (Ghosh), Associate Professor in Zoology VIC and Guest teacher Dr.N.C.Das, Ex-Associate Professor, Scottish Church College, Kolkata to study animals behaviours in captivity and in wild conditions. They did these studies both by walking and in a safari bus through the entire safari park for more than two hours. Students were allowed to go near the cages of wild animals and observe thoroughly about their detail activities for more than half an hour. Moreover, Students along with accompanying Teacher of Department of Zoology, Victoria Institution (College), Kolkata, celebrated 69th World Wildlife Week (4th-8th October 2023), in collaboration with Bengal Safari Park, Siliguri. Students performed bird watching under the guidance of professional bird watchers of Bengal Safari Park and accompanying teachers and did jungle walks to observe various birds and butterflies of the safari park. They also visited Animal's Hospital to get hands-on experience about the method of treatment of sick wild birds and animals. They attended a lecture session by the Safari official about the various activities and performances of the safari park and their future plan of actions.

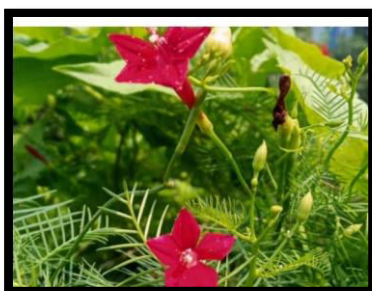

One-day botanical excursion was organized for Semester 1 Botany Honours (Major) students for studying and observing different types of inflorescences, flower and fruits as a part of their Paper BOT-H-CC1-1-P under newly introduced CCF curriculum, University of Calcutta. Students from other semesters also joined the tour group. Morphology continues to be of importance in taxonomy because morphological features characteristic of a particular species, is used to identify it. The outstanding and the most significant feature of the flowering plants is the flower. Without the flower we are not able to classify the plant. Inflorescence makes flowers more conspicuous to pollinating agents (insects/birds) so that chances of cross-pollination are high. Botanically, a fruit is a mature ovary and its associated parts. During the entire field study students observed, documented and kept the photographic evidence of different types of flowers, inflorescence and fruits. Students were able to relate the theoretical knowledge acquired and the skills developed during the practical classes in classroom situations with the practical experiences of the field work. This field visit offered a special chance for experiential education and hands-on learning.

A one-day botanical excursion was organized for Semester 3 Botany Honours students for studying and observing different types of inflorescences, flowers, fruits and collection of plant specimens for herbarium preparation as a part of their Paper BOT-A-CC-3-6-P and BOT-A-CC-3-7-P under CBCS BOTANY HONOURS Curriculum, University of Calcutta. Even though the angiosperms show such a large diversity in external structure or morphology, they are all characterised by presence of roots, stems, leaves, flowers and fruits. Morphology plays an important role in identifying plants. Classification is done also by knowing the morphology of plants. Other than the study of plant morphology. The students also collected plant specimens for herbarium preparation. Preserved plant specimens provide us with important information about plant diversity and distribution, in a relatively permanent, and verifiable form that serves as evidence of a plant's existence in time and space. If these specimens are properly preserved and maintained, they can last for well over 200 years. In a time where we are experiencing rapid habitat loss, herbaria provide important repositories for these sorts of data, and ensure their availability for future research. Students were able to relate the theoretical knowledge acquired and the skills developed during the practical classes in classroom situations with the practical experiences of the field work. This field visit offered a special chance for experiential education and hands-on learning.

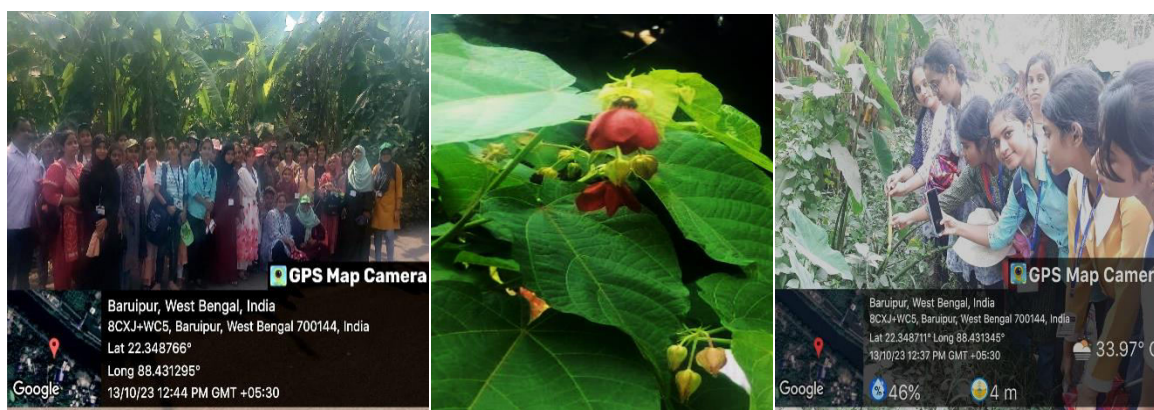

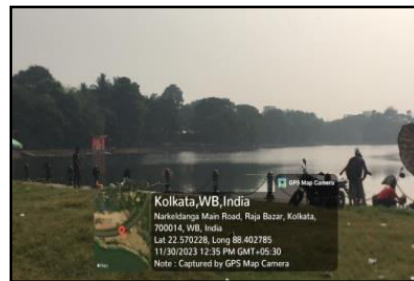
8.) Study Tour to Subash Sarovar, Kolkata by Department of Zoology on 30/11/2023

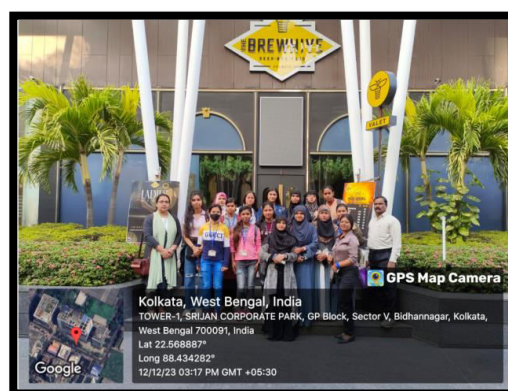

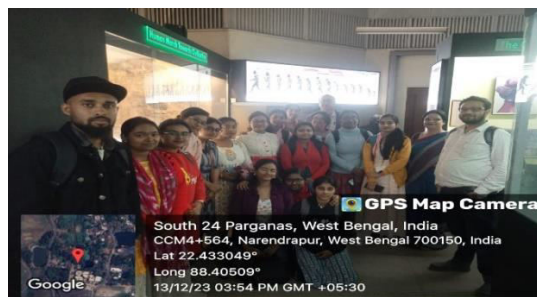

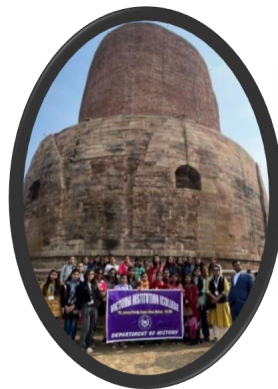

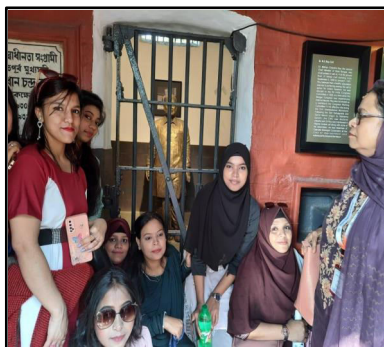

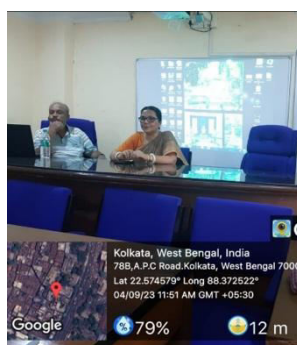
1.) Extension lecture on Lifestyle diseases: The preventive role of medicinal plants.

Organized by the Department of Botany Victoria Institution (College) on 04.09.2023.

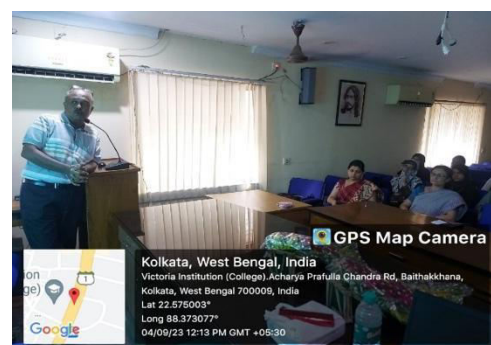
Venue – Suniti Sabhaghar, No. of participating students – 13

An extension lecture was organized on 4 September 2023 by Department of Botany, Victoria institution College for enriching students with knowledge of medicinal plants around us and their preventive role in curing and managing lifestyle diseases. Lifestyle Diseases or Non-Communicable Diseases are a major public health problem globally. In 2018, World Health Organization (WHO) estimated on NCDs shows that 71% of all deaths (41 million) were attributed globally. The four groups of diseases were responsible for over 80% death all over the world. The conditions such as cardiovascular diseases account for most NCD deaths, followed by respiratory diseases and diabetes. The speaker emphasised on modification of our daily lifestyle and food habits for better and healthy future. His talk was focused mainly on health and happiness through Ayurveda. He also shared tips for healthy lifestyle and mesmerised the students with lots of home remedies for various common diseases.

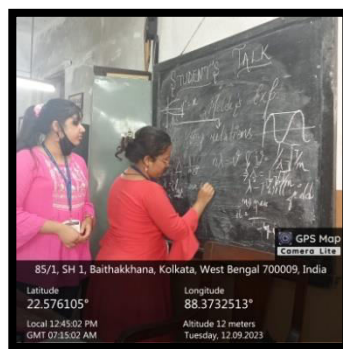
2.) Students' Seminar organized by the Dept. of Physics on 12.09.2023

Three students of IInd semester gave short talks on the experiments which they have performed as part of their curriculum throughout the semester.

Akanksha Roy discussed about the Study of Mutual Inductance, Response of CR circuit and Determination of Cauchy Constants. Measurement of unknown resistance using potentiometer, Determination of horizontal component of Earth's magnetic field using Magnetometer, Diffraction Grating and Melde's Experiment were discussed by Ankita Paul. Topics allotted to Triparna Debnath were Measurement of unknown resistance using Carey-Foster bridge, Response of LCR circuit, Measurement of wavelength of light using Newton's Ring and Determination of thickness of a paper using wedge shaped film.

For the Students' seminar each student explained the theoretical aspects and the results obtained in one experiment. The student's presentation was followed by a question and answer session conducted by the teachers. This helped the students in their preparation for the viva voce that was held during the practical examination. We hope that this method of peer teaching made them more confident and they acquired a clear understanding of the experiments.

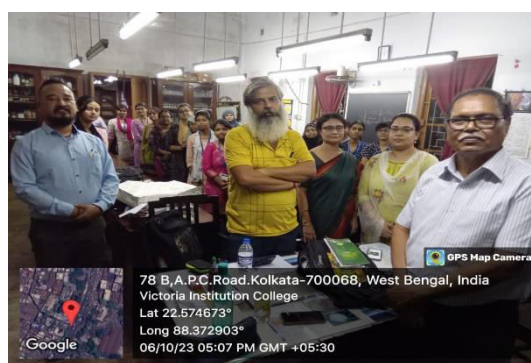

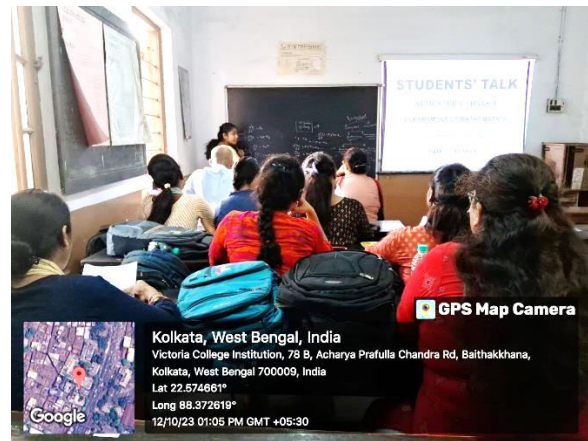

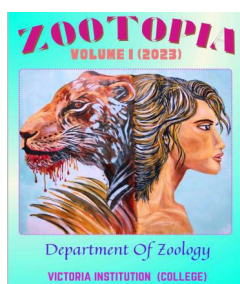

19.) Publication of Departmental E-Magazine by Department of Zoology by Semester 3, Hons students of Zoology Department on 17/11/2023

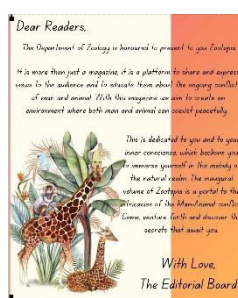

It's an illuminating chronicle, a milestone not just the e-magazine that will unfold our imaginations, enabling us to express our thoughts, aspirations and provide valuable information.

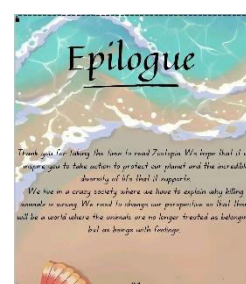

Six students of Sem V and three students of Sem III Physics Hons. have enthusiastically participated in this endeavor. 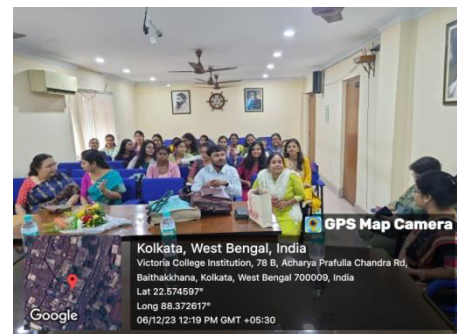

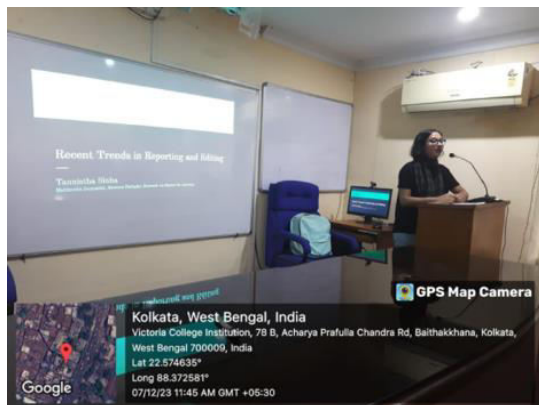
27.) **Extension Lecture 1 Recent Trends in Reporting and Editing organized by Department of Journalism and Mass Communication**

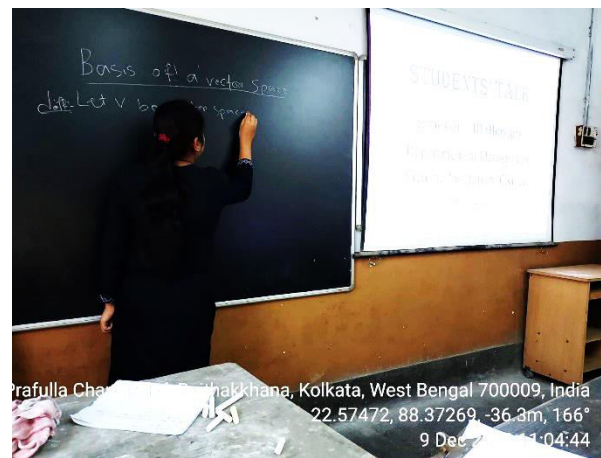

6. Results of class tests and examinations were also discussed at great length.

52.) **Students' Seminar organized by Dept. of Physics on 09.02.2024 and 15.02.2024**

The department of Physics had organized two departmental students' seminars on 09.02.2024 and 15.02.2024 to involve them in participative learning and peer teaching as well as upgrade their skill in performing experiments introduced in their curriculum.

Six students have participated in these seminars at Physics department in the science building of our college to discuss the various experiments in the syllabus of 5th Sem (H) of the Electromagnetic Theory Paper. Each student was allotted with one or two experiments just one week before the date of commencement of the presentation. The students studied the allotted experiments and thus prepared themselves for presentation. Most of them efficiently explained the methods incorporated, theories used and explained the different uses of the experiments. The teachers cleared their doubts wherever necessary and enhanced their interests on experiments on Laws of Polarization of light wave (Verification of Brewster's Law, Malus Law, Fresnel's equation, study of optical activity), measurement of resolving power and Dispersive power of a transmission grating by which they will be able to tackle practical examination specially viva-voce efficiently at away center.

53.) Students' talk organized by Department of Physics on 18.03.2024

The department of Physics organized a students' talk on 18th March 2024 to involve peer teaching and participative learning which as well would upgrade their understanding and skills in performing experiments introduced in the curriculum.

Various experiments from CC7 and CC6 practical paper of their Undergraduate course were discussed to develop a deeper understanding about the experiments. Three students of semester III of Physics dept. had participated in this talk which took place in the science building of our college.

Each students were allotted two experiments to talk about and was notified about a week before the date of the talk. The students had studied their allotted topic and each prepared a talk to present. Each students took about 30-45 minutes to deliver their talk during which the teachers were also clearing their doubts that were raised while they were explaining the experiments like on the basics concepts of thermal conductivity, thermocouple, basic difference between different kinds of diodes, photoelectric effect etc. This venture will help them to perform well in their experiments and will also help with the viva-voce component, especially when they appear for the practical examinations at the away centers.

54.) Extension lecture on autobiography as a genre By dr. Anasuya Bhar, associate professor in english and dean of st. paul’s cathedral mission college, dated 28.03.2024

Dr. Anasuya Bhar, Associate Professor in English and Dean of Postgraduate Studies, St. Paul’s Cathedral Mission College, Kolkata delivered an extension lecture on “Autobiography as a Genre: A Reassemblment” on 28th of March, 2024 at the Department of English Seminar Room of Victoria Institution (College). The lecture was specially meant for the 6th Semester students. She opened her lecture by pointing out the difference between biography and autobiography. Focussing on the anecdotal nature of autobiography Dr. Bhar connected Tagore’s ‘Chele Bela’ with “My Remisceneces” assimilating Tagore’s confessional mode of autobiography which included his association with his brother Jyotirindranath Tagore. Dr. Bhar spoke on the gendered differences between autobiographies of men and women concentrating on Rasmusundari Devi’s ‘Amar Jiban’ and Binodini Dasi’s “My Story and Life as an Actress” to bring out the travails in the lives of marginalized women in colonial Bengal and the difficulties under which they had to write their life stories, as contrasted with the much for comfortable ease of Tagore. Dr. Anasuya Bhar also spoke on Nirad C. Chaudhuri ‘s ‘The Autobiography of an Unknown Indian’ stressing on the aspect of colonialism and nationalism in colonial Bengal and linked it with the rebellious urge to read or be recognized for the 19th Century women of Bengal under the traditional patriarchal mesh. 27 students of Semester 6 English Honours attended the lecture. The two-hour long lecture was extremely illuminating and enriching for the students.

All the articles are thought provoking and well written and they reflect the creative potential and talents of our students.

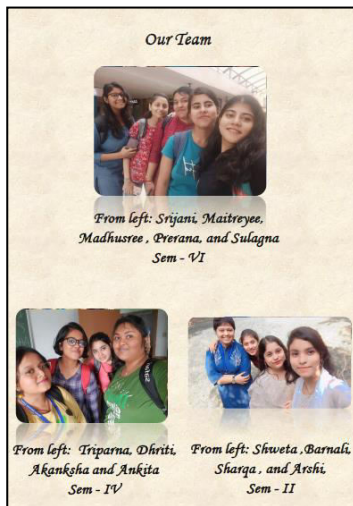

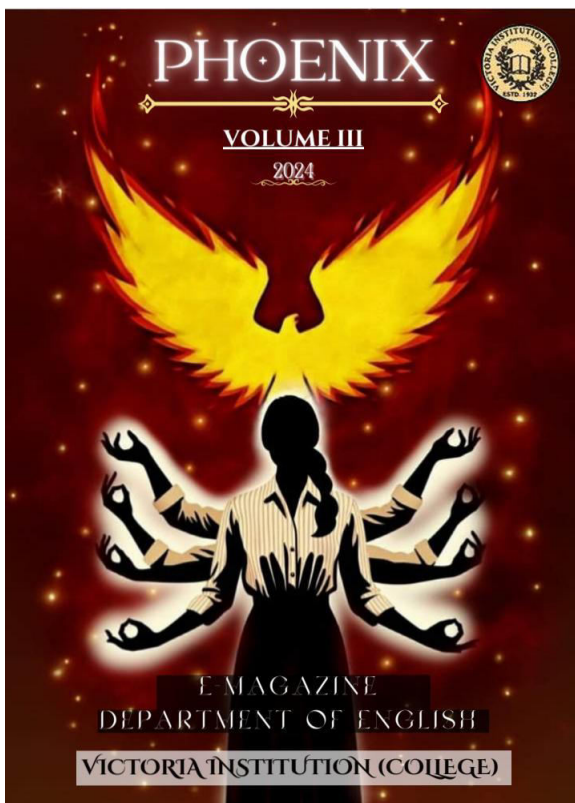

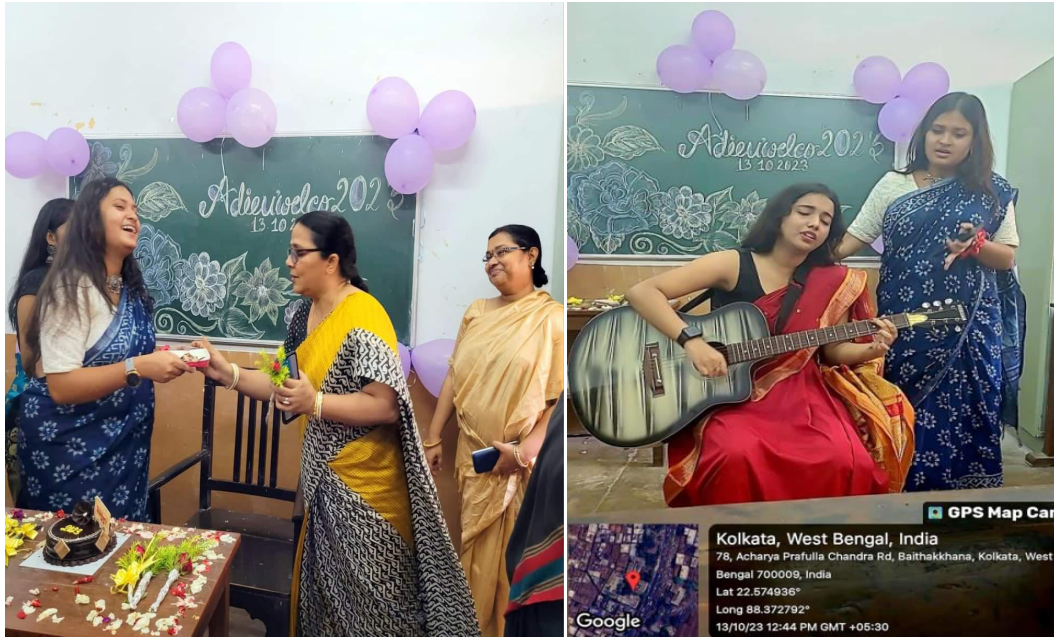

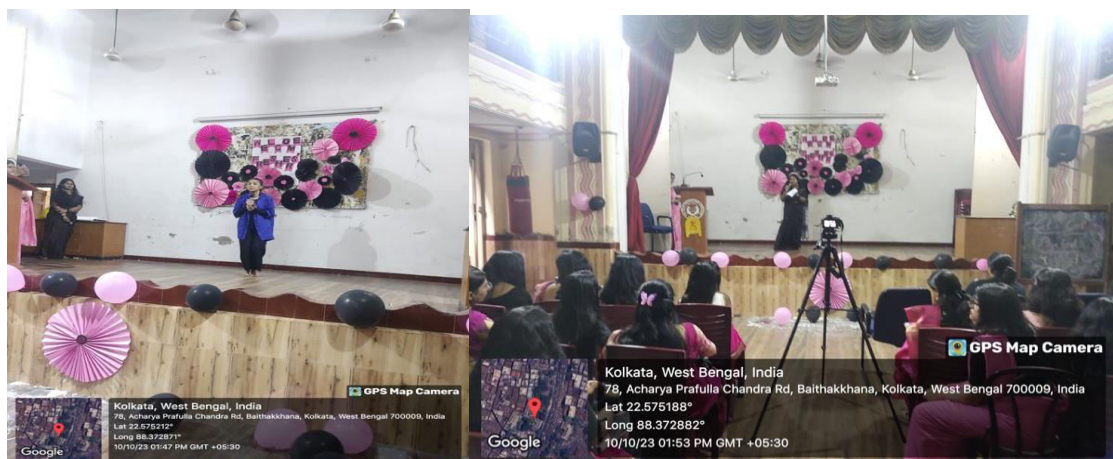

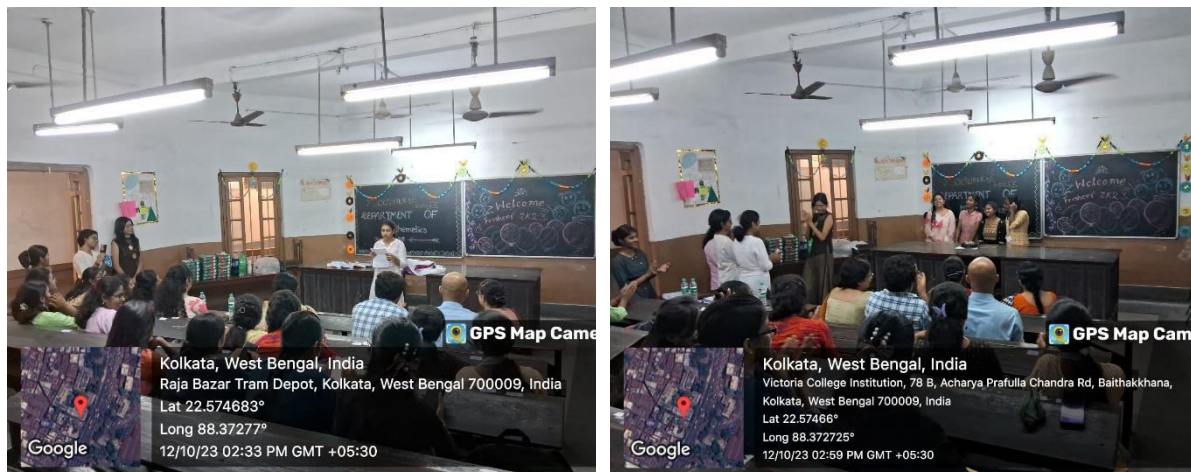

10.) Farewell 2023 on 16.10.2023 Department of Mathematics

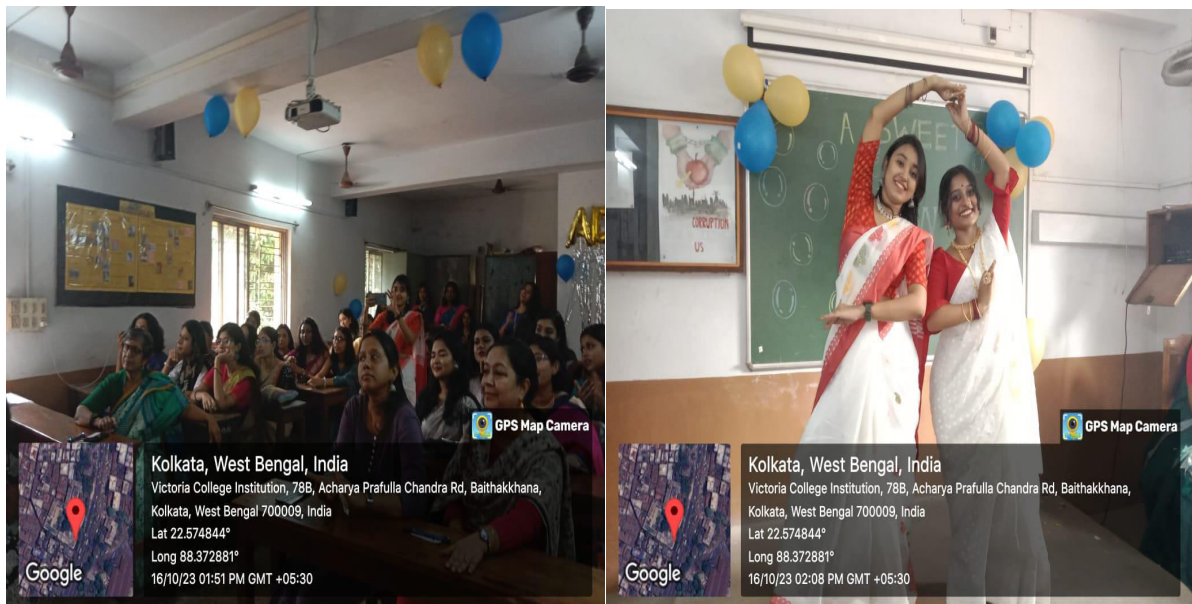

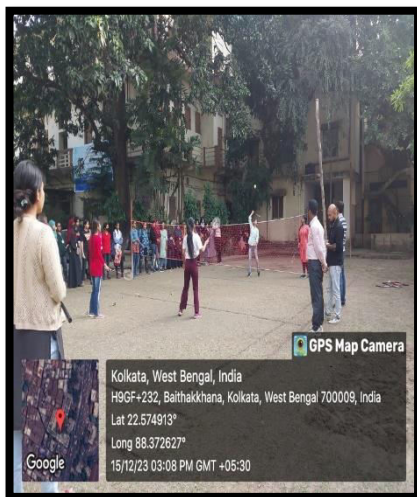

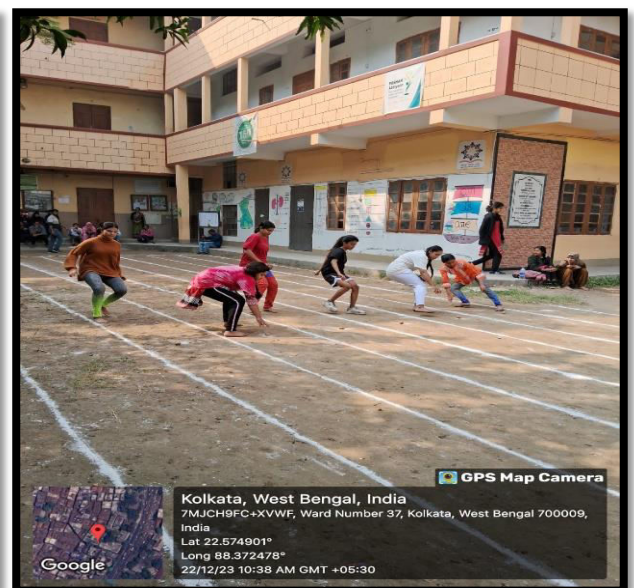

1.) Observance of international day for the conservation of Mangrove Ecosystem, 2023 by Department of Botany on 26.7.23.

Observance of international day for the conservation of Mangrove Ecosystem, 2023” was held in Department of Botany on 26 July 2023. About 10 students from semester to Botany Honours participated on that day. Mangroves are rare, spectacular and prolific ecosystem on the boundary between land and sea. These extraordinary ecosystems contribute to the wellbeing, food security and protection of coastal communities worldwide. They support a rich biodiversity and provide a valuable nursery habitat for fish and crustaceans. Mangroves also act as a form of natural coastal defences against storm surges, tsunamis, rising sea level and erosion. The soils are highly effective carbon sinks, sequestering vast amounts of carbon. Yet mangroves are disappearing faster than overall global forest losses, with serious ecological and socioeconomic impacts. This is why UNESCO has decided to act to protect them .The Forest Conservation Act, 1980 states that no forest area shall be diverted for any non-forestry purpose without prior approval of the Government of India. The act has proved very effective in preventing diversion of mangrove forest areas for non-forestry purposes.

The students discussed on the problems the Mangrove vegetations are facing due to climate change, deforestation due to agriculture and aquaculture, urban development and harvesting. They broadly discussed the points on how the mangroves are threatened by tourism industry and pollution from runoff fertilizers, pesticides and improper disposal of wastes. Destruction of the Mangrove Ecosystem were also discussed. The students were evaluated by the teachers on the basis of their contents of presentation and deliberation of talks. On the basis of their performance they were ranked as follows:

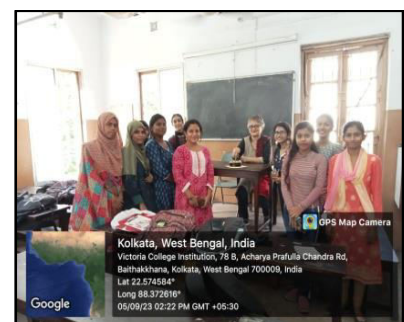

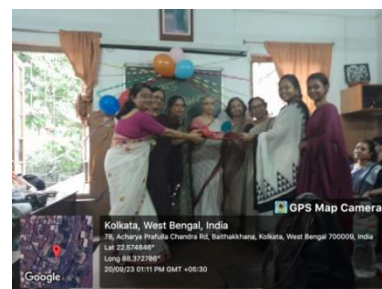

7.) Celebration of birth anniversary of Ishwarchandra Vidyasagar Department Of Bengali On 26.09.2023

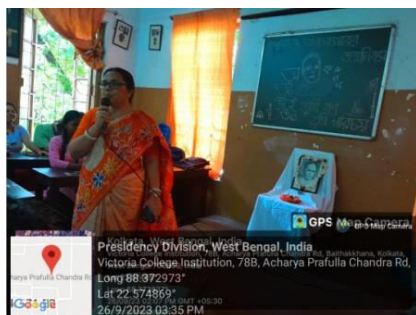

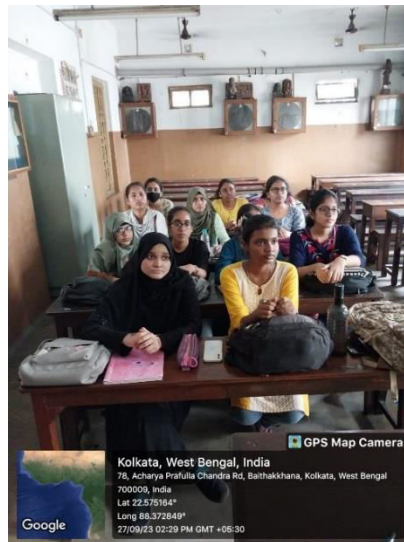

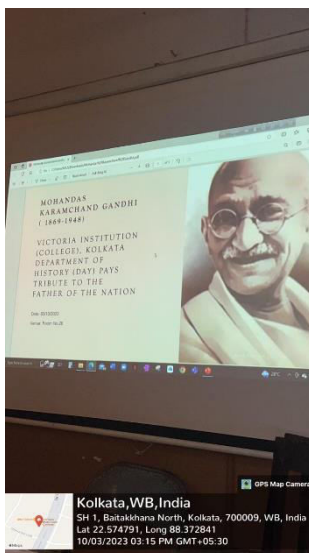
8.) In memory of Raja Rammohan Roy, Dated 27.09.23

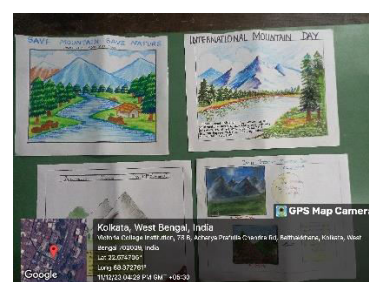

16.) **A report on online celebration of “International Day of Women and Girls in Science” organized by Dept. of Physics in collaboration with IQAC on 11th February 2024**

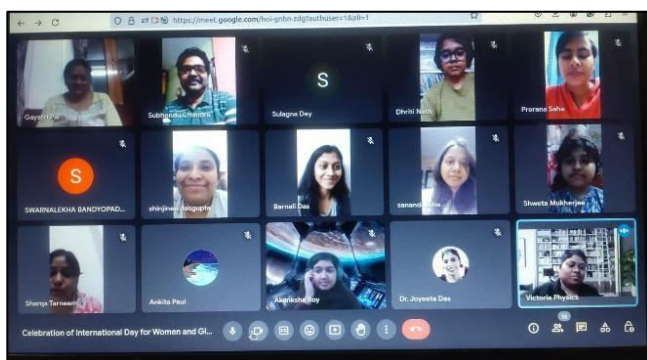

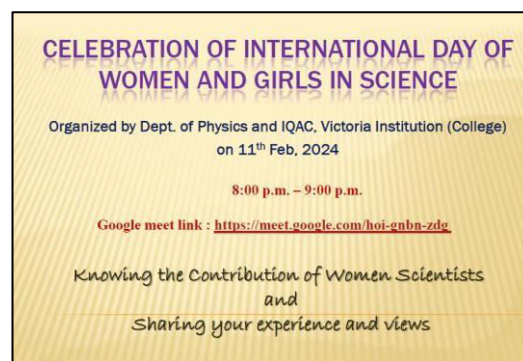
Nine students from the Physics department of semesters I, III and V participated in the program. Principal Madam and the faculties the Department of Physics, Political Science & English attended the online celebration.

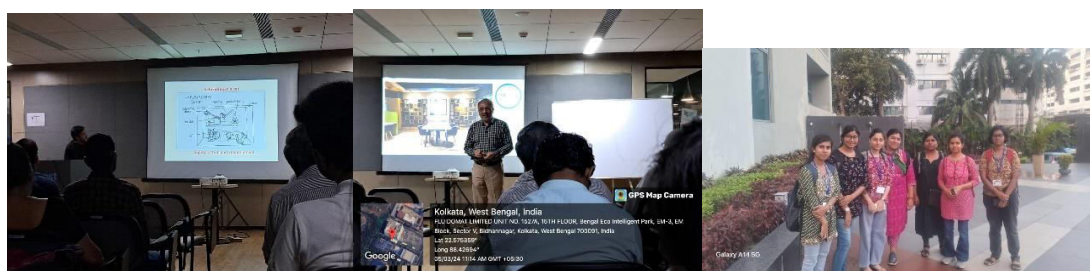
20.) **A report on participation of a program to celebrate “National Science Day 2024” on 5th March 2024 organized by TCG CREST.**

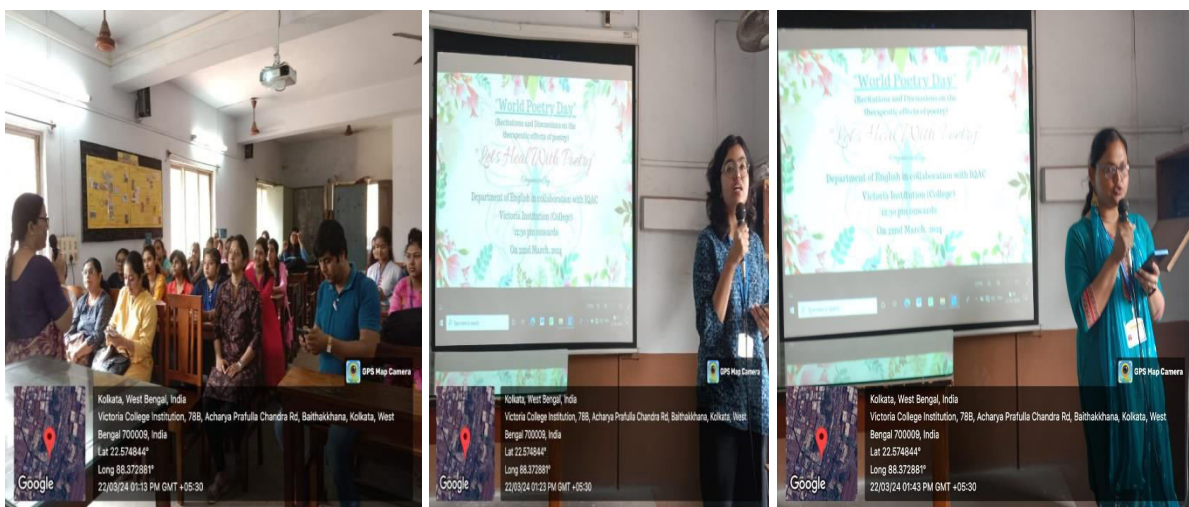

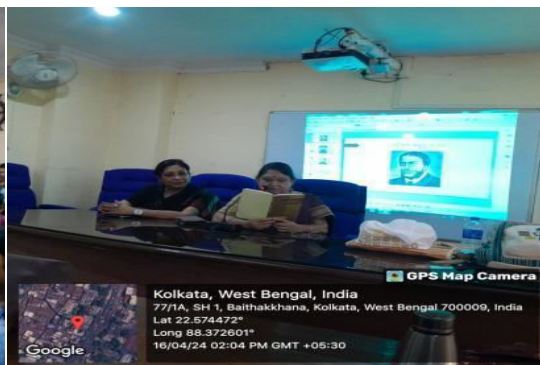

24.) Celebration of Earth Day by Geography Department on 22.04.2024

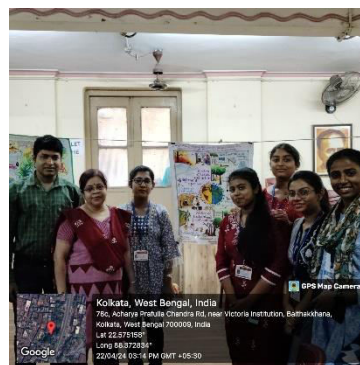

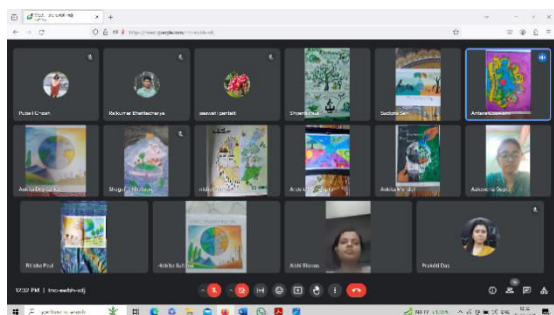

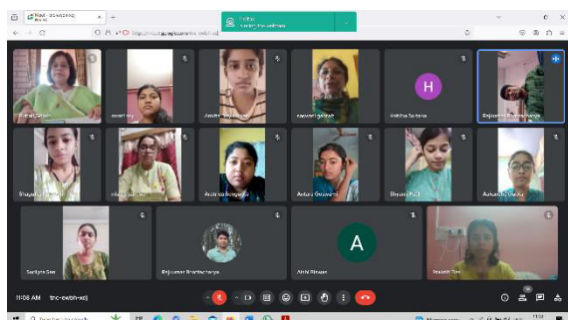

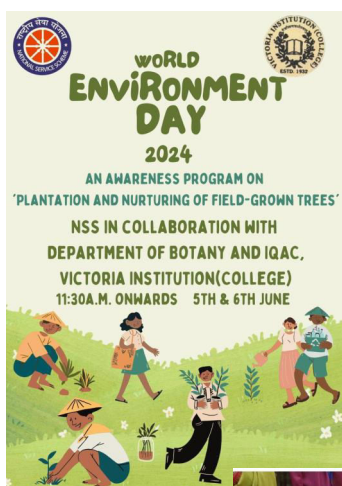

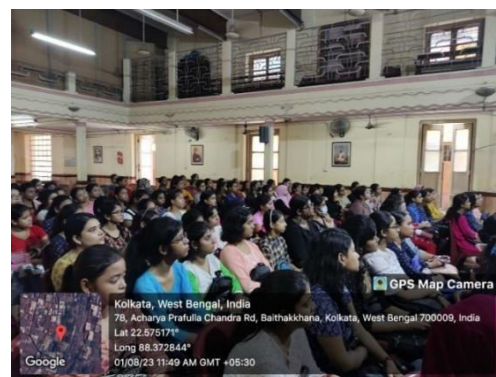
Part E: Activities conducted by IQAC and other Cells / Committees

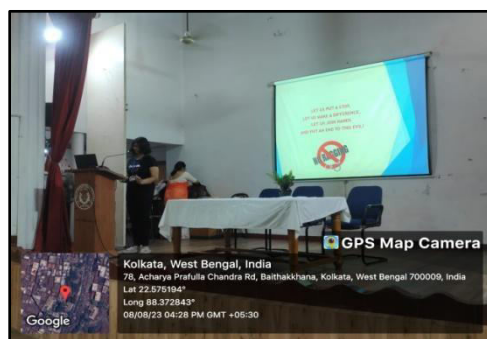
3) Sensitisation Activity of Anti-Ragging Cell on 07.08.2023 and 08.08.2023

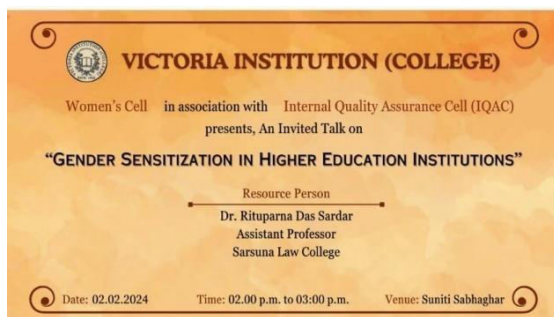
Day 7: 08/01/2024Career Counselling Programme:

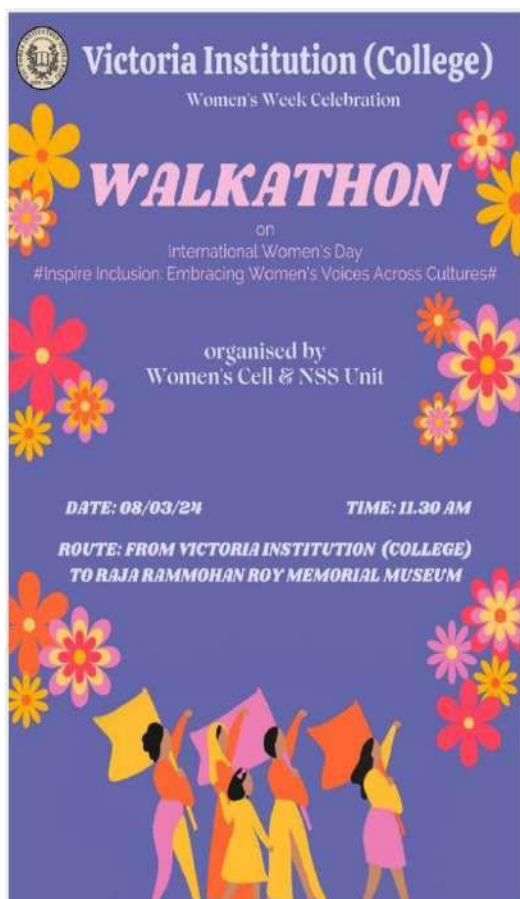

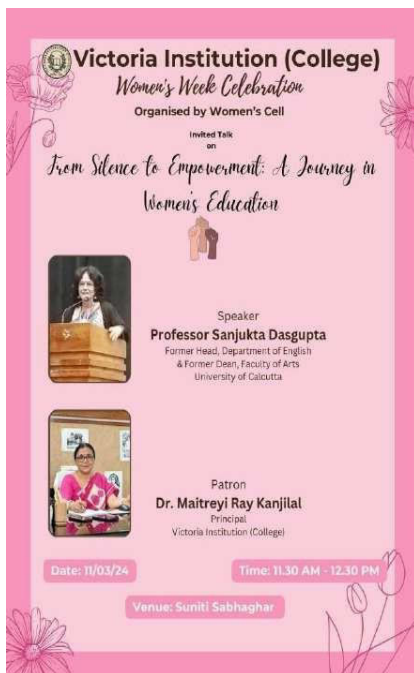

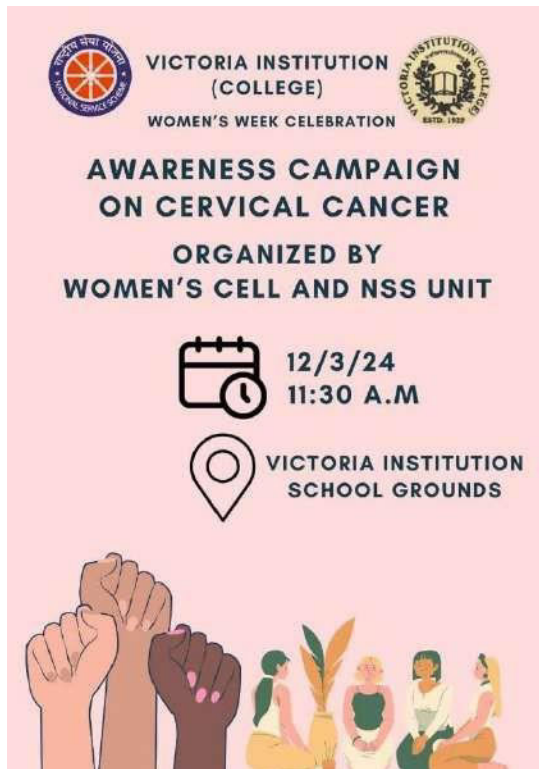

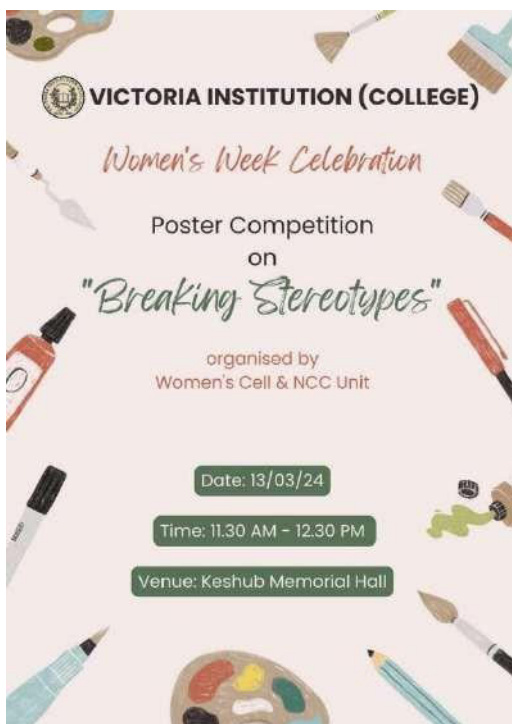

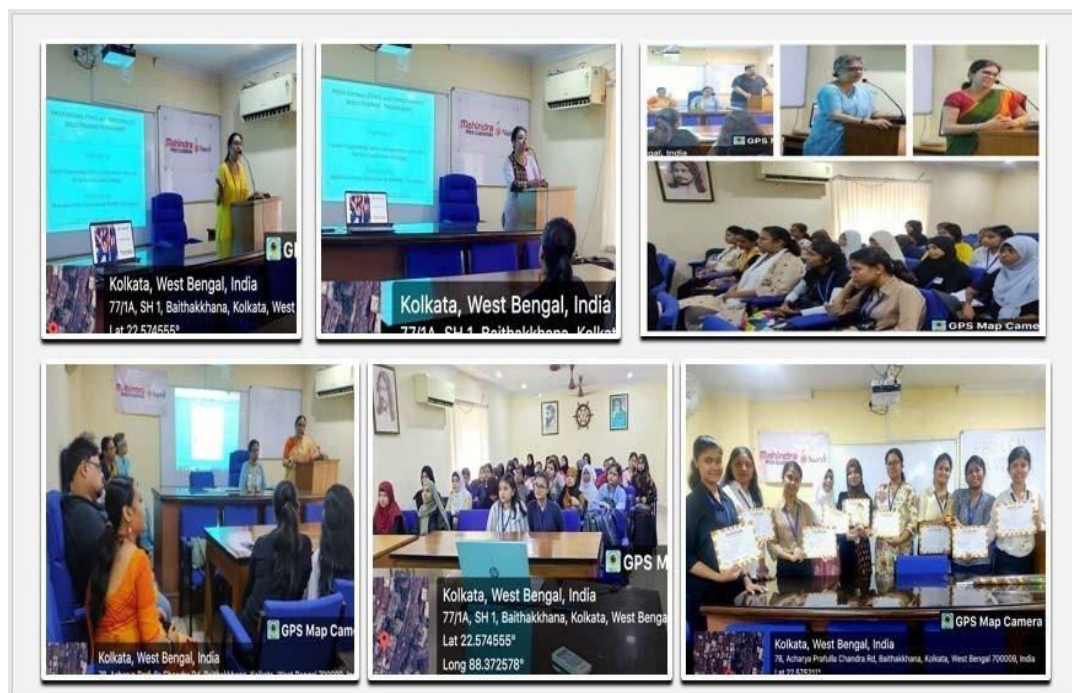

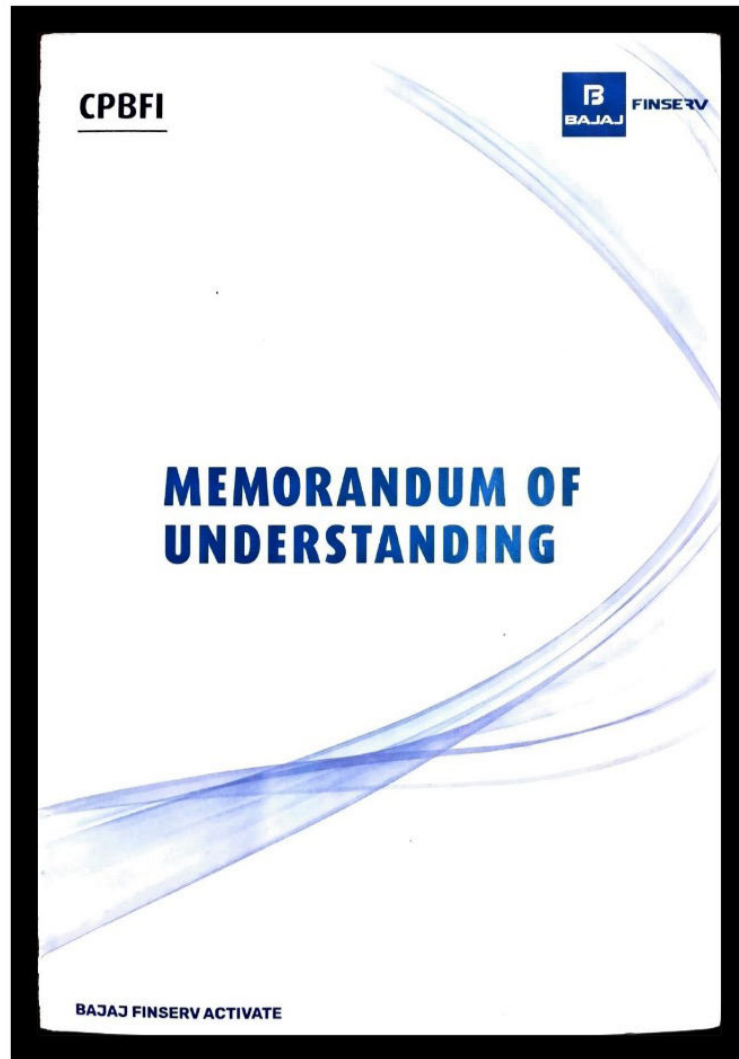
Career Counselling and Guidance Seminar, dated 05.12.2023

1.) INTERNATIONAL PLASTIC BAG FREE DAY (11ThJULY,2023) NCC

International Plastic Bag Free Day is observed every year on July 3rd to increase awareness about the detrimental effects of disposable plastic bags on the environment. People, environmental groups, organizations worldwide participate in diverse activities, workshops and campaigns to educate the public about the consequences of plastic bags and advocate the adaptation of reusable bag options.

The Army Act, 1950 made women ineligible for regular commissions with certain exceptions specified by the central government. It was on 1 November 1958 that the Army Medical Corps became the first Indian Army unit to award regular commissions to women. After that, throughout the 80s and 90s, women were made eligible for short service commissions in the Indian Army.

As of 2023, women are not eligible for service as combat troops in specialist forces such as the Parachute Regiment but they can join some of its non-combat wings like the signal corps, engineers, etc.

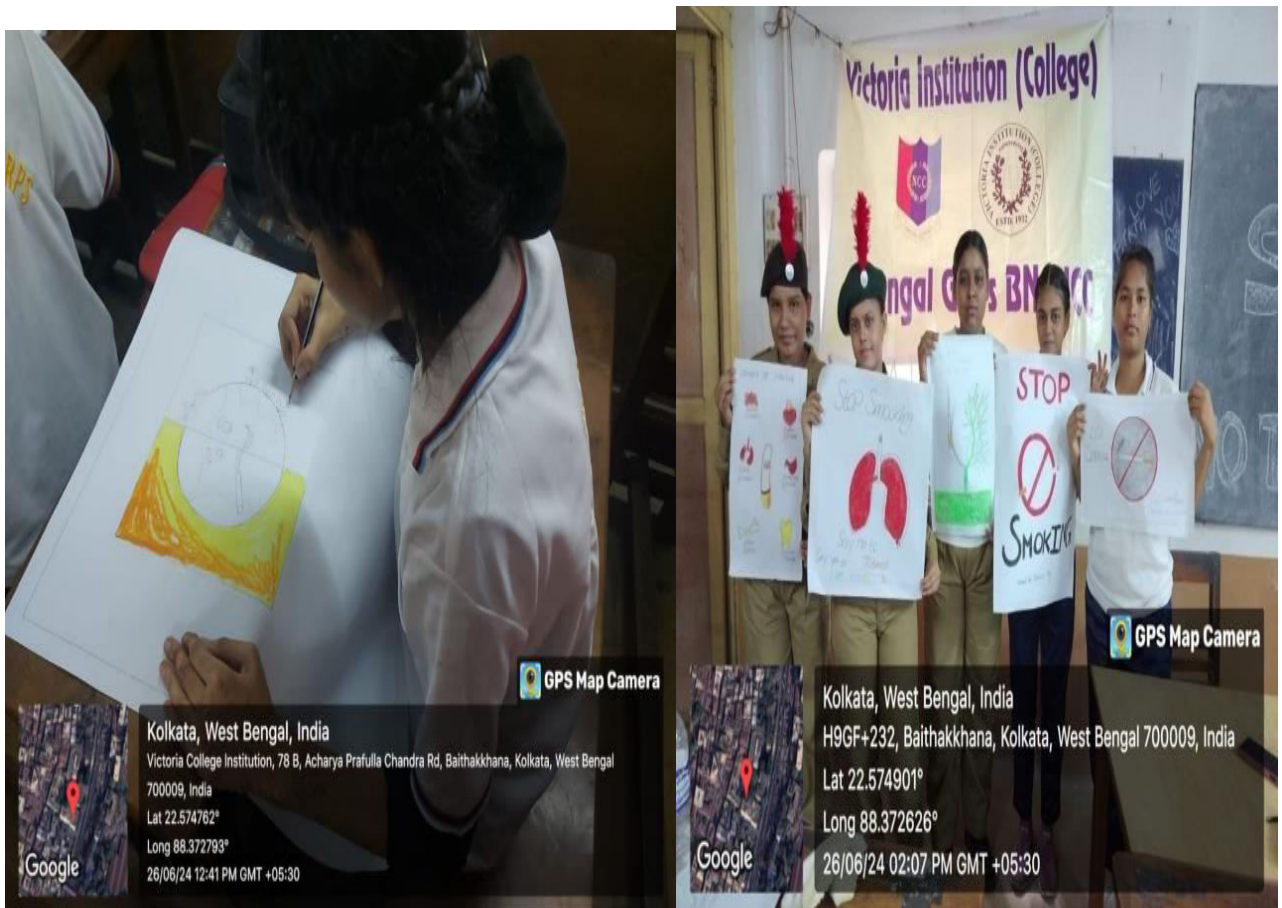


12.) International Day of Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking 2024

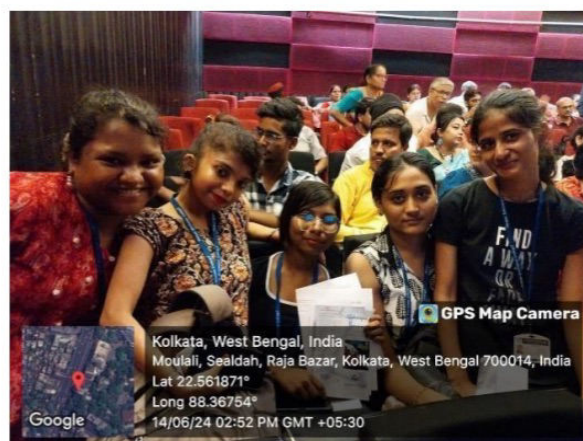

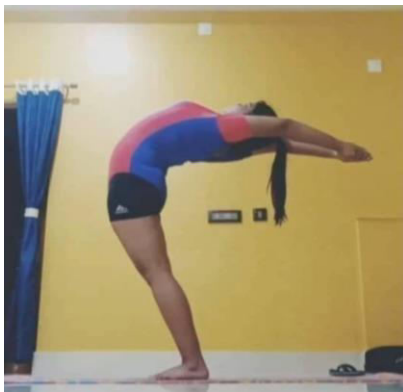

1.) Report on the Launching of Consumer Club at Victoria Institution (College) on 13/3/2024

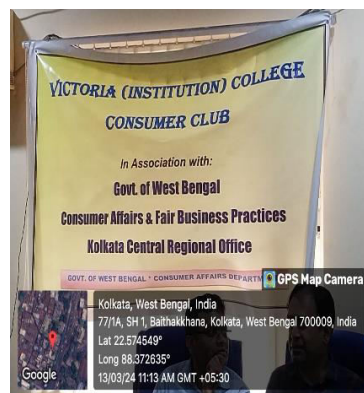

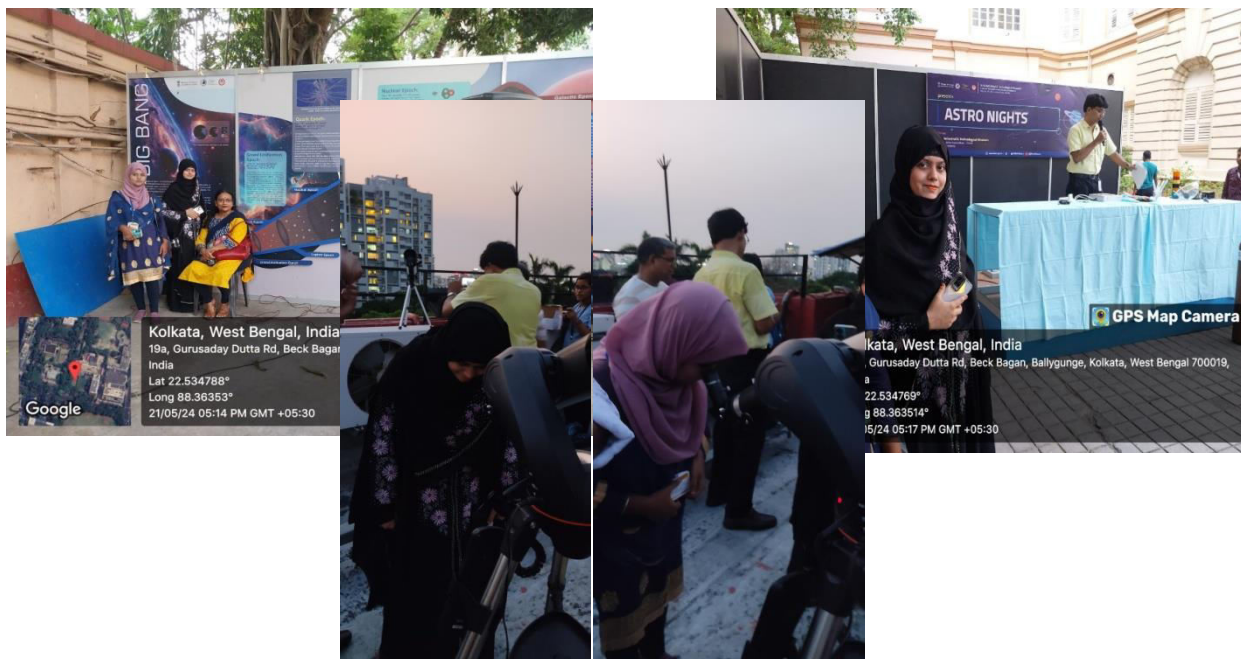

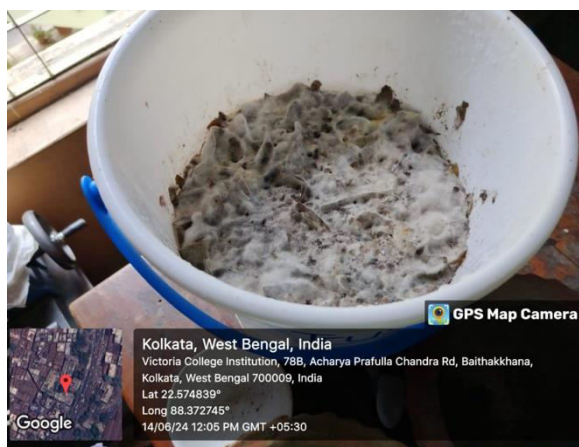

Regular monitoring of the composting bucket was done by the students of the Nature club and the teachers of the Club. Liquid fertilizer obtained from this process was regularly harvested on 5th June, 2024 and 14th June. This liquid fertilizer which is rich in essential minerals was applied to the plants of our college campus. The students took the initiative of harvesting and application of liquid fertilizer in the fields. On 14th June, i.e., after almost 24 days of the compost bucket preparation, the fermented or pickled organic waste was mixed with coco peat in proper ratio in pots and was allowed to undergo complete decomposition for the generation of compost. Students regularly mixed this once in 3 days interval.

During the final phase of this composting procedure, students of the Nature Club and NSS volunteers collected the compost in a tray and applied the compost along with respected principal madam and teachers at Victoria institution College to plants in our college campus. This whole process of composting was a great success, and we were able to REDUCE, RECYCLE AND REUSE our daily kitchen waste which would otherwise have been ended up in landfills. Also, students had a great learning experience and a hands-on training in the composting technique.

This initiative by the nature club of Victoria institution, College and search sustainable activity will be practised in future.
